from the 1800s. The event will close on Sunday afternoon with a Patriotic concert in the historic meeting house by Mitch Thomas and Friends.

Admission tickets for this historic event are \$8 for adults and \$5 for children under 12 years old. Discounted weekend passes are available. Funds raised will help the center rebuild an historic barn lost in a disastrous fire in April 2008.

## Summer Hiking and Fitness Club Formed for Kennebec Highlands

## **Funding Available for Small Woodlot Owners**

Tune 15 is the deadline for small woodlot owners to apply for funding to assist in conservation planning and management of their woodlands for fish and wildlife habitat. The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Maine, which has received \$1 million of Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP) funds, is receiving applications at the USDA Service Center, 107 Park Street, Farmington (778-4767, ext. 105) from small woodlot owners. Eligible work may include removing invasive plant species, establishing native plants for bees, planting buffers along streams and ponds, repairing eroded trails and stream crossings, replacing culverts that block fish passage, creating small openings to increase diversity, as well as making forest nesting sites for a variety of wildlife. For a complete listing of eligible conservation practices, go to www.me.nrcs.uska.bog. Maine is one of only seven states offering this forestry initiative.

## \_\_Watershed\_\_ Wisdom

reetings to the greater Belgrade Lakes **J**Community! After a winter that came and went a few times with much less snow than in recent years, spring arrived with ice out on March 19th, nearly a month earlier than last year. Now summer has unofficially arrived, marked by this initial edition of this year's "Summertime in the Belgrades." This is my fourth season as author of the Watershed Wisdom column and I am looking forward to having the opportunity to help our readers better understand some of the natural processes that take place in our lakes and some of the science behind the measures that need to be taken to protect our lakes. Hopefully a little knowledge and understanding will raise awareness and inspire living lightly on the land for the sake of the lakes. Our children and grandchildren will then be able to enjoy the same water quality we have. Because of their fundamental importance, I will be revisiting some of the same topics I discussed last year but hopefully in a way that will shed more understanding. We will also look at some new topics and emerging developments and programs.

Our first topic is one of the most basic but also one of the most important to understand: "What exactly is a watershed and why should I care?" When most people hear the word, "watershed," they immediately think of water bodies such as lakes, rivers, or streams. But a watershed actually refers to the land from which water flows into a particular water body. Think of it as the land "shedding" water like feathers shed water from a duck's back. When it rains, some of the water evaporates quickly back into the atmosphere, some infiltrates into porous soils and becomes groundwater, and the rest runs off as "stormwater." Watershed boundaries are always at the top of the hill or along a ridge. Rain landing (or snow melting) on one side of the hill will run into one watershed and rain landing a short distance on the other side of the hill may drain to a completely different watershed.

The amount that runs off depends on the land characteristics. In undeveloped forest areas like the Kennebec Highlands, or in areas such as the Belgrade Esker with very porous soils, infiltration is high and very little runs off. In steep rocky areas or in developed areas with lots of

impervious surfaces such as roofs or pavement, less infiltrates and more runs quickly down the hill, perhaps in a roadside ditch that dumps to a small stream to a larger one and then to the Belgrade Lakes. As the water flows across the surface of the land, it picks up dirt and other pollutants such as oil and grease from the roads. In most cases, those pollutants eventually end up in the lake. In future columns we will talk about ways of maximizing the use of some of Mother Nature's cleansing processes in order to minimize polluted runoff.

Some water bodies have very large watersheds- the Mississippi River Watershed comprises approximately half the area of the continental United States and includes many large subwatersheds such as the Ohio and Missouri Rivers. The Belgrade Lakes Watershed is approximately 180 square miles with portions of 13 different municipalities in three different counties and contains the subwatersheds of East Pond, North Pond, Salmon Lake, McGrath Long Pond, Messalonskee Lake. The Belgrade Watershed in turn is a subwatershed of the Lower Kennebec River Watershed (USGS Hydrologic Unit Code 01030002). This illustrates

another important point about watersheds- they are determined entirely by Mother Nature's boundaries when she laid down the topography, not by Man's artificial municipal boundaries. This means that many different political groups need to cooperate to control the land use within a watershed.

