

It is agreed by Baptiste Violette of Hamlin place  
to cut & haul good Spruce Logs the coming winter,  
and land the same safely on bank of St John river  
in said plantation, for H. A. Amiranoff & Co., for five  
dollars per thousand feet. Said logs to be well bround  
and skided, and each log to be marked thus **A** with axe.

Amaranoff & Co agree to pay him the said sum of five  
dollars per thousand feet for same — and to furnish  
the necessary supplies for doing same — Violette  
is to have pork at thirty dollars for one hundred pounds  
molass for one dollar per gallon, tea & tobacco for  
one dollar per pound dry fish for 8,00 per hundred lbs  
and other goods at fair rates — And if there  
has to be any stampage paid to State for said logs,  
Amaranoff & Co agree to pay half of same without charge
