BOUNTY RECEIPT ROLL of a Detachment for Sixteenth Maine Regiment of Infantry

THE UNDERSIGNED Soldiers, (not holding a Commission,) in a Detachment of Recruits for the Sixteenth Maine Regiment of Infantry having been enrolled into the service of the United States under the act of Congress approved March 3d, 1863, "for enrolling and calling out the national forces, and for other purposes," do EACH OF us hereby acknowledge to have received from the State of Maine, by the hands of Nathan Dimes, Res., State Treasurer, the State Bounty of one hundred dollars, authorized by an Act of the Legislature, approved March 26, 1863.
