# 1819 Maine Constitutional Election Returns: Thorndike

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At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Thornville in the County of Hancock, qualified to vote for Senators, holden on the first Monday of December being the sixth day of said month A.D. 1819, for the purpose of giving in their votes in writing, expressing their approbation or disapprobation of the Constitution prepared by the Convention of Delegates, assembled at Portland on the second Monday in October last, pursuant to an act, entitled, "An Act relating to the Separation of the District of Maine from Massachusetts proper, and forming the same into a separate ~~State~~ and independent State. &c)

The whole number of votes given in, in said town were sorted and counted in open meeting of the town, by the selectmen who presided at said meeting, and were twenty one of which twenty one were in favor of the Constitution prepared by the Convention as aforesaid.
