

To the Honorable, Mr. Sarah

In compliance with its order of the 5th inst., I would inform the Senate that the ~~Members~~ Members of the Maine State Seminary have given satisfactory evidence, ~~in this part~~, to this Department, of a compliance, in this part, with the provisions of their act of incorporation; and that they had substantially complied, in the month of October 1857, at which time buildings had been erected suitable for the accommodations of the Seminary, & which were then in use for the education of Youth.

It is proper to state that at that time, the building house, then in progress of construction & since finished, was not completed; from which fact, together with a want of authority to issue the State ship provided for in the act, the Governor General in July 1854 deemed it advisable not to take any action upon this business. The Legislature in March 1858, made provision for

The payment of interest until the State shall  
open & deposit the sum as therein provided.

At this time "the boarding house" was completed &  
was in use, & by reference to the act of incorporation  
it was seen that it did not provide for a 'boarding  
house' & it was shown not to have been originally con-  
-templated; & as it did not appear to have been indispensable  
to the purposes of the Seminary it was matter of doubt  
whether it could well be regarded as a condition  
precedent with respect to the Trustees
