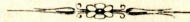

IN GENERAL

The fall term of school opened Monday, September 14, for a term of 14 weeks, closing Friday, December 18 for a two weeks vacation. The winter term opened Monday, January 4, 1937, for a term of 10 weeks. Your committee expects the spring term to open Monday, April 5, 1937, for a term of 10 weeks.

A public notice was posted in conspicuous places asking for bids to convey the Center and South school pupils to the North school for the year which opens in September and closes in June. As there was only one sealed bid it was opened at the August meeting. Walter Greenleaf signed a contract to convey these pupils to the North School for one year at \$18.00 per week.

The State Bureau of Health and Child Welfare have requested the town to appropriate an amount for health inspection in the school.

Influenza is this winter attacking the whole country. It is much the same as a common cold, except that it strikes more quickly, and gives a greater prostration. What is the flu? It starts without any warning. Its symptoms are: A general tired feeling, severe headaches, fever usually above 100 degrees, no desire for food, general pain in the muscles, back and limbs. Influenza is an infectious and contagious disease. Contagious diseases are spread by the disease germs going from someone who has the disease to someone who does not have the disease. It is dangerous to use the same drinking glass. Fingers and food most easily carry the

disease germs. Be out in the open as much as you can. Sleep in well ventilated rooms. Wash the hands often and always before eating. We wish to prevent the spread of the disease. Don't forget to call the family doctor and care for the patient under his direction. Flu may be serious.

There was only one certificate of graduation given to the eighth grade last June.

The North School building was repaired during the summer vacation costing \$36.60.

Several School Committee meetings have been held during the year in the North School building. As you will note in this report, there is a fairly good sized unexpended balance.
