Yours Hudson.

I enclose herewith a return of the election in the Company, included by Capt Hemmingsway. The election was entirely harmonious and the best feeling exists. These members of the Company are the finest looking set I have seen. The men are recruited from the towns in the vicinity of Saugus and are many of them the sons of substantial men, and farmers.

Your letters to Mr. Hemmingsway reached him yesterday morning. ~~The~~ ~~Papers.~~ The number in his notes now about 70. ~~and~~ You sent papers to him to go to Augusta over the G & O Road, and the K & F. Road. Springville where the Company has its head quarters is 22 miles from the terminus of the F & O. Road and 11 miles only

Wells Depot on the P. S. & P. Road.
It would be much easier for the
Company to reach Augusta over this
latter road and at less expense
and perhaps a saving of 1 day's time
and supposing you wish to be fully
acquainted with the locality, I am
consulting with Mr. Ford of the
Council recommended Capt. Hemmings
when the Company goes to Augusta
to take the cars at Wells and go
straight through. He will be ready to
report to you on Monday, if this will
answer, ~~you~~ Any instruction you may
give me about the matter shall be
attended to. at once
