IN GENERAL

A very pleasing report of the progress, interest and attendance is presented to the community, trusting that some of the results of our activities proposed will continue to be helpful.

At the North School, Miss Goff did not return for the fall term. We were fortunate in securing a former teacher, Mrs. Roode, who has successfully cooperated with the community in several changes suggested by the committee to make the year one of greater interest and advancement.

The Center School has lowered its average attendance below what the law requires for a school to be successfully operated. The teacher, Miss Heal, understands the pupils, parents and all activities connected with the school system, thereby making her work most helpful and profitable.

In text books, new geographies and histories were needed. The superintendent was instructed to purchase same for schools. Several books as were necessary for general wear and tear were added to those in use.

As the teachers wages and board can not be lowered but tend to grow higher, owing to the increased cost of living, we cannot hope to lessen the appropriation for support of schools this year.

We would recommend a budget as follows:

Town Warrant

*To Horace Jones, a constable of the Town of Westport, in
the County of Lincoln.*

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the eighth day of March, A. D. 1926, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2.—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town accounts of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Schools.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor, and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the ensuing year.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and county tax and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid as provided in Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 10—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the improvement of section of State Aid Road, as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 12—To see if the town will vote to raise money and what sum, for the pay of a man to run the ferry.

ART. 13—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyards for the school buildings and raise money for same.

ART. 14—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to cut bushes on highway.

ART. 15—To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 4, Section 59, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

ART. 16—To see if the town will vote to accept a bequest of \$50.00 by Ruth H. Heald, late of Phippsburg, deceased, to be kept as a fund, and the income thereof to be used for the perpetual care of the Thomas Cemetery or burying ground, so-called.

ART. 17—To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer real estate bought in for taxes.

ART. 18.—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the piece of road commencing at the State Aid Road near the home of James N. Cannon and intersecting the State Aid Road again at the lower end of said Cannon's south field.

ART. 19—To see what action the town will take in regards to the Pauper bill of Edward Clancy, as presented by the City of Bath, or do, or act, anything considered necessary regarding the matter.

ART. 20.—To see if the town will vote to change its depository for funds from the First National Bank of Bath to the Wiscasset branch of the Augusta Trust Company.

ART. 21.—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the town road from M. C. Brooks' gate, south and easterly over land of said Brooks to Pierce north line, and make the same a private way.

ART. 22—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 23—To see what action the town will take in regards to fire wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 24—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer, to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 25—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at nine-thirty in the forenoon to revise the voting list.
