OLD ORCHARD'S POLICE



**SPEND A LOT,
BUT DO LITTLE!**

Are Old Orchard's police on summer vacation? They seem to be in hiding, leaving tourists and citizens to fend for themselves.

Traffic in town has become dangerous. Accidents increase and speed violators go unchecked.

The Chamber of Commerce and Town Manager have been buried under complaints from angry citizens and businessmen.

Tourists strolling on East and West Grand Aves. have been accosted by drunks, with no police in sight.

Frightened tourists have begun heading for the quieter, safer areas of York and Ogunquit.

There were only three police officers on duty July 21, one of the busiest days of the season. All three were located at the square-leaving other hazardous areas like the intersection of Fort Hill and Saco Ave. uncovered.

Yield signs to be painted and installed by June of this year are still not done.

The few police officers who have been spotted in action, lack finesse and the ability to make an arrest without bloodshed.

This "Wyatt Earp" syndrome could be responsible for the rise in assaults on police officers this year.

Who is responsible for this mess?

Ask anyone connected with the police dept., Safety Commission or town government. You'll get the same answer every time--"Not me!"

What type of training do our police officers receive? Do they know how to direct traffic? Can they speak French? Where do they come from? There are 54 police officers listed on last year's budget. Where are they now?

Police Chief Lumb is keeping his mouth shut and his phone off the hook. The man has become more mysterious than the late Howard Hughes.

Though we know he spends time in his office, he refuses to return calls. He refuses to be interviewed or answer important questions. He seems to spend most of his time training policewomen.

Though we realize the summer season is difficult for law enforcement, the police department has money to work with.

The 1975 police budget was \$145,000. Police exceeded their budget by \$41,000. This year's budget was a luxurious \$200,000.

Taxpayers footing this bill are simply not getting their money's worth. Perhaps Old Orchard should abolish the Safety Commission and let the Town Council take charge of the police and fire depts.

The council definitely schedule a discussion of the cost versus efficiency of this town's police department.

It's time for town officials to stop passing the buck-leaving taxpayers to pick up the tab.

O.O.B. CLEAN



Beach cleanup this year is being made more difficult by low tide and hot sands. During low tide, bathers pitch their towels and umbrellas closer to the water and further from the trash barrels.

Hot sands and tender feet discourage the longer walks, and the result is garbage everywhere.

O.O.B.'s profitable sands are rescued daily by young people who manage to change a dirty beach to a clean beach within 3 hours.

The workers, in co-operation with the Town Barn, Road Commissioner and Health Inspector, work their miraculous transformation between the hours of 6 and 9 a.m.

Half the young cleaners are work-study college students. The town pays 20% of their wages, leaving the other 80% to the state.

A typical morning cleanup during the height of the season yields 20 truckloads of litter.

Health Inspector Dwight Mcleod says the kids this year "are doing a great job."

Alelaide Road- No vehicle shall be parked on either side of Adelaide Road from Saco Avenue to A Street.

Aldine Terrace- No vehicle shall be parked on the Northwesterly side of Adlinre Terrace. (left side facing Ocean)

Atlantic Avenue- No vehicle shall be parked on the Southwesterly side of Atlantic Avenue. Between West Grand Ave. & Sea Wall

Bay Avenue- No Vehicle shall be parked on the Southwesterly side of Bay Avenue. (right side facing Ocean)

Beach Street- No vehicle shall be parked on the Southwesterly side of Beach Street (right side facing Ocean)

Blaine Road- No vehicle shall be parked on Blaine Road.

Boisvert St. - No vehicle shall be parked on the Northeastly side of Boisvert Street. (left side facing Ocean)

Brisson Street-No vehicle shall be parked on the Northeastly side of Brisson Street (left side facing Ocean)

Brown Street- No vehicle shall be parked on the Northeastly side of Brown Street (left side facing Ocean)

Camp Comfort Avenue- No vehicle shall be parked on Southwesterly side of Camp Comfort Avenue (right right side facing Ocean)

Carlsmith Avenue- No vehicle shall be parked on Carlsmith Avenue.

Cleaves Street- No vehicle shall be parked on the Northwestly side of Cleaves Street. (left side facing Ocean)

Courtland Street- No vehicle shall be parked on Courtland Street.

