Dear Dr. Ames:

Inasmuch as you were born in Portland, it must be a matter of regret that your writings are not in the Maine Author Collection.

Perhaps you know of this permanent exhibit of Maine books -- those written by Maine people, or written about the state. Most of the volumes (well over three thousand now) are inscribed presentation copies, the inscriptions adding particular distinction to the interest and value of the collection. A file of biographical and critical material is also maintained for the use of visitors and students, and we are understandably proud of the Maine authors and their books.

It is probably a large order to expect to add all your books at once, but we thought you might like to inscribe and present one or two of the most recent. We shall hope to acquire the others from time to time, so that your writings may be complete in this collection. We must, of course, consider the collection incomplete as long as it lacks the books of any Maine author, and the omission of yours is a want which we hope to remedy.
