FISHING

General Laws

Fishing licenses are required for fishing in the inland waters and transporting fish taken therefrom, by all residents over 16 years, and all non-residents over 10 years of age.

ICE FISHING

The general law allows ice fishing for salmon, trout and togue during the months of February and March, and in some counties during April. In some ponds where common fish predominate, (pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts) it is lawful to fish from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring.
