IN GENERAL

Owing to a tuition bill, amounting to \$612.50, the school expenditures show an overdrawn account of \$292.87. You will note the amount received from the State was \$260.00 for High School tuition. As the town did not raise a separate amount for secondary tuition we were obliged to place the balance of \$342.50 in the common school account.

Mr. John Harrison conveyed the Center School children to the North School the last spring term of twelve weeks. Mr. Herbert Cromwell was engaged, under contract, to convey these pupils for one year, which opened in September, for \$17.00 per week. These two accounts, \$612.50 for tuition and \$562.00 for conveyance, amounted to \$1,174.50.

The text books and supplies accounts are larger than last year, partly due to the return of the eighth grade to pursue a post graduate course under Miss Davis' instruction.

The State Bureau of Health has asked the town to appropriate an amount for health inspection. Some of the children are in great need of medical inspection. Through the thoughtful interest of the area E. R. A. inspector, Mr. Maurice Jewett, beef soup was provided for all the children in school who carried their noon lunch. Soup to be served two days each week for a hot lunch.

Needed repairs were made on the North School building, costing \$129.96. The removal of the rock pile

and the grading of the school grounds have added greatly to the appearance of the school property.

Very attractive community exercises were held last June in connection with the Grammar School graduation program. A good sized class received certificates of graduation. The meetings of the School Committee have been harmonious and instructive. We appreciate the friendly interest of all connected with North School.

Warrant for Town Meeting

*To Horace L. Jones, a constable of the Town of Westport,
in the County of Lincoln,*

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the eighteenth day of March, A. ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town account of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor and Treasurer.

ART. 3—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools. 1200.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing. 200.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing. 50.00

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, state and county tax and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930. *yes*

ART. 10—To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 175, Public Laws of 1933.

ART. 11—To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads built within the past five years, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws 1931.

ART. 12—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 13—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class Highway, as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 260 of the Public Laws of 1929, the least amount being \$191.00.

ART. 14—To see what action the town will take in regards to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highways, and raise money for same.

ART. 15—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) to fight the white pine blister rust in Westport, the State will add fifty per cent to the amount raised.

ART. 16—To see if the town will vote to pay to the State of Maine one-half of its excise tax, so that residents of the town may be privileged to use the Kennebec Bridge without the cost of toll.

ART. 17—To see if the town will vote to raise \$200 as a special appropriation for road work to be used on the State Road beginning at the so-called turn at Higgins store and extending in a northerly direction, terminating at the Eaton Estate. 200.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to build a schoolhouse at Westport Center, providing the land on which the building is to stand is given to the Town of Westport and also with the provision that the E. R. A. will contribute the money to pay the labor charges. Included in this article is the proposal that the \$250 taken from the surplus funds of the 1933-34 administration be diverted to this fund for material costs as it has never been used. It is further proposed in this article that \$126 paid for hall rental for the year 1934-35 be diverted to this fund as heretofore there has been no record as to how it is spent and the sum and total of these funds amounts to \$376. It is further proposed that the difference of this fund and the actual cost of material be raised by popular vote or be taken from the surplus.

ART. 19—To see if the town will raise by special appropriation \$200 to be used in road construction from the entrance to Colin Dunn's property extending in a northerly direction by the Boli place, so-called, and to be used as far on that road as the money will go.

ART. 20—To see if the town will vote to remove the old stage now erected in the town hall and to put in its place a small platform only sufficiently large to give room for an orchestra. This money to be included in the appropriation for repairs to the inside of the town hall.

ART. 21—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school nursing in the Town of Westport. 30.

ART. 22—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyard for the school and raise money for same. 5.

ART. 23—To elect a Fire Inspector.

ART. 24—To see what action the town will take in regards to Fire Wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 25—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 26—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of town hall.

ART. 27—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the eighteenth day of March, at 10.30 a. m., for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.
