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1819 Maine Constitutional Election Returns: Orangetown

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At a legal Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town
of Orange Town in the County of Washington qualified
to Vote for Senators held on the first Monday of December
being the Sixth day of said Month anno Domini 1819
for the purpose of giving in their Votes in writing expressing
their Approbation or Disapprobation of the Constitution so
prepared by the Convention of Delegates assembled at
Portland on the second Monday of October last pursuant
to an Act intituled; An Act relating to the separation of
the State of Maine from Massachusetts proposed
of the same into a separate and independent State —

The whole number of Votes given in, in said Town were
told and counted in the open meeting of the Town by the
Selectmen who presided at said Meeting and were in all
eight of which eight — were in favour of the Constitution
prepared by the Convention as aforesaid and none —
were opposed to said Constitution
