To Marshall Spring Constable of the Town of Montville. - Greeting

B. You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify & warn the male inhabitants of said Town being twentyone years of age & upwards, having a freehold estate within this Commonwealth of the annual income of three pounds or any estate to the value of two hundred dollars; to meet at the dwelling house of Major Richd M Willister in said Town on Monday the fifth day of April next at ten of the clock in the fore noon. To give in their votes for Governor, Lieut. Governor, Senators & Counsellors agreeable to the Constitution of said Commonwealth.

Fail not to make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ~~me~~ one of the Selectmen of sd Montville at or before the time of meeting Given under our hands & seals at sd Montville this nineteenth day of March A.D. 1813.

of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & seven.

An act to incorporate the Plantation heretofore called Davistown
into a Town by the name of Montville.

Sec 1. Be it enacted by the Senate & House of Representatives in
General Court Assembled, and by the authority of the same
That the Plantation heretofore called Davistown lying part
in the County of Lincoln, partly in the County of Kennebec &
partly in the County of Hancock, being the Second Grand
Division of the Twenty Associates Land, and agreeable to the
boundaries thereof, together with the inhabitants thereon, be
Incorporated into a Town by the name of Montville.

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Viz. 1st. Beginning at a Hemlock Stake at the southwesterly corner
of said second Grand Division in the line of the first Grand Division
of said Twenty Associates Lands marked 7 M. 272 R. and a spruce
tree standing near said Stake marked 20 A corner &c. Thence running
North thirty four degrees East Seven miles two hundred & seventy five
rods to a yellow birch tree marked 20 A. E. corner &c. Thence
thirty four Degrees west six miles to a hemlock tree marked 20 A.
Corner &c. Thence on the east line of the Plymouth Company's claim
as run by Ballard South 24 degrees west two miles & two hundred
seventy six rods to a beach tree by a large sugar maple—Thence
39° west four miles & one half of a mile to a small beach tree in a thicket
marked; Thence south forty three degrees west one hundred and
fifty rods to a stake; Thence south thirty four Degrees east on the division
Line between the said first & second Grand Divisions six miles to the
Bounds first mentioned; And the said Town of Montville is
hereby vested with all the Powers & Privileges, and shall also be
subject to all the duties & Requirements to which other Towns are
entitled & subjected by the Constitution & Laws of this Commonwealth.
And the whole of said Town of Montville shall be, and hereby
is annexed to the County of Lincoln.

Sec. 2^d. Be it further enacted that any Justice of the Peace for
the said County of Lincoln is hereby Authorized upon Application
therefor to issue a warrant directed to some inhabitant of
said Town of Montville, requiring him to notify &
the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time & place

Greeting. - You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to summon & notify the freeholders and other inhabitants of said Town of Montville, qualified by Law to vote in Town meetings; To assemble & meet at the dwellinghouse of Rich^d M^r Whister Esqr. in said Town, on Monday the fifth day of April next at twelve o'clock at noon, to act on the following articles, Viz:

- 1st. To choose a Moderator to govern and regulate said meeting.
- 2^d. To choose a Town Clerk
- 3^d. To choose Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurers, Constable & all other Officers
- That Towns are by Law obliged to choose in the months of March or April Annually

Voted to discontinue a piece of road that lies between the road that goes from John Bradbury's to Joseph Larri's & the road that goes from said Bradbury's to James Wiers. being a part of the road that was laid out & accepted some years ago from the school-house by Major W. Allister to the aforesaid road going from J. Bradbury's to James Wiers.
4. Chose Simon Ward Agents for School-District No 1. Timothy Lopp for No. 2. Richd W. Allister Esqr for No 3. Phinehas Bean for No 4. Edward Carter for No. 5. Richd Jones for No 6. James Walker for No 7. and James Whitten for No. 8.
5. Voted to divide the school money equally among the several Districts.
6. Voted to raise five hundred dollars in addition to the one thousand voted on the first Monday in April from whence this meeting was adjourned. to be expended on the highways ^{& Town ways} and that one fourth part of the whole be appropriated for keeping the roads open in the winter
- 7 Voted 1st. — That it shall be the duty of the several agents for the school-Districts in Montville, to notify a meeting of the qualified voters in their particular district on the second ^{mon} day of May annually. (until the Town shall vote otherwise) at five o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of agreeing and determining on the manner, their said districts will expend their proportion of school-money for the current years, & at such other times & for such purposes as they (or either of them) may be requested in writing by any five of the qualified voters in their respective districts; and the notice in either case of the time & place & purposes must be in writing, and posted up at the door of the school house in their said Districts at least seven days before the time of meeting

