# Rules And Regulations

Art 1<sup>st</sup> This Association shall be called the third private burying ground in Union.

2<sup>nd</sup> The officers of this corporation shall be as follows. a clerk who shall perform all the duties of clerks of corporations and societies

3<sup>rd</sup> Three trustees who shall also be assessors shall perform all duties required by law. as assessors of other corporations and societies and as trustees to superintend and promote the best interest of said corporation.

4<sup>th</sup> A Treasurer who shall also be a collector. and perform all duties by law. required of treasurers and collectors of other corporations and pay over all moneys as treasurers and collectors. to the order of the trustees.



Art 5<sup>th</sup> A Sexton who shall perform all the duties required by law of sextons. appointed by the select men of towns. and receive such compensations as the trustees shall agree upon to be paid by those who employ him, and all the above shall be chosen by written ballot.

" 6<sup>th</sup>. The corporation may vote to raise any sums of money. they may think proper at any legal meeting of said corporation.

" 7<sup>th</sup>. Meetings of this corporation shall be called upon the request in writing of any five members of said corporation to the clerk.

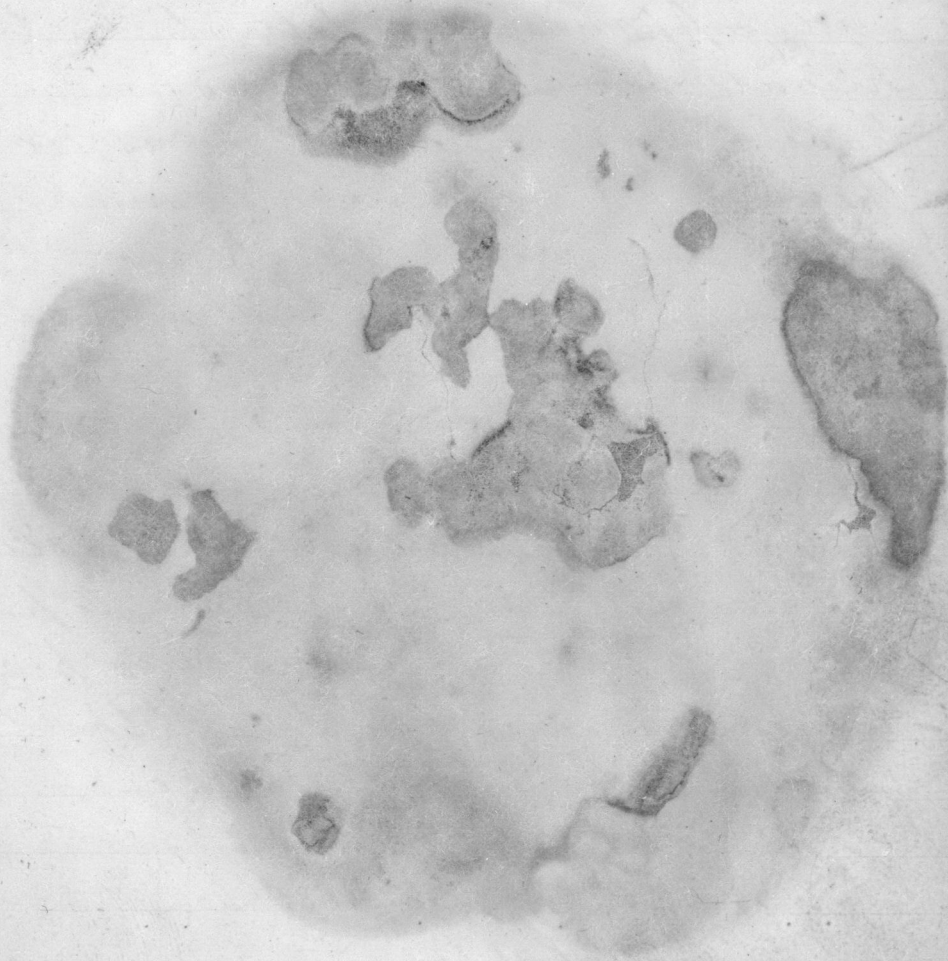
" 8<sup>th</sup>. The clerk shall notify all meetings of said corporation by posting up notifications in two public places. seven days previous to said meeting.

Art 9<sup>th</sup> The assessors shall assess all moneys voted to be raised upon the lots. according to their appraisal

" 10<sup>th</sup> Any person may become a member of this corporation by purchasing a lot in the private burying ground. and by having the same recorded with the clerk. together with the number and appraisal of said lot

" 11<sup>th</sup> The corporation shall hold its annual meetings for the choice of officers.

