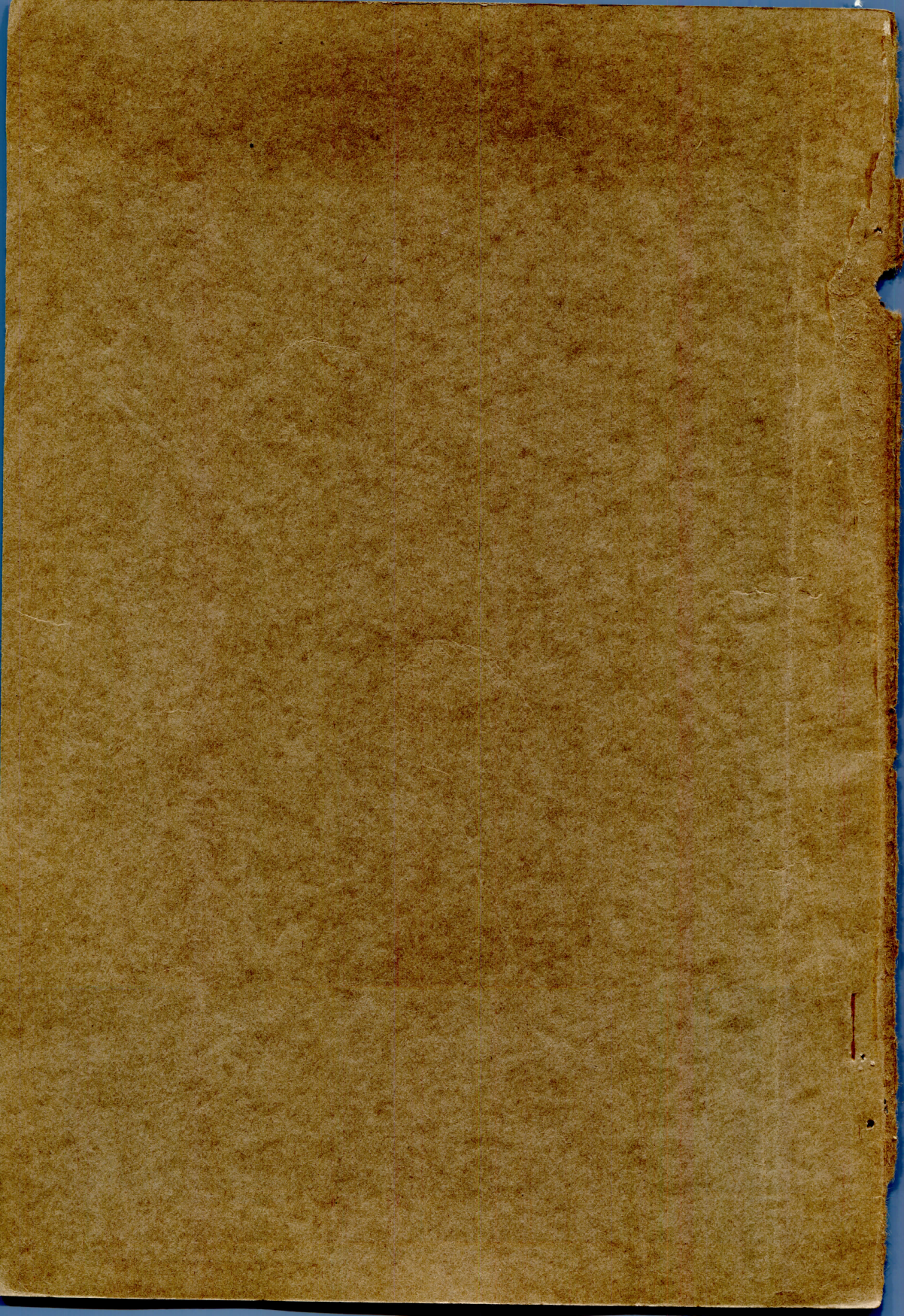

Fall term, 15 weeks; 4 pupils; average 3.9.

Winter term, 5 weeks; 3 pupils; average 2.9.

Teacher, Miss Mabel P. Heal; salary, \$15.00 a week.

IN GENERAL

Your Superintending School Committee voted to maintain a school year of 32 weeks.

Mr. Ordway Lewis resigned his position in the North School to return to his work in Massachusetts. The school had a very profitable year under his instruction. Mrs. Violet B. Day was selected to carry on the work for the fall and winter terms, to the satisfaction of those concerned.

The Center School has had the able instruction of Miss Mabel Heal another year. Miss Heal understands the needs of her pupils and produces very gratifying results. The three boys and one girl are anxious regarding the action of the voters at the annual town meeting in March. It was through the generosity of the town's people that a vote was taken last March to continue the Center School another year.

In view of the probability of another scholar coming from the extreme lower end of the town and the difficulties incident to the proper transporting of the children the long distance to the North School, the Committee feel that, in spite of its small size, very little will be gained under present circumstances by closing the Center School, so they have decided to recommend that it be kept open for the following school year.

Four pupils of the North School are preparing for the high school entrance examinations which are given the twenty-fourth of next May.

Through the generosity of a friend an attractive set of Pictured Knowledge Reference Books has been pre-

sented to the North School. A vote of appreciation is extended to the donor.

My visits to the schools have been pleasant. Excellent work has been done in both schools. The cooperation of teachers and pupils constitute a good working school system.

Warrant for Town Meeting

*To Horace Jones, a constable of the Town of Westport, in
the County of Lincoln,*

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the eleventh day of March, A. D. 1929, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town accounts of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Schools.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor, and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and county tax, and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 10—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the improvement of section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 12—To see if the town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the pay of a man to run the ferry.

ART. 13—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyards for the school buildings, and raise money for same.

ART. 14—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural

resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 4, Section 59, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

ART. 15—To see what action the town will take in regards to keeping the Center School open, or do or act anything considered necessary,

ART. 16—To see what action the town will take in regards to building a wood shed at the North School, and raise money for same.

ART. 17—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of Third Class Highway.

ART. 18—To see what action the town will take in regards to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highway, and raise money for same.

ART. 19—To see if the town will vote to raise \$31 to match State Department of Health funds for the support of county public health nursing to continue work with mothers and children, which is now being carried on entirely by the State Department of Health.

ART. 20—To see if the town will vote to accept the Ferry Road as laid out and established by the County Commissioners, and raise the sum of \$100 to pay land damage, the amount assessed by them.

ART. 21—To elect a fire inspector.

ART. 22—To see what action the town will take in regards to fire wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 23—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of

taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 24—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 25—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the eleventh day of March, at 10.30 a. m., for the purpose of correcting the voting list.
