There were three terms of school, a Spring term of ten weeks, a Fall term of ten weeks and a Winter term of twelve weeks, making a school year of thirty-two weeks. The several terms of school commenced on the following dates: Spring term April 10, Fall term Sept. 14, and Winter term Dec. 5.

## NORTH SCHOOL

Miss Eleanor A. Fullerton of Yarmouth was instructor for the Spring term. The Fall and Winter terms were taught by Miss Sadie Murphy of Carmel.

## SOUTH SCHOOL

Miss Mabel P. Heal was teacher during the entire school year.

As you are all aware there was only two schools running during the year, one at the North and the other at the South End, which was considered advisable at the annual Spring meeting, on account of the few scholars, near the Center. Since then conditions have changed somewhat and it may be to our advantage to have a school there a part if not all the year.

The teachers employed during the year were teachers of much experience, painstaking and conscientious in their duties and the progress made was alike creditable to both scholars and teachers and with few exceptions harmony prevailed throughout the year.

During the year (as in the year previous) a test of the sight and hearing of the pupils, has been made and where defects were found the parents have been notified. Leaflets issued by the State Board of Health of Maine, relative to health of home and school have been distributed to the scholars and can be obtained from the school officers when desired.

The school buildings with the exceptions of the upper are in fair condition. The South schoolhouse during the year has had the ceiling and walls brightened up with a coat of muresco and the necessary repairs on the floor. At the North schoolhouse the ceiling has been painted, the walls papered and the entry and closets have been sheathed. Probably one hundred and fifty dollars additional repairs are needed to put the building in good condition.
