By this Contract
 Smith & Co. agreed to bind the "Reports
 & Abstracts" of the Secretary of the Board of
 Agriculture, in full cloth at 32 cents per copy.

Substantially the same clause is found
 in all the preceding Binding Contracts since
 these books have been published. The in-
 variable practice, as your Committee learn,
 has been to bind the Report and Abstract
 together in one book at the Contract price
 of 32 cts per volume. No case has come
 to the knowledge of your Committee when
 the Abstract has been bound as a sep-
 arate book. This seems to have been the in-
 terpretation of this clause in the Contracts by
 all who have been called upon to construe or
 enforce them. Your Committee believe that
 the natural and the legal interpretation, other-
 wise the binder, at his pleasure, could bind in
 two volumes, as in this case, thus increasing
 the expense to the State from \$300 to \$4,800, -
 or even into thousands, for yet even more as he might
 choose subjecting the State to paying several
 times the Contract price instead of one.

Such a precedent as this interpret-
 ation would establish must be one unsafe to the State.

There seems to be no authority, in law, for the printing of the Abstracts by the parties who did it, or for the binding it in the manner it is bound. All such work was authorized by Chap. 58, Sec. 5. of the Revised Statutes. The Legislation of 1879, by Chap. 167 of its Public Laws, repealed so much of said Section as provided for such work or expenditures. The Public printer for 1878, after the passage and approval of this Law, March 6, 1879, it seems did not go on and print these Abstracts. No party, as far as Committee can learn, or believe, having authority of law to print these Abstracts even did it. The Printer for 1879, it is believed, had no authority under their Contract to print and far Committee is informed they do not claim to have done it under the 1878 Contract of other parties. If the printing was unauthorized by these parties, it is not easy to discern the authority of the binders to take the work from them and bind it, and especially as a separate book, when it could and should have been included in the 10,000 Volumes of the Report of 1878, which had been previously bound and paid for at 32 Cents per Volume.

Far Committee find no evidence of any ratification of this work, in behalf of the State, by any of its authorized officers either in consenting to its publication and binding or in accepting the Volumes since they were bound. They are put in the hands of

a statement, in the form of an account, of what the records of the Department show to have been the financial transactions between the claimants and the State since March 14, 1879.

By this account it appears that the claimants have received from the State, on account of Public Printing for the year 1879, the sum of \$6,786.42, which covers and fully pays for all work appearing to have been done by them, properly coming within the work given out for that year. Their itemized accounts in full, as appears by said statement exceed that sum by \$522.55. Disallowing that sum the accounts balance.

On examining this bill of June 26, it will be seen that that item is for printing what is known as "Abstracts" of the Secretary of the Marine Board of Agriculture.

The Legislature of 1879, by an Act approved March 6, 1879, specified all laws authorizing the making or publishing such a work. It was therefore apparent that no work of that kind for 1879 could have been done by these claimants. On examination it was ascertained that there were the Abstracts of 1878 which, if to be published, would come within the printing contract of that year and it would have been the duty, or privilege, or both, of Sprague, Owen and Stark, the public printers of that year, to do the work.

The claimants do not claim under the printing of that year, but as printers for 1879.

On examination from Com. matter find no contract between the claimants and the State, however, for that year. They do find a proposition in writing, of these claimants, dated April 3, 1879, filed in the office of Secy. of State April 24, 1879, directed to Hon. H. Garcelon, C. H. Gore and C. A. White, offering to do the printing of that year upon certain terms therein stated. But no evidence is found that these persons accepted the proposition, or had authority to do so, or that it was ever acted upon by anybody in Department having authority to act for the State in the premises.

The work was, in fact, done in 1880. The claimants were not the Public Printer for that year. Finding, then, no authority to do this work, under the Contract of 1878 or as printer of 1879, or under the Contract with other parties for 1880, and finding no pretence of ratification of the work by any body authorized to act for the State, your Committee see no legal authority in this Department of the government whose duty it is to enforce and not make laws or Contracts to pay this bill. They recommend its disallowance, thus leaving nothing legally due these claimants upon the bill submitted.

The Secretary of the Board of Agriculture has declined to receive these books, and they are yet in the
