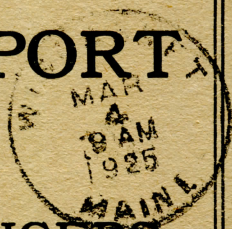

ENROLLMENT OF PUPILS

NORTH SCHOOL

Spring term, 12 weeks; 10 pupils, average 9.02.

Fall term, 11 week; 14 pupils, average 12.

Winter term, 9 weeks; 12 pupils, average 9.33.

Teachers, spring term, Miss Dora Prior, wages, \$14.00 per week; fall and winter terms, Mrs. Andietta L. Roode, wages, \$15.00 per week.

CENTER SCHOOL

Spring term, 10 weeks; 11 pupils, average 9.2.

Fall term, 11 weeks; 13 pupils, average 11 plus.

Winter term, 9 weeks; 9 pupils, average 8.3.

Teacher, Miss Mabel P. Heal; wages, \$15.00 per week.

IN GENERAL

The two weeks lost time at the North school were made up in spring term, giving that school thirty-two weeks for the year.

The spring term was taught by the same young teacher who taught the winter term so satisfactorily; the fall and winter terms were under the care of a trained normal teacher, who had previously taught this school, and whose many terms of successful experience makes her work pleasant and profitable for pupils and community.

The Center school has continued to prosper and improve under the care of the same teacher as the past two years.

The average attendance has been good in both schools.

Considerable much needed work has been done on Center schoolhouse, the sanitary conditions being provided for as required by State laws so that now both school buildings have been fixed to meet the requirements of the State. The south side of the Center schoolhouse roof has been covered with slate surfaced roofing and the teacher has reported that both sides of the roof appear to be tight. It would, therefor, seem that the north side of the roof could be left as it is at present and that this year the building should be painted which it needs very badly.

We would recommend appropriations as follows:

Town Warrant

*To Horace Jones, a constable of the Town of Westport,
in the County of Lincoln.*

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall, in said town, on Monday, the ninth day of March, A. D. 1925, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town accounts of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor, and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the ensuing year.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and

county tax and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in section 18 of chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 10—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the improvement of section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of section 18 of chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year within the limits of the town, under the provisions of section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 12—To see if the town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the pay of a man to run the ferry.

ART. 13—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to cut bushes on the highway.

ART. 14—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyards for the school buildings and raise money for same.

ART. 15—To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural re-

sources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of chapter four, section fifty-nine, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

ART. 16—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 17—To see what action the town will take in regards to fire wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 19—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at nine-thirty in the forenoon to revise the voting list.
