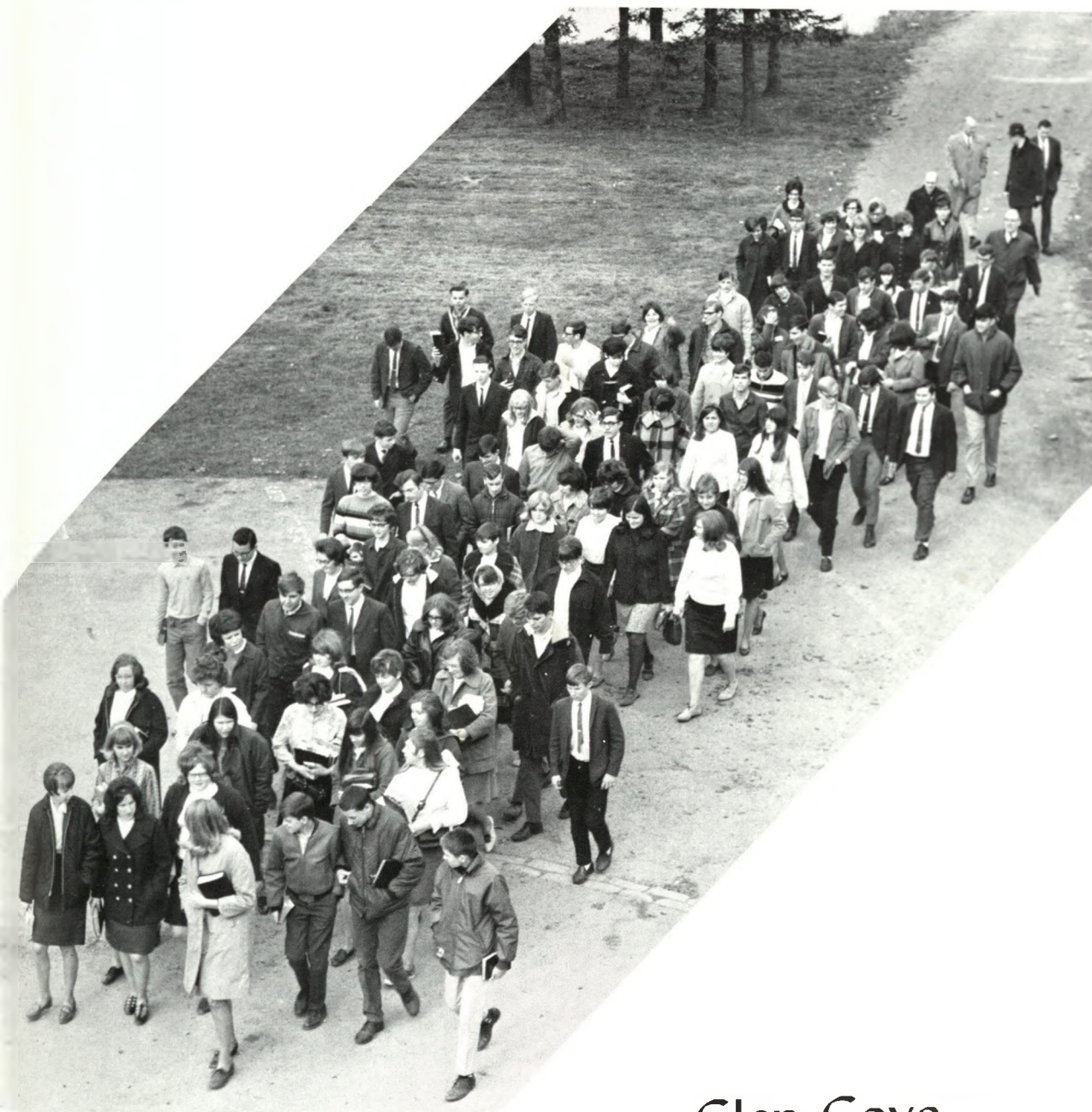

#### THE PRESIDENT SPEAKS

When the three astronauts were circling the moon, they read from the Word of God. Someone has pointed out that if the astronauts had read the Bible in some of our institutions of learning here on earth, they might have been persecuted or even prosecuted. While they were circling the moon it was difficult to get to them with a police force to apprehend them. Since they have returned I have not heard that they have been taken into custody.

