





WE RETURNED TO OUR SECOND YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL WITH ELEVEN STUDENTS. NOW THAT WE WERE SO MUCH MORE GROWN UP WE RECEIVED THE ENJOYMENT OF INITIATING THE HUGE GROUP OF FRESHMEN WHO ENTERED.


OUR CLASS IN 1939-40 WAS DECREASED TO EIGHT STUDENTS. IN THE PLAY PRESENTED BY THE SCHOOL IN OUR JUNIOR YEAR, WALTER LEONARD AND ROGER PENDLETON TOOK ACTIVE PARTS. IN DECEMBER OF THIS YEAR OUR CLASS PARTICIPATED IN A PRIZE SPEAKING CONTEST, WITH SEVEN SPEAKERS; NAMELY, WALTER LEONARD, ELIZABETH BICKFORD, ROBERT HASEY, MARIAN SMITH, SELDER BICKFORD, ROGER PENDLETON, AND EVELYN CROSBY. ROGER PENDLETON WAS AWARDED FIRST PRIZE, WALTER LEONARD SECOND, AND ELIZABETH BICKFORD THIRD. THE CONTEST WAS FOLLOWED BY A DANCE, MUSIC PROVIDED FOR BY CHANDLER'S TROUBADOURS OF CARMEL. SEVERAL MEMBERS OF OUR CLASS TOOK PART IN THE ANNUAL SCHOOL PLAY AND ALSO THE SENIOR PLAY, MAN FROM TEXAS. WE PROVIDED A COMMENCEMENT BALL FOR THE FOREVER LOYAL SENIORS, WHICH FOLLOWED THE GRADUATION EXERCISES. THE PROCEEDS WERE ADDED TO OUR CLASS BANK.

OUR FOURTH AND LAST YEAR IN DEAR OLD CARMEL HIGH SCHOOL BEGAN IN 1940 WITH AN ENROLLMENT DECREASED TO SEVEN SENIORS. CARMEL HIGH STUDENTS PRESENTED A MINSTREL SHOW IN FEBRUARY, IN WHICH A FEW MEMBERS OF OUR CLASS TOOK PART. JOE CHANDLER WAS AN ACTIVE HELPER IN PRESENTING IT. WALTER LEONARD, ROGER PENDLETON, AND ROBERT HASEY APPEARED IN THE THREE ACT PLAY, THE CUCKOO'S NEST. FIVE OF OUR SENIORS TOOK PART IN A SAFETY PROGRAM OVER STATION W. A. B. I. WITH THE AUTHORITY OF STATE POLICE SAFETY COMMANDER, SGT. HAROLD B. CARSON.

WE HAVE HAD A HAPPY FOUR YEARS AT DEAR OLD CARMEL HIGH SCHOOL, AND WILL ALWAYS LOOK BACK UPON OUR DAYS HERE AS SOME OF THE HAPPIEST OF OUR LIVES.




JUNIOR CLASS HISTORY

THERE WERE THOSE WHO WERE STUDIOUS, THOSE WHO WERE HAPPY-GO-LUCKY, THOSE WITH ATHLETIC TALENT, MUSICAL TALENT, DRA-MATIC TALENT, AND THOSE WITH BOUNDLESS ENERGY, WHO JOINED INTO EVERYTHING THAT TOOK PLACE. THE FIRST DREAD ORDEAL THAT WE GREEN FRESHMEN HAD TO GO THROUGH WAS IN-ITIATION . THE SOPHOMORES MADE US WALK UP TO DANIALSONS' GRAVEL PIT. THERE WE WERE INITIATED AND THEN TREATED TO A WEENIE ROAST. THERE WAS A LARGE TEAM OF FRESHMEN GIRLS WHO WENT OUT FOR BASKET BALL. EVEN IF WE DIDN'T MAKE THE TEAM, WE GAINED THE EXPERIENCE THAT WOULD STAND US IN GOOD STEAD DURING OUR SOPHOMORE YEAR. AT THE END OF THE YEAR OUR FRESHMAN CLASS GOT A NICE WRITE-UP IN THE TWON REPORT. ALL THE FRESHMEN WERE SO PROUD THAT THEY PROBABLY WILL ALL TREASURE IT IN THEIR SCHOOL DAY MEMORIES.