Durocher Street- No vehicle shall be parked on Durocher Avenue.

E. Grand Avenue- No vehicle will be permitted on either

side of East Grand Avenue from Old Orchard Street to the Scaboro Line.

Loading and unloading only will be permitted at the location defined by the chief of Police and designated by proper signs placed on the Avenue in front of the appropriate business establishments.

Evergreen Avenue- No vehicle shall be parked on Evergreen Avenue from Washington Avenue to 16th Street.

Fernald Street- No vehicle shall be parked on Fernald Street.

First Street- No vehicle shall be parked from Heath Street to Atlantic Avenue.

Fourth Street-No vehicle shall be parked on the Southwesterly side of Fourth Street.

Harrisburg Street- No vehicle shall be parked on the Northeastly side of Harrisburg Street (left side facing Ocean)

Heath Street- No vehicle shall be parked on the Southwesterly & Northeastly side of Heath Street.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

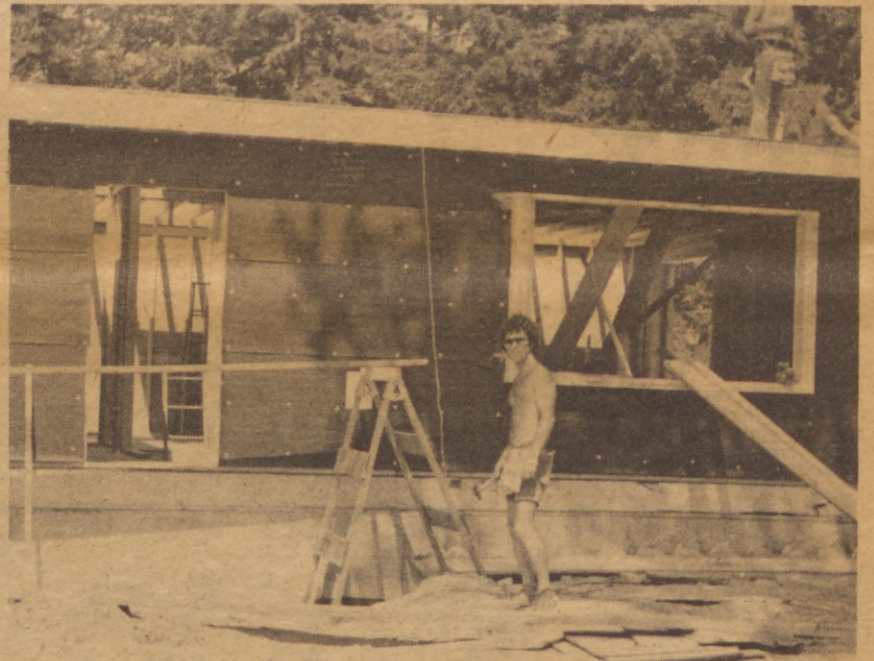

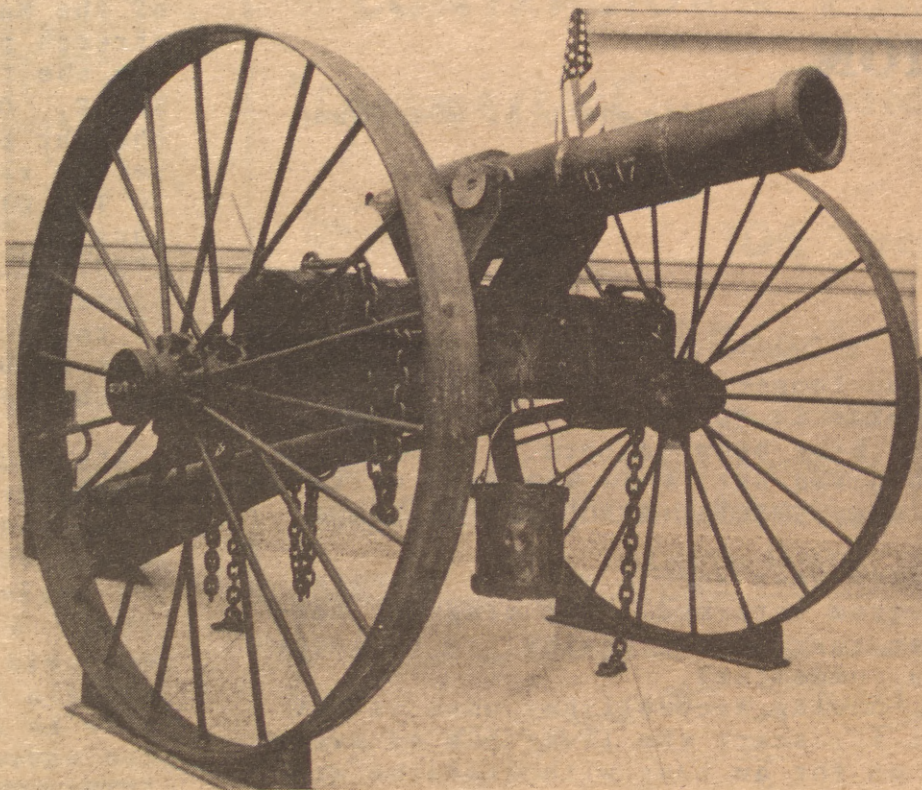

Cannon Holds Up Bank's Age



The Saco and Biddeford Savings Bank is almost 150 years old! To celebrate the spirit of the Bicentennial, as well as to activate the bank's own celebration in 1977, a cannon is on display in the Saco office of the bank.

The cannon, on loan, was completely built from "scratch", at Biddeford High School and Vocational School. The senior and junior welding students, under the direction of Arthur Willey, constructed the cannon as a replica of

the "hit and run" light artillery units used during the Revolutionary wars. The band itself is made of pipe, the barrel constructed of welded pieces, shaped and beaten until complete.

Even the wood on which the cannon rests was aged and treated. All of the metal work was hand made by the students...of Biddeford's High School and Vocational School.

The cannon is a great tribute to the students who made it and

to their expertise in welding. The Bicentennial spirit in which the idea was wrought to make the cannon is a great tribute to a nation whose history is so closely tied to the muzzle-loading cannon.

