A Grand Trunk Train's Escape From Serious Accident.

MECHANIC FALLS, Jan. 12.—The Grand Trunk passenger train due here at 7:10 a. m. met with what might have been a serious accident. The train brought attached to the rear, a flange digger for the purpose of digging the snow and ice from between the tracks. The man in charge was named Andrus. The train was approaching the crossing at Gorham, N. H. On approaching the crossing above the junction of the Rumford Falls and Buckfield road with the Grand Trunk the flange digger failed to raise the wheels clear of the planks in the crossing. It appears that he did not raise it sufficiently so that the plows caught in the planking. The lever coming over struck Andrus' head and he fell. The train was stopped for a moment. The flange digger was then raised and the train was allowed to pass. The accident was averted.