There are, however, in America many Christian Schools where the Bible is read every day and the number of these schools is increasing every year. The National Association of Christian Schools has 260 schools and over 45,000 students. In these schools the Bible is believed and taught. Why is the Bible so important? First of all the Bible teaches that God is the creator and sustainer of the universe. In Hebrews 11:13, we read, "By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the Word of God so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear." Creation by a direct act of God is what the Bible teaches; but this truth is denied by most schools of learning in America today. Secondly, man is a sinner by birth and by practice. Basically, man is not good, but rather, he is bad. Our first parents fell into disobedience and sin and plunged the whole race into sin and death and judgment. This also is denied by most schools of learning in America today. Thirdly, God has provided redemption for man in the sacrificial work of Christ on the cross. Man can be saved by simple faith in Jesus Christ. This also is denied by most schools of learning in America today. Fourthly, the Bible teaches that there are absolute standards of Christian conduct. Most schools of learning today teach "situation ethics." This means that every man does what is right in his own eyes.

Since these basic truths are denied, many Americans have turned to the Christian School for the training of their young people. We thank God for this opportunity and trust that many of these students will continue to take the message of the Bible to all the world.

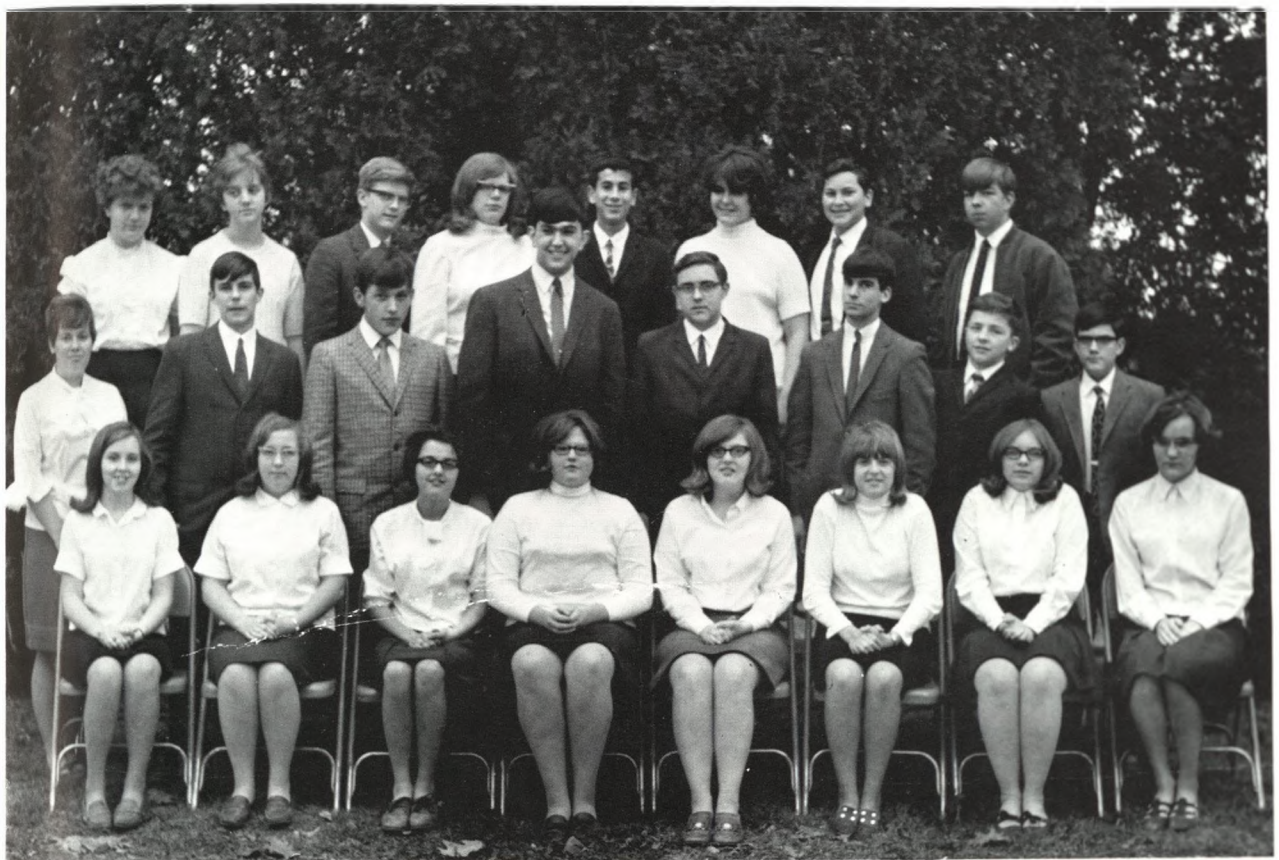
The Junior Class has shared in such activities as: basketball, choir, girls' volleyball, girls' trio, boys' quartet, and spelling bee.