Those who wish to see the cannon may visit the bank in Saco. Because of the cannon's size, it will not be possible to display the cannon in the Old Orchard Beach office of the Saco and Biddeford Savings Bank.

THE ADMIRAL'S PIANO

Located directly on the waterfront in Old Orchard Beach, Maine, the Admiral's Piano is reminiscent of the days when sing-alongs and family harmonizing were popular. Although the Admiral's Piano is not an unusual kind of lounge, it is for Old Orchard Beach. The Guerette's would prefer "not to have men wearing jeans." Many persons have discovered the quiet nature of the lounge and have made it a point to return night

after night. Most tourists who visit the place have a nice thing to say about it. It is intimate, seating at the very maximum, only 120 persons. There is a dance floor and a bar. The interior decor is plain and represents the starkness of the sea and the region. Photos of old architecture and hotels in Old Orchard Beach at the turn of the century adorn the walls, framed in heavy rope. A roll-top desk serves as receptionist and organizer.

The Admiral's Piano is open year 'round for special meetings, banquets and wedding receptions, as well as for high school and college gatherings and group get-togethers. The Waverly Motel, under which is located the lounge,

is also open year 'round and serves as a restplace for travelers and vacationers. There is catering available for the asking and a large, full-sized restaurant-kitchen sits just off the admiral's Piano Lounge.

The variety of in-season clientele makes the Admiral's Piano worth a visit. Canadians, both English and French-speaking, sit for hours sipping a cool "tonic" or a hearty libation...whilst "making merry" the short-lived hours of the week's vacation. Local persons have found the lounge cool in the summer and the perfect place to leave the day's frustrations. Indeed, completely air-conditioned, the Admiral's Piano provides instant relief from those hot, Maine evenings that can plague us.

MARY'S MORSELS

Here is one of my favorite lobster recipes. It is a delicious and different way to cook lobster. I have served it many times to my family and guests. Now that lobsters have gone down in price, you must try this recipe.

