To the Sheriff of the said county of Hancock, or
either of his deputies, or the constables of the town of Sebec
within the said county, or to any or either of them

Greeting
on the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you
are required to attach the goods or estate of Clement Bunker
& Stephen Bunker, both of Sebec aforesaid, yeomen, to the
value of thirty Dollars, & for want thereof to take the bodies of the
said Clement & Stephen, ~~if they can be found~~ in your precinct
& them safely keep, so that they may be had before me, Moses
Greenleaf Esquire one of the Justices of the peace for the county aforesaid,
at my dwelling house in Williamsburgh on Monday the
twenty fourth day of January instant, at two of the Clock in
the afternoon, then & there to answer to Ebenezer Chase of Sebec
aforesaid yeoman in a plea of the case for that the said Clement
& Stephen at said Sebec viz at said Williamsburgh on the fourteenth
day of June now last past ~~for their note of that date~~ by them
subscribed for value received promised the said Ebenezer Chase
his order sixteen Dollars worth of produce at their house in said
Sebec, mearing on demand & with interest for delay. And the
said Ebenezer Chase avers that at their said house at said Sebec on the said
fourteenth day of June demanded payment of said note, yet
though requested the said Clement & Stephen have not paid
the same but neglect it to the damage of the said Ebenezer
Chase as he saith the sum of three Dollars & ninety two cents, as
shall then & there appear with other due damages. Hereof fail
not & make due return of this writ & of your doings therein, unto
myself at or before the said twenty fourth day of January next.

in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & fourteen
