How many aliens do you have in your municipality?

Last Friday, June 14, Governor Lewis O. Barrows issued a proclamation calling for the registration of all aliens in our state. To do this job as it should and **MUST** be done, calls for the most serious consideration and cooperation at the command of each and every one of us. Since our Governor issued his request, the National Congress has before it a bill making such action mandatory.

You, as a municipal official, must take the lead in this work. You will receive, if you already have not, a blank for the purpose of registering all aliens in your municipality. **WE URGE YOU TO FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS AND DO SO IMMEDIATELY.** These blanks must be filled out and returned, at once, to the Adjutant General's office in Augusta.

At this time of national and international crisis, we must all do our part. You can do yours and pave the way for others by cooperating in this registration.