The bottom line- everyone lives in a watershed and the water quality of the downstream watersheds is determined by the water quality upstream. For example, over half the water entering Long Pond comes over the Belgrade Lakes Dam from Great Pond. And how we live on the land determines the quality of the water that drains from our watershed. We will talk more about that in future columns.

If you are not yet a member of the BRCA or one of our lake associations, please consider joining to help protect water quality. If you are in Belgrade Lakes Village, please stop by the BRCA Office and introduce yourself. We are in the same building as the Post Office, across the street from Day's Store. We have a lot of good information about the natural resources of this region, including maps of the nearby hiking trails, surveys of the lakes, and in depth informational brochures about some of the topics that will be covered in this column.

# If you live in or spend time in Kennebec County and enjoy the numerous lakes, ponds and streams and abundant natural resources here, you are in a very good place. This part of Central Maine is blessed with 52,000 acres of water or nearly 10% of Kennebec County's 553,000 acres. These highly valued waterbodies make a significant contribution to Kennebec's quality of life, economy and property values.

There isn't another county in Maine with as many groups working closely together on water quality issues as Kennebec. Lake Associations, Watershed Districts, Conservation Associations, Friends Groups, the Soil & Water Conservation District are all working to protect and improve water quality for all to enjoy. Descriptions of some of these organizations with contact information are included on page 7. All of these organizations are resources for the public to use and can be contacted for further information.

Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed – The Friend's mission is to protect and improve the 28 lakes and streams of the Cobbossee Watershed. This is done by promoting awareness of water quality issues, educating the public about water quality, enlisting citizen, community and municipal involvement, and conducting varied pro-

grams and projects to achieve these goals. Work is focused on two important issues: Limiting Non-Point-Source Pollution and educating about invasive aquatic plants.

Cobbossee Watershed District – CWD provides the scientific expertise within the greater Cobbossee watershed. They provide water quality monitoring and other technical expertise. Kennebec County Soil & Water Conservation District – The District works to protect and enhance Maine's soil and water resources by providing educational programs, conservation information and technical assistance to municipalities, schools, landowners and residents of Kennebec County. Services provided by the district include implementation of water quality grant funds, permitting assistance, GIS mapping, third party inspection, Phase I environmental site assessment, education, outreach and regional planning.

Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance – BRCA conserves the lands, water quality, and natural heritage of the Belgrade Lakes Watershed. BRCA serves as both a land trust and a lake trust. The land trust includes land preservation through land acquisition and stewardship. The lake trust includes an invasive aquatics program, a Conservation Corps program, and a Watershed

program.

China Region Lakes Alliance – This regional group represents the 4 lakes that make up the alliance. to preserve and protect the water quality of area lakes through education and erosion control work.

Conservation Lake Associations and Commissions – Many towns in Kennebec County have a conservation commission or similar group that may be part of the municipal government. These groups may provide education and outreach or may partner with other groups listed here to help deliver conservation projects in their town. Most lakes in Kennebec County have some kind of lake association or group formed to help protect the resource. Some are formal associations with significant financial resources while others are less formal and provide residents a place to express concerns or issues that may come up.

Partnerships among these groups have been on the rise over the past few years. People have learned that more success can be attained and in some cases, more money can be garnered by working together.





## The Small Garden Guide -

## ...the first week in June:

### Food for Thought

Zoning in: Before selecting and purchasing Kennebec County Conservation District advises, it is important to know whether or not they are likely to survive. The Kennebec "Plant Hardiness" zones are 4 and 5 with the average minimum temperatures ranging from -15 degrees to -20 degrees. Somerset County is mostly zone 4 with minimum temperatures from -20 to -25. For more advice about your specific area, talk to someone who gardens there, the Cooperative Extension, a local nursery, or a greenhouse. For a detailed map and more information on Plant Hardiness Zones of Maine, visit a gardening center, contact a Cooperative Extension office and ask for bulletin #2242, or visit www.umext.maine.edu/onlinepubs/

Seasonal timing: A wise guideline to planting seeds or purchasing plants is the length of the growing season - Maine's summer and also your own. Growing days are indicated on packages and on seedling markers, or can be obtained from vendors. Bear in mind that first fall frost, always unpredictable, and your personal busy schedule toward summer's end, more predictable because of school, work, leaving the area and other demands, and plan for harvesting that doesn't conflict.

