The horticultural season on our 20 to 20 thousand packages of seeds are sold annually, which is a large number when you take into consideration the fact that no seed, as far as I know, is raised in this country. I am now entering the green-house plants of one kind may be in great numbers, for instance—*On one bench*—there were 129 geraniums in this pot. In another bench there were 125, in this 121, and in this 120, and carnations, these plants yield from 20,000 to 30,000 flowers a year. Near this is the rose-hone, which during the flowering season, yields on an average 100,000 flowers. The flowers of the rose-hone are devoted entirely to sniffs. The secret of the success with these flowers lies in cultivating the different kinds of flowers in separate pots, and in a separate room, and in a room in which the temperature from 40 to 50 deg. while the pots reach this state of perfection, requires from 20 to 30 deg. F.
