AUGUSTA, Me. — If your family plans to camp out this summer, and is also looking forward to visiting Expo 67 in Montreal, you can parlay these two fun-filled activities by including a visit to Maine en route, which is only a few hours drive from the Canadian exposition site.

The Pine Tree State offers a wealth of campsites, located in all sections of the State, and in superb natural surroundings. Many campgrounds are on lakes, streams or coastal locations, where swimming, boating, fishing and other water sports are possible; some are situated in mountain areas, or deep in the woods, far from the nearest town, where nature-lovers can revel in solitude.

In addition to about 175 privately-operated campsites, there are many maintained by State and Federal agencies.
