IN GENERAL

The fall term of school opened Monday, September 13, for a term of 14 weeks, for a two weeks vacation. The winter term opened Monday, January 3, 1938, for a term of 10 weeks. Your committee expects the spring term to open Monday, April 11, 1938, for a 10 weeks term.

We were fortunate in securing Miss Helen Hinds to teach the spring term, in place of Miss Lena Oliver, who resigned at the end of the winter term, 1937. Miss Oliver did very satisfactory work in the school. Miss Hinds was an excellent teacher, too. The school has done very well, both in discipline and progress, while Miss Phoebe Hilton has been the teacher. We trust Miss Hilton will not leave us for some time to come.

The parents were so well satisfied with Walter Greenleaf that he was engaged to convey the pupils this 1937-1938 year. He collects pupils from the extreme ends of the town.

Health inspection of pupils in Maine is an important feature in school work. The State Bureau of Health and Child Welfare has asked the town to appropriate an amount to continue the inspection already begun. Dr. DiPerri was engaged to visit the school in November, by a vote of the Superintending School Committee. This is a move in the right direction. Every town should have a school doctor and a school nurse.

There were two certificates of graduation to the eighth grade June, Robert Brackley and Horace Jones, Jr. There is no eighth grade this year.

The chimney was leaking so badly on the desks in the schoolroom (it's been repaired several times) that the Chairman, Mr. C. E. A. Cromwell, interviewed the other members of the School Committee, and all decided that a new chimney should be erected on the north end of the building. All danger of creosote and a chimney fire have been eliminated. These repairs were: Wiscasset Lumber Co. \$32.80, Ernest Colby \$25.00. This is much cheaper than the loss of the present building.

The School Committee meetings have been held at the homes of the lady members of Committee. There is a fairly good sized unexpended balance this year.

Warrant for Town Meeting

*To Luther Cromwell, a constable of the Town of Westport
in the County of Lincoln,*

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, A. D. 1938, at twelve o'clock noon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ART. 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the town officers, and the audit for the municipal year of 1936.

ART. 3—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town account of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor and Treasurer.

ART. 4—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor, and the repairs of highways, ferry, bridges and town buildings for the year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, State and County tax, and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

ART. 10—To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highway and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

ART. 11—To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads built within the past five years, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws 1931.

ART. 12—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 13—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class Highway, as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 260 of the Public Laws 1929, the least amount being \$195.00.

ART. 14—To see what action the town will take in regards to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highways, and raise money for same.

ART. 15—To see if the town will vote to pay to the State of Maine one-half of its excise tax, so that residents of the town may be privileged to use the Kennebec Bridge without the cost of toll.

ART. 16—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school nursing.

ART. 17—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a school doctor.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to raise \$200 as a special appropriation for repairs, for the Fowle's Point Road, so-called.

ART. 19—To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to set posts and purchase cable to be used in constructing a substantial railing on both sides of Thomas' Hill, so-called.

ART. 20—To see if the town will vote to sell the Old Ferryboat, so-called, to the highest bidder at the annual town meeting.

ART. 21—To see if the town will vote to raise \$200 to be used on the Junction Road, so-called, same to be used for ditching and resurfacing of this road.

ART. 22—To see if the town will vote to raise \$50 to be used on the Everett Greenleaf Road, so-called.

ART. 23—To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money necessary to purchase a four-horse Russell Grader.

ART. 24—To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of five dollars and thirty-two cents to be spent for Dental Hygienist Service in the Town of Westport under the direction of the State Bureau of Health. Such an appropriation is in accordance with Chapter 66, Section 79, of the Public Laws of 1931.

ART. 25—To see what sum of money the town will vote for school repairs.

ART. 26—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, on behalf of the town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.

ART. 27—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the piece of road made obsolete by the building of the State Aid Road over the land of J. J. E. Rothery and H. H. Carter.

ART. 28—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyards for the school and raise money for same.

ART. 29—To elect a Fire Inspector.

ART. 30—To see what action the town will take in regards to Fire Wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 31—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 32—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 33—To vote and act upon all other business which may legally come before the meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, at 11.30 a. m. for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.
