

Standish Apr 22nd / 62

Sir:

My object in writing you is to learn whether there is in your office at Augusta, upon the Volunteer Militia Rolls, which are deposited there, the name of one, Daniel S. Warren, of Standish, I enlisted under Recruiting Officer, J. M. Eaton, of Gorham, the 15th of October, last. He afterwards became 2nd Lieut of Co. H. 12th Regt. Me. V. M., After I enlisted, a Squad of men, those that ^{were} recruited in Standish and vicinity, were quartered at Steep Falls (a village in Standish) one week, at the end of which time we were ordered into Camp at Portland I being taken ill with the typhoid fever returned home, the others proceeded to Camp Preble, there they were mustered into the 12th Regt.

I was confined to the house five weeks on the account of my illness, expecting when I recovered I should be called for to join the company in which I enlisted, but I have heard nothing from them in regard to myself as yet. The Regt., as you are well aware, proceeded

from Camp Preble to Camp Chase,
Lowell Mass, thence to Ship Island
Now I would be pleased to know
what became of my name, whether
it was stricken from the roll or whether
it was deposited in your office with the
others with whom I enlisted.
