To Major Gardner military Com

Sir I Received yours of the 18.
I have travelled over a large part of
this country and Recruiting for to fill
up Regiments is full & cold Recruite
men for new Regiments every day.
Western Bonnefont and Brent is
selected to organise next Friday
and I think under the General order
No 22 there can be no more Recruited
I am near the Boundary line
and it is hard to collect thus numbers
of the 11 Regt that is having an as sick
furlough I have ordered them to meet
me several times and they have not
come I started Monday and collected
three of them together and put them
on board of the Stage under the care
of Captain W H Decker

to take them to your office
I came back to W H and Kelts
Place and searched the house on the
night of the 20 and found that
he had erased the lines during the
day before

I also searched the papers of
Mr Butterfield and
Mr Joseph Butterfield being the
father of G W Butterfield stated
before Iverness that he furnished
G W Butterfield with money and
Conveyance to cross the lines in to the
Province and further stated that
if he was at home he would
protect him and would not allow me
to take him he said that the Bay was
not to be blamed for he intended
to come back but he would not allow
him to carry I think he and to be
arrested and answer for such
conduct, I shall wait an answer from you

There is several others members of
different Regiments - and it is
hard to calculate when the army may
is to go and take them with me if I
notify them they will cross the
Lines immediately it costs more
to start one soldier back to
Augusta than it did to Reserve
to last fall. I am now leaving
them the Country and taking them
with me to the stage and sending
them to Saint H W Tabine at Bangor

I have sent W.H. Decker E.H. Springer
and Charles White.

Stephen Brownen
is charged with desertion
and crossed the Lines on the 2^d of July
G.W. Butterfield deserted and crossed
the Lines at St Stevens July 20 1862
died and buried by his father
Joseph Butterfield Your Ogd G.B. Weymouth