LOBSTERS AND RICE

2 live lobsters
1 large onion chopped fine
 $\frac{1}{2}$ C. olive oil or Mazola oil
2 C. long grain rice
1 No. 2 can tomatoes (crushed)
3 C. water
Salt and pepper to taste

Cut up the lobsters in pieces, shell and all. Lobster must be alive and kicking. Cut the claws in about three pieces, the tail in same size, and the body. Do not use the head or the tomally. Wash out the pieces of lobster with the shells, to remove any slivers of bone.

Saute the onion in the oil to soften, add the can of tomatoes and cook for about 5 minutes. Salt and pepper to taste. Add your lobster pieces, shell and all, add the water; cook for about 5 minutes more. Now add your rice and stir well. Reduce heat, cover and cook till rice is done. If it looks a little dry, add a little more water. Stir once in a while, being careful not to scorch. This recipe will serve 4-6. Serve it with a green salad. You can also use fresh shrimp or scallops instead of lobster.

ORANGE CAKE

Grind rind of 1 orange and 1 cup of raisins three times. In bowl put:
1 C sugar
 $\frac{1}{2}$ C shortening
1 tsp. salt
2 eggs
 $\frac{3}{4}$ C sour milk
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tbsp. baking powder
2 C flour

Mix well, add raisin mixture, mix again and pour into 9 X 12" pan. Bake at 375 for 40 minutes. When done, mix $\frac{1}{2}$ C sugar and juice of one orange and pour over top.

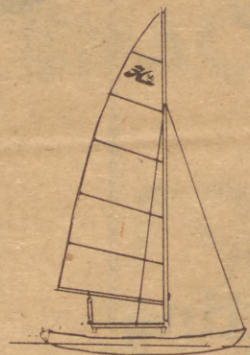

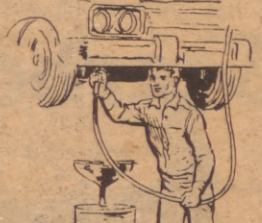

FAIR DAYS



Scarborough Fair will again open its gates on Saturday the 24th for eight big days of children's races, contests, games, and prizes; horse and oxen pulling, mini-tractor pulling, tractor driving contests, miniature harness racing, art and photography shows, flower shows, grange exhibits and much more, all part of the Second Annual Scarborough Fair.

On opening day, Scarborough Fair will play host to the 36th Annual Maine State Dairy Show, where an estimated 600 head of Ayrshires, Brown Swiss, Guernseys, Holsteins, Jerseys, and Milking Shorthorns will compete for top honors in this the most important singular event in Maine dairying. Clem Dunning, superintendent of all the livestock departments stated that, "Of course we are overjoyed at the prospect of having the State Show here, and it is quite an impressive sight, but all of the livestock departments are reporting good entry totals. This year's sheep, goat, beef cattle, and dairy goat shows will be even bigger than last year when we had full entries in all departments. This year we will be able to handle more stock, as we have over 62,000 square feet of covered area."

Les Barden, superintendent of the horse and oxen pulling, is likewise very positive, "We had some excellent contests here last year and everyone was pleased about the facility and the high premiums. This is a very small community (horse and oxen pulling) and news travels very quickly, so we are getting many more inquiries and I expect a lot more entries than we had last year."

The same story goes with Marj Murphy, director of the 4-H exhibits, Clee Miller, who will direct this year's flower and arranging classes, Drew Miller, of the art and photography shows, right on down to Lew Bubier, director of Farmer Brown's barnyard, who says, "I have no problems, I know that my department is the most popular on the grounds, there won't be any mix-ups this year, most of the animals are already here so it will be a real good show."

"Tuesday and Wednesday programming should be of big interest to the children," says Roger Smith, general manager of the Scarborough plant, "We have got all kinds of races, eating contests, events and scrambles planned for their enjoyment. We are also very happy to be hosting this year's Firemen's Muster. There will be a big parade through Scarborough, ending on the Fair Grounds with the 5th Maine Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps,

the South Portland Fireettes, and the Shriner's Oriental Band. There is something for everyone on every day of the Fair, and we have scheduled some of the shows and contests in the early evening so that there will always be something happening for those in attendance. Of course, the King Reid Show midway will be open all the hours of the Fair. All I can say is that you should pick up a program and come on out and enjoy the fun."
