

WARRANT.

To Charles A. Wood, a constable in the Town of Orrington, in the County of Penobscot,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Orrington, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town, on Monday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

First—To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Second—To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Third—To act on the report of the Selectmen.

Fourth—To act on the report of the Superintendent of Schools.

Fifth—To act on the report of the Board of Health.

Sixth—To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year, including one or more Road Commissioners.

Seventh—To grant and raise money for the support of Schools, the poor, the repair of roads and bridges, and repair of school houses, and defray all other town charges.

Eighth—To fix the compensation of the Collector of Taxes.

Ninth—To fix the compensation of the Road Commissioner.

Tenth—To see if the town will instruct its Road Commissioner to expend two hundred dollars of the road fund in carting gravel on the road leading from East Orrington to South Brewer, the gravel to be given by Charles A. Wood.

Eleventh—To see if the town will appropriate a sum of money for Memorial purposes.

Twelfth—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69, Public laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1911. Thirteenth—To see if the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amount regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the sum of \$400.00, being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909.

Fourteenth—To see if the town will expend two hundred dollars in carting gravel on the bog on the club house road, and raise money for the same.

Fifteenth—To see if the town will repair and put a sufficient coating of gravel on the sidewalk, commencing at the residence of A. G. Dole and extending to the Brewer line and raise money for the same.

Sixteenth—By request—To see if the town will instruct its Road Commissioner to expend One hundred and fifty dollars of the road fund in carting gravel on the road leading from N. P. Smith's store in East Orrington to the Red Bridge continuing from where the work was suspended last year.

Seventeenth—To see if the town will pay its Treasurer the sum of Seventy-five dollars per year for his services.

Eighteenth—To see if the town will instruct its Treasurer, to loan the credit of the town to defray town charges, not to exceed \$1000 if necessary.

Nineteenth—To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen regarding the letting and care of the Town Hall.

The Selectmen will be in session for the purpose of revising the list of voters at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting. Given under our hands at Orrington this twentieth day of February, A. D., 1911.

We have been able, on account of the increase of money from the State and the appropriation by the Town, to arrange for thirty-three weeks of school in 1910-11 as you will note by carefully reading statistics preceding this report. You will be able to ascertain how this money has been spent and to learn that every part of our town has shared equally in this "common school fund". I have distributed my time and attention among the schools, each room being visited as often as once in two weeks and if any occasion arose demanding more attention I have been able to go to the school where the services of Supt. seemed to be needed, I can report satisfactory interest, scholarship and attendance as a result of this year's work. During the spring term there were two teams for transportation of pupils each team receiving \$5 per week, which seems to be a reasonable sum for 5 days service in all kinds of weather and traveling. Nine schools were in session. In fall and winter ten schools were in session and one transportation team. The pupils at Goodale's Corner were all young and the plan of reestablishing the school met with approval and although small we feel that the money has been well spent for the children have been able to attend quite regularly through the cold weather, which they could not have done had they attended a school two or three miles distant. The weekly cost of these schools has been about \$91 beside fuel. This is in excess of last year. As wages of teachers have advanced and, knowing that they can obtain a certain sum elsewhere, efficient teachers will not remain in our schools for less. The cost of fuel is more, because of the increased length of the school year, and cold spring and fall weather. There are not many days when it is comfortable without a fire in the morning to warm the room. I have spoken of the good attendance. Much credit is due to the parents for this change for the fact that children are punctual at school depends almost wholly upon those at home who have the children in charge and I thank them for their hearty co-operation along this line. At Orrington Corner, one of our smallest schools, we find two girls, sisters, Elsie and Grace Sugden who have never been tardy or absent during their entire school life which in Elsie's case is 7 years and in Grace's is 6 years. At King school, Howard and Elsie Harriman whose ages are 7 and 5 years respectively have not been absent one half day during the sehool year of 1910-11 and the distance from their home to the school is nearly one-half mile. I doubt if any better record can be shown by any town whose children live so far from schools. This punctual constant attendance can best advance scholarship. We have not been interrupted

by contagious diseases among the children. This has been a Those whose eyes, or ears have needed attention healthy year. have been promptly treated. Illness on the part of three of our teachers, during the first of the spring term disturbed us greatly. At East Orrington and Pierce schools three different teachers were installed before the end of the term and Miss Preble at Orrington Center was obliged to have a substitute for three weeks. These unforseen and unavoidable changes can but hinder progress, and we regret them but are obliged to do our best to fill vacancies and proceed with the work. At the close of the spring term examinations coming from "The State Department" were given to those pupils completing ninth grade work six pupils were certified as being competent to do High School work. We hear good reports of their rank in Secondary Schools of standard grade. We have made no change in text books this year, but have supplied the necessary books in place of worn ones, and have furnished all necessary supplies for school work. Six schools are now furnished with maps and we hope to furnish enough for all soon. Some new books have been added to school libraries and curtains, flags, and pictures have been bought as the result of the work of our Leagues which is an important part of our work. At Snow's Corner fine entertainments have been held which have helped to buy many needed articles for the schoolhouse. Also at East Orrington and Pond schools where we find the pupils interested for their room. Quite extensive repairs have been made at King schoolhouse, painting outside and in, papering, whitening and replacing the old seats with new hygienic single desks. It is an attractive room and is much appreciated by the children. Nickerson schoolhouse has had its share of repair money this year being painted outside and painted and papered inside. Orrington Corner Schoolhouse was painted on the outside which painting was expensive on account of the high price of materials. We found work at South Orrington which we did not anticipate when making estimates for money, but shingling was found to be a necessity so that with a new stove and some changes inside to make the room more comfortable we found an expenditure of \$100 or more necessary. We had to have schoolhouses banked and rooms cleaned. This brought our expenditures slightly above the appropriation, overdrawing 90 cents in the last two years. Some shingling is necessary for some houses and a new fence around the Center schoolhouse is needed. Only the Pond and Goodale's Corner schoolhouses are left with the old fashioned benches.

Going among the schools as I am constantly doing, studying the pupils individually as to characteristics of and ability for work the responsibilities of the teacher and Supt. are brought constantly to my mind and the necessity of two goals set up before the pnpil to reach, one he can be led to see clearly, the other lies hidden for a time behind it. The first represents the immediate aim of education—the mastery of the lesson for the day, the successful completion of a subject or a course, the coveted High School admission. And when the diploma has been fairly earned the first goal has been reached and the second goal is before the pupil which is "character" which is a growth not a spasm and the school must supply many of the conditions of such growth.

The most characteristic work of the republic is done by the teachers and the responsibility of choosing teachers for the schools, who will not only teach the lessons from the text books but will train the characters of our young people is great. We

can but trust that.

"The seed which we have sown with care Must yield its fruit sometime, somewhere."

I particularly urge the parents to visit the schools more often to encourage the teacher by suggestions and by their presence. With grateful remembrance of all the kindnesses I have received at the hands of the citizens, I respectfully submit this my twelfth Annual Report of the Schools of Orrington.
