At a legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Georgetown in the County of Lincoln, qualified to Vote in the choice of Senators holden on Monday the sixth day of December A.D. 1819. for the purpose of giving in their votes in writing expressing their approbation or disapprobation of the Constitution prepared by the Convention of Delegates assembled at Portland on the second Monday of October last pursuant to an act, entitled "An Act relating to the separation of the District of Maine from Massachusetts proper, and forming the same into a separate and independent state."

The whole number of Votes given in, in said Town, were sorted and counted in the open meeting of the town, by the Select men who presided at said meeting, and were thirty seven of which thirty six were in favor of the Constitution prepared by the Convention as aforesaid and One were opposed to said Constitution