CSA: Community Supported Agriculture is a great means to have fresh garden products. It is a subscription service where consumers sign up and pay growers in advance to receive vegetables or other farm products - meat, dairy - during the



summer. Some plans provide for a weekly share of whatever is in season; others allow the shareholders to choose produce and draw against their account. The farmer gets early season financial support and the shareholder gets fresh products and a weekly visit to a local farm. Some farms offer CSA work shares. ## Welcome to Another Fun Filled Summer Season

Dan Marquis from Wells, Maine caught his biggest pike to date on Saturday, May 15, 2010. Dan's been coming up to Belgrade for years and beat his personal best with a 20.30 pound pike. Congratulations!

ll of a sudden the spring season showed up here in Central Maine. It arrived almost a month early, then went away, then came back, then left . . . the saga seemed to never end. It's typical when you compare the seasonal changes to years past, but it felt odd because the good days were very, very good and the bad days were very, very bad. Unseasonable temperatures had anglers scratching their heads, but just about everyone was rejoicing when April temperatures pushed 70-degrees. There was a compromise though and it was a bitter pill for anglers -WIND! I'm not sure if they keep track of such things, but April and May 2010 seemed to be the windiest spring months I can recall in recent memory.

The early spring brought anglers out in droves and for the first time in years we were able to get the boats on the local lakes in time for April 1. That's pretty exciting when you consider the lakes are usually frozen for another 20+ days. The early fishing was a bit nippy but some fishermen caught trout and salmon. Northern pike fishermen reported slightly slower fishing but some big fish were caught. Most of the salmon were caught on either live or sewn smelts slowly trolled or drifted just below the surface of the lake. As the lake surface temperatures have warmed into the high 60's, fish have moved a bit

deeper and have already set up on bait in the 25-foot range as of May 30. Early in the year it was nice to see some decent salmon in the 2-3 pound range come from Long Pond. A few beauties were caught in the spillway near Day's Store and some were caught in the southern section off Green Island. Now that the water is warming up, streamer flies like Grey Ghost or Black Ghost and Jerry's Smelt are great patterns to run behind a small dodger either on a couple of colors of lead core or a downrigger.

A shocking tale! May 2nd started like any other morning – up at 4:00 a.m., get the boat ready and head to the boat launch. I put my boat in at 4:45 in Sidney and headed down to my camp on Snow Pond to pick up a couple of boys from Vermont. I know these guys well and I couldn't wait to take them pike fishing. We were hoping to hook into a couple of trophies, but I was more excited just to spend the day with the guys. They always make me laugh and the camaraderie in the boat makes for a special day regardless of the fishing. Well, about half way down the lake, just as the sun peaked over the trees by the music

At first the lake stayed calm, but then it started to rain and the wind kept picking up. Within about 5 minutes the storm was on top of me and the lake was covered in white caps. I pulled up to the dock, but it was so rough I didn't want to pull in and bang up my boat on the dock, so I yelled to the boys to go back inside and I'd ride the storm out on the lake. It took about 10 minutes or so until the weather changed again only this time it switched from rain too hail! It was coming down I buckets and the entire boat filled with ice – which was pretty cool to be honest. I've never experienced anything like it. I decided to run for cover and put the boat on the dock and sprinted into the camp to the laughter of the guys. They busted me pretty good as the meat of the storm hit with a vengeance, bringing lighting and thunder that rocked the pine around the cottage. When the storm cleared we shoveled the ice out of the boat and got ready to go fishing. Funny thing was, my voltage meter in the boat was reading 2.5 instead of about 14 volts when the engine was on. Turns out, my boat was hit by lighting! The "mother board" in the 115 Yamaha was cooked along with all the connections to the batteries. The motor would start, but it wasn't able to recharge. The same thing with my trolling motor and the 24-volt charging system. Every fuse was blown and every connection had been sizzled. I am so glad I ran for it and got inside before the lightning hit. That was a storm I'll never forget and a good reminder for us all to get off the lake when the storms hit!

Facebook - For the last few years lots of people have been e-mailing and calling asking questions about the fishing, water temperatures, if the ice is out, what's the hot bait, etc, etc. So this year I created a Facebook page for all of us to share stories, pictures, etc. You can look it up under Maine Wilderness Tours and join in the discussion. Hopefully everyone will post pictures of their catch and tell some Belgrade fishing stories too. See you on the lake!


