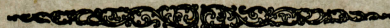

## IN GENERAL

You will note that the town received a large amount from the State School Fund in December, 1932; this with an unexpended balance of \$125.46 in the 1931-1932 school account, and the town appropriation of \$600 justified the school authorities in maintaining a school year of 34 weeks.

Two children have been conveyed to the North School the past year. We suspect that the town will have five pupils to convey the coming year.

The North School is well supplied with all necessary apparatus. The school library needs reference books.

The State Bureau of Health is ready to send a State School nurse any time, provided the town will appropriate a small amount to cover the expense.

Health inspection in the schools has the support of the State Department of Education. An appropriation of \$15.00 would cover the necessary expense of one day's inspection and a later visit to follow up the corrections suggested to the parents.

Once more we call to your notice the great need of a small woodshed at the North Schoolhouse. Another town in Union, No. 48, had one erected which cost less than \$30.00.

We would suggest that your careful attention be given to the increased cost of Secondary School Tuition the past year. It will be larger the coming year.

We have a word of appreciation for the spirit of cooperation among the parents and school officials the past year.

## Warrant for Town Meeting

---

*To Horace Jones, a constable of the Town of Westport, in  
the County of Lincoln,*

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the thirteenth day of March, A. D. 1933, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town account of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all the necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Schools.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and county tax, and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 28 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 10—To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 22, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in accordance with provisions of Chapter 154 of the Public Laws of 1917 as amended by Chapter 157 of the Public Laws of 1919 for the construction of a State Aid Road beginning at the south end of Westport and extending in a northerly direction to Westport-Wiscasset Ferry, thence to Plumstead four corners, thence in a general northerly direction via Birch Point Road to State Highway "D" near the residence of Richard Grover, thence over the new Sheepscot Road, so-called, to Alna town line, thence to McIntire's Corner, thence easterly on State Aid No. 4, to

first road leading to the left, thence northerly and westerly on the direct road, crossing State Aid No. 2, to Seigars Corner, then northerly over Third Class No. 1, State Aid No. 3 and State Aid No. 1 to the Whitefield town line which constitutes the "Three Town Act."

ART. 12—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State Aid Highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.

ART. 13—To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws of 1931.

ART. 14—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 15—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class Highways, as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 260 of the Public Laws of 1929, the least amount being \$181.

ART. 16—To see what action the town will take in regards to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highway, and raise money for same.

ART. 17—To see if the town will vote to purchase 500 ft. snow fence and raise money for same.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) to

relocate the town road over Thomas Hill, so-called, by petition.

ART. 19—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) to be used in repairing the piece of road from Waldron Pierce's turn to Amos Jewett's hill, so-called by petition.

ART. 20—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150) to fight the white pine blister rust in Westport, the State will add fifty per cent. to the amount raised.

ART. 21—To see if the sum of \$15.00 or more will be raised for school nursing in the town of Westport under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare. As the amount of appropriation increases, the length of service will be greater.

ART. 22—To see what action the town will take in regard to flags and halyards for the school and raise money for same.

ART. 23—To see if the town will vote to build a woodshed at the North Schoolhouse and raise money for same, or do or act, anything considered necessary.

ART. 24—To elect a fire inspector.

ART. 25—To see what action the town will take in regards to fire wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 26—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.



ART. 27—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 28 —To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the thirteenth day of March, at 10.30 a. m., for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Hereof fail not and have you this warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
