# 1819 Maine Constitutional Election Returns: Gorham

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At a legal Meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Gorham  
in the county of Cumberland qualified to vote for Senators,  
holden on the first Monday of December being the sixth day of  
said month A.D. 1819. for the purpose of giving in their votes in  
writing expressing their approbation or disapprobation of the  
Constitution prepared by the Convention of Delegates assembled  
at Portland on the second Monday of October last, pursuant to  
an Act entitled "An Act relating to the Separation of the District  
of Maine from Massachusetts proper and forming the same into  
a separate and independant State"

The whole number of votes given in, in said town were sorted  
and counted in open meeting of the town by the Selectmen who  
presided at said meeting and were ninety five —  
of which ninety four — were in favor of the Constitution  
as prepared by the Convention aforesaid and one —  
was opposed to said Constitution.

The foregoing is a true copy of the record as entered in open Meeting  
in the books of the town
