## IN GENERAL

We are pleased to report that the town received \$435.15 from the State School Fund in December, 1933; this with the town appropriation of \$1,000.00 and the unexpended expenditures of last year's account of \$82.32 gave us \$1,517.47 for this year's receipts. This year's unexpended account is \$82.55.

Six children have been conveyed to the North School this year. Mr. John Harrison conveyed the children during the spring term of 12 weeks for \$10 per week. Owing to an extra trip to the south end of Westport, he received \$15 a week for the fall and winter terms.

The school is well supplied with text books. There is a great need of more reference books.

As in former years the State Bureau of Health has asked the town to appropriate an amount for health inspection.

The new woodshed erected at the North School supplies a long needed want. The repairs on the interior of the North School building have made the school room a very attractive place. It is greatly appreciated by all who use the room.

The flagstaff has been moved to the ground in front of the school building, a place where it belongs. Now if the rock pile may be removed and the school grounds graded, we will have more attractive school property.

Am glad to report that a good sized seventh grade is working to qualify for admission to the eighth grade next year.

The visits to the school have been enjoyed; my association with the members of the School Committee



has been very pleasant; we are grateful for the cooperation of the parents and the school.

## Warrant for Town Meeting

*To John P. Harrison, a constable of the Town of Westport,  
in the County of Lincoln,*

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the twelfth day of March, A. D. 1934, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town account of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and county tax and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 10—To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the Section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 175, Public Laws of 1933.

ART. 11—To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws 1931.

ART. 12—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 13—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class High-



ways, as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 260 of the Public Laws of 1929, the least amount being \$144.

ART. 14—To see what action the town will take in regards to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highways, and raise money for same.

ART. 15—To see if the town will vote to purchase 500 ft. snow fence and raise money for same.

ART. 16—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) to fight the white pine blister rust in Westport, the State will add fifty per cent. to the amount raised.

ART. 17—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) to be used in repairing the piece of road from the Etta Hariman's place to Earl Richardson's, by petition.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to exempt the poll tax of all men over 70 years of age, by petition.

ART. 19—To see if the town will vote to raise money and what sum to procure modern snow equipment to keep the roads open for winter travel.

ART. 20—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) to purchase a piano for the Town Hall.

ART. 21—To see if the town is interested in a bridge and what they wish to do regarding preliminary work.

ART. 22—To see what action the town will take in regards to the pauper bill of Ralph Boucher or Moore as presented by the Town of Camden.

ART. 23—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyard for the school and raise money for same.

ART. 24—To elect a Fire Inspector.

ART. 25—To see what action the town will take in regards to Fire Wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 26—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 27—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 28—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the twelfth day of March, at 10:30 a. m., for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Hereof fail not and have this warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
