IN GENERAL

A school year of 34 weeks has been maintained the past year. The unexpended balance in the school accounts would indicate an extension of the winter term, if weather conditions and the prevailing sickness resulting from the sudden changes in our winter climate had not necessitated a vacation during the remainder of the school year.

Mr. Robert Greenleaf's two children have been conveyed to the North School. This was done at the reasonable rate of \$5.00 a week.

The school is well supplied with text-books, wall-maps, and an organ. An addition to the library is needed, especially reference books in biography, history and geography.

Child Welfare Work is one of the new features of our present day school activities. Health inspection in the schools has the support of the State Department. A state nurse is ready to cooperate with the town officials any time during the school year, providing the town appropriates a small amount at its annual meeting in March.

A wood-shed is most badly needed for the school.

We are pleased to hear good reports from our pupils who are attending the secondary schools out of town.

We wish to thank the town officials, the teachers and pupils for their cooperation the past year.

Warrant for Town Meeting

To Horace Jones, a constable of the Town of Westport, in the County of Lincoln,

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said Town on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, A. D. 1932, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town account of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all the necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Schools.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and county tax and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote Yes or No on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 28 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 10—To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 22, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 32 inclusive of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes, for construction of a State Aid Road, beginning at the south end of Westport and extending in a northerly direction to Westport-Wiscasset Ferry; thence to Plumstead Four Corners; thence in a general northerly direction via Birch Point Road to State Highway "D" near the residence of Richard Grover; thence following State Highway "D" to Water Street in Wiscasset Village; thence via Water Street and Lincoln Street to Federal Street; thence over Federal Street and the New Sheepscot Road, so-called, to Alna town line; thence over State Aid Road and Special Resolve Road, via Head Tide, so-called, to Whitefield town line; thence

over State Aid Road No. 2, in Town of Whitefield, to State Highway Route "P" and continuing in a straight line north of State Highway "P" to Jefferson town line, which constitutes the "Three Town Act" designation.

ART. 12—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 13—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class Highways, as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 260 of the Public Laws of 1929, the least amount being \$150.

ART. 14—To see what action the town will take in regards to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highway, and raise money for same.

ART. 15—To see if the town will vote to build a wood-shed at the North Schoolhouse, and raise money for same, or do or act anything considered necessary.

ART. 16—To see if the town will vote to purchase 500 ft. snow fence, and raise money for same.

ART. 17—To see if the town will vote to blast gutters on crooked Thomas Hill, and raise money for same.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to purchase a road drag, and raise money for same.

ART. 19—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) to be used in repairing the piece of road leading from Amos Jewett's stable to the Harriman house, so-called, by petition.

ART. 20—To see what sum the town will vote to appropriate and raise to be expended in repairing the town way leading from the County Road past the Powell Place and the Apt Place to the Hodgdon Place, or take any action relative thereto, by petition.

ART. 21—To see if the town will vote Yes or No in regards to keeping the highway open to auto traffic during the winter months, by petition.

ART. 22—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyards for the school buildings, and raise money for same.

ART. 23—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 4, Section 59, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

ART. 24—To elect a fire inspector.

ART. 25—To see what action the town will take in regards to fire wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 26—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 27—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 28—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, at 10.30 a. m., for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Hereof fail not and have you this warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
