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**AN ACT Clarifying the Law Relating to Travel over Construction Projects.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 23, § 26, amended.** The 3rd sentence of section 26 of chapter 23 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Whenever practicable, the travel shall be permitted to pass over a state or state aid highway under construction, **at the risk of the traveller, however,** and the Commission shall then cause to be erected the following sign at either end of the construction work: “State road under construction. Pass at your risk. Maine State Highway Commission.’