" 12 These rules may be altered & amended at any legal meeting of the corporation





Report of committee appointed to

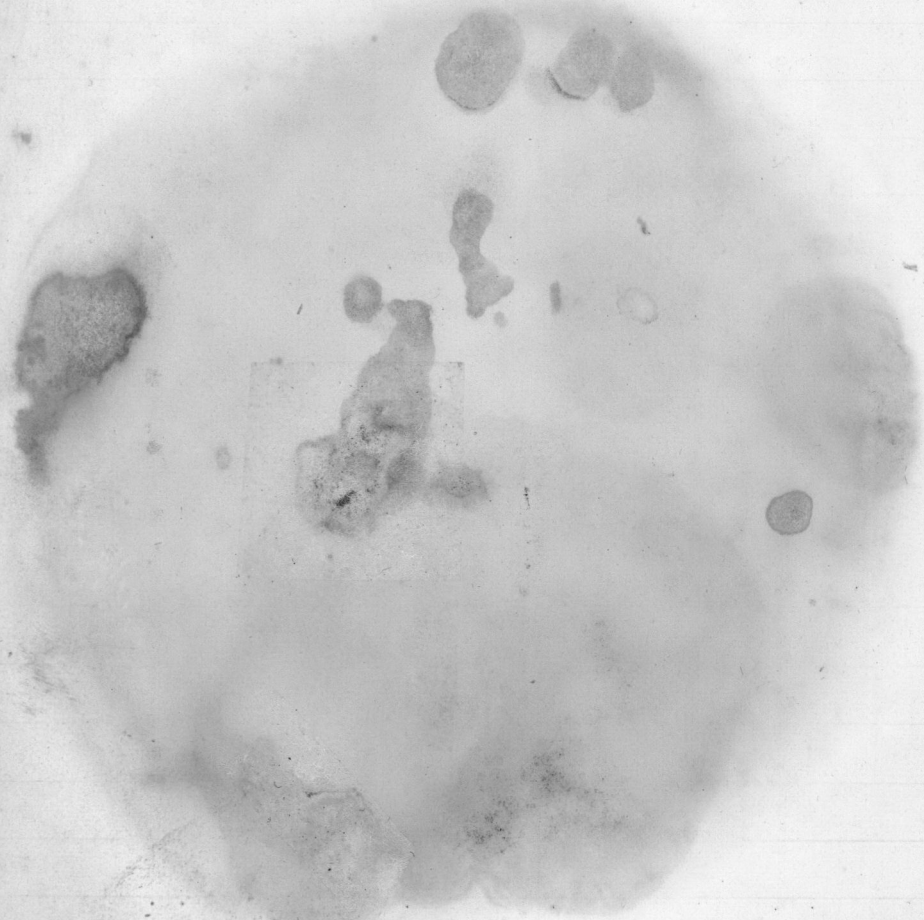

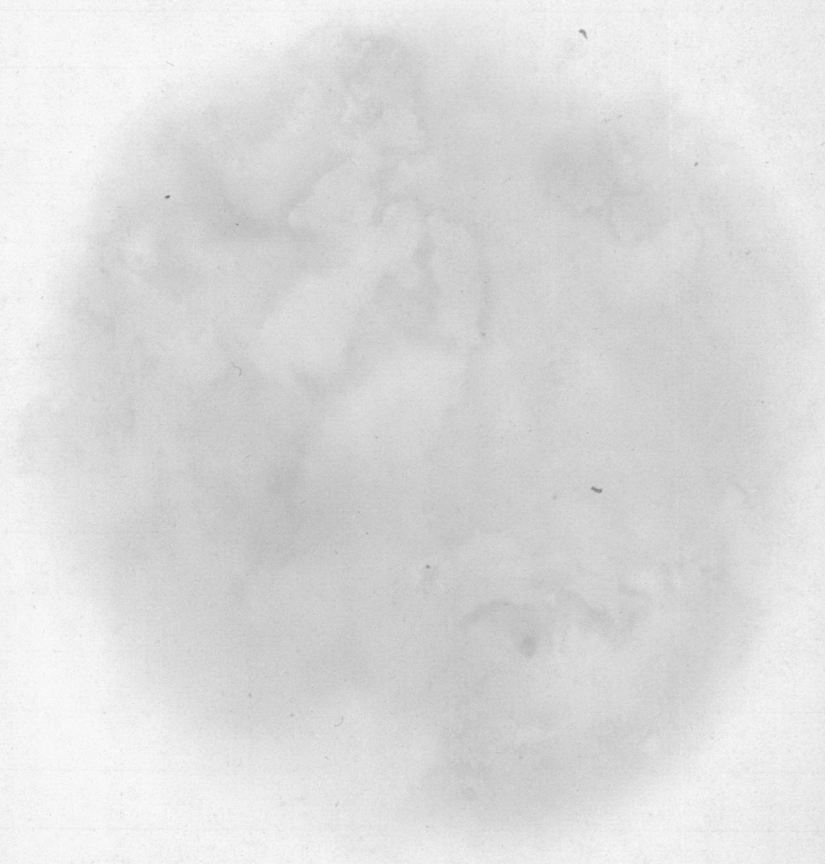