THE NUMBER OF PUPILS WHO ENTERED FOR OUR SOPHOMORE YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL WERE FIFTEEN. WE ALL ENTERED WITH THE SAME ZEAL AND LOVE OF SCHOOL THAT WE DID THE YEAR BEFORE. THIS YEAR WE WERE A LITTLE MORE RESPONSIBLE. WE STARTED OUT BY ELECTING OUR CLASS OFFICERS. VIRGINIA RICHARDSON WAS ELECTED PRESIDENT; NORMAN POWELL, VICE-PRESIDENT; AND ALICE ST LOUIS, SECRETARY AND TREASURER. THE NEXT HIGH LIGHT IN OUR CAREER FOR THE SECOND YEAR WAS THE PLAY THAT THE SCHOOL PRESENTED, GEORGE IN A JAM . THERE WERE A LOT OF SOPHOMORE GIRLS IN IT. IN FACT MOST OF THE FEMININE ROLES WERE PLAYED BY SOPHOMORE GIRLS. | THINK ONE OF THE GREATEST THRILLS THE SOPHO-MORE GIRLS EXPERIENCED WAS WHEN THEY MADE THE FIRST TEAM IN BASKET BALL. THE TEAM WAS MADE UP OF ALL SOPH-OMORES EXCEPT ONE SENIOR. WE JOINED THE CENTRAL LEAGUE AND FINISHED IN SECOND PLACE THERE WAS ALSO AN OR-CHESTRA IN WHICH WE TOOK AN ACTIVE PART.

IN OUR JUNIOR YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL THERE WERE SIX-TEEN WHO ENTERED OUR CLASS WHEN SCHOOL BEGAN. WE ADDED



TWO MORE LATER IN THE YEAR, BUT WERE UNFORTUNATE IN HAVING TWO OTHERS DROP OUT. WE ELECTED THE SAME CLASS OFFICERS THAT WE HAD IN OUR SOPHOMORE YEAR. ALL THIS YEAR, WE JUNIORS HAVE BEEN VERY BUSY. THE FIRST IMPORTANT EVENT WAS THE JUNIOR SPEAKING CON-TEST. WITH THE HELP OF MISS BARSTOW, WHO COACHED US, IT WAS A GREAT SUCCESS. THE JUNIORS STARTED OUT IN STYLE BY ENGAGING AN OUT OF TOWN ORCHESTRA, SAMMY SALIBA'S. WE HAD A LARGE CROWD AT THE CONTEST AND DANCE THAT FOLLOWED. THE HONORS AWARDED WERE AS FOL-LOWS: FIRST PRIZE, PRISCILLA CLUKEY, SECOND, VI R-GINIA RICHARDSON. THERE WAS A TIE FOR THIRD PRIZE BETWEEN RUTH HIGGINS AND LOUISE DOWNS. SOON AFTER-WARD THE PLAY, THE CUCKOO'S NEST WAS PRESENTED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF MR. INGALLS. SEVERAL OF US TOOK PART. IN BASKET BALL THIS YEAR WE HAVE ENJOYED GREAT BUCCESS. PRISCILLA CLUKEY, THERESA SMALL, AND VIR-GINIA RICHARDSON WERE ON THE FIRST TEAM; ALICE ST .-LOUIS AND RUTH HIGGINS, WERE ON THE SECOND TEAM; AND LOUISE DOWNS AND BARBARA MCGOWN HAD TO WATCH MOST OF THE SEASON BECAUSE THEY BOTH HAD APPENDICITIS OPERA-TIONS. THE JUNIORS HAVE ENTERED MANY ACTIVITIES TO MAKE MONEY FOR THE CLASS TREASURY. SOME OF THESE WERE: A MAGAZINE SALE, A STATIONERY SALE, AND A MIN-STREL SHOW.