2. That the several school-districts when assembled on notice as aforesaid shall have power to choose a moderator & clerk, and shall have power to adjourn their said meetings from time to time as they shall adjudge it necessary, and whatever may be agreed on by a majority of the qualified voters present respecting laying out their school money shall be recorded by the district clerk & shall be binding on the whole of the said District, and a certificate from the said agents, respectively to the selectmen, certifying that any particular sum of money has been expended for the support of a school in the District to which he is agent, agreeable to a vote of the same shall be deemed a sufficient warrant for the selectmen to grant their order on the Treasurer for the payment of the money. ~

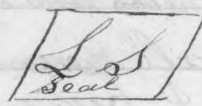

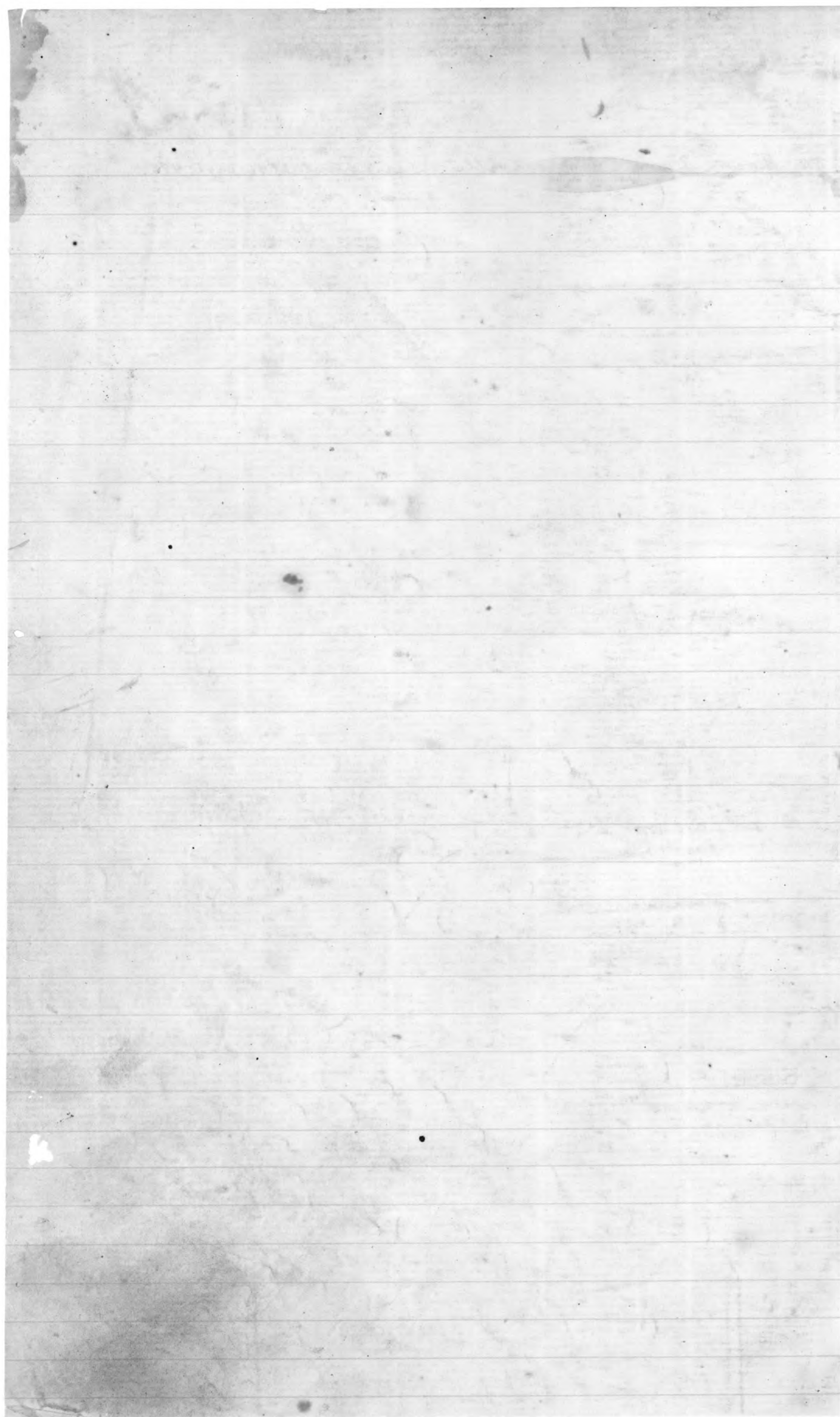
