IN GENERAL

The fall term of school opened Monday Sept. 12th, 1938, for a term of 14 weeks. A vacation of two weeks to follow. The winter term opened Monday, Jan. 2nd, 1939, for a term of 10 weeks, which is in session at the present time. Miss Hilton resigned at the end of the spring term to secure a position nearer her home. Miss Hazel Vasso opened the fall term and stayed to teach until another teacher was elected to her position. Miss Ruth L. Rowe, a Farmington Normal School graduate, and having had seven years teaching experience, has done excellent work in the school. We wish the town will appropriate an amount large enough to hold Miss Rowe in the school another year. We hope to open the spring term Monday, April 10th, 1939, for a ten weeks term.

Walter Greanleaf was engaged to convey the pupils from the extreme ends of the town, south and north, His wages are \$18.00 per week. He is a careful driver, whereby the parents are well satisfied.

The State Bureau of Health and Child Welfare has asked the town to appropriate an amount to continue the inspection already started last November. Dr. Di-Perri of Wiscasset was engaged to visit in the fall. This is under the supervision of the Superintending School Committee. All of the towns in Union 48 should have a school doctor and a school nurse.

There is no eighth grade in the school this year. The advancement in the lower grades has been more pronounced this year, especially in reading. The town

pays the tuition of Elizabeth Richardson, Robert Brackley and Horace Jones, Jr., who attend Wiscasset Academy.

There is an unexpended account of \$45.82. The Resources exceeded the Expenditures to that amount.

The School Committee meetings have been harmonious. They have been held at the homes of the lady members.

Warrant for Town Meeting

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Monday, the thirteenth day of March, A. D. 1939, at twelve o'clock noon, and then and there to act on the following articles, namely:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose a Moderator for said meeting.

ART. 2—To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the town officers, and audit for the municipal year of 1937.

ART. 3—To attend to and act upon the report of the Superintendent of Schools, and town account of Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor and Treasurer.

ART. 4—To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 5—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools.

ART. 6—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor, repair of bridges, repair of highways and town building for the year ensuing.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay officers, interest, abatements and insurance for the year ensuing.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools for the year ensuing.

ART. 9—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow bills, State and County Tax, and contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

Art. 10—To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chap. 229, Public Laws of 1937.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money, if any, the town will recommend to take from the Joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads built within the past five years, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws 1931.

ART. 12—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 13—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class Highway, as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 260 of the Public Laws of 1929, the least amount being \$195.00.

ART. 14—To see what action the town will take in regard to cutting bushes on Third Class and State Aid Highways, and raise money for same.

ART. 15—To see if the town will vote to pay the State of Maine one-half of its excise tax, so that resi-

dents of the town may be privileged to use the Kennebec Bridge without cost of toll.

ART. 16—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school nursing.

ART. 17—To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise for a school doctor.

ART. 18—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 to be used for surfacing and ditching on the North End Road, beginning at the Eaton Farm and extending north to the end of the road.

ART. 19—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 to erect a Town Building on the town property at the Center to be used for the housing of all town implements.

ART. 20—To see if the town will vote to raise \$200. to be used to clean ditches and gravel the so-called Baker Road.

ART. 21—To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, and if so how much, to be used for repair and improve the conditions of the road leading to the Buckley cottage.

ART. 22—To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, and if so how much, to be used for repairs to the so-called Ida Greenleaf Road.

ART. 23—To see how much the town will charge for the rental and use of the Wiscasset-Westport Ferry, in which the Town has a one-half interest in common with Wiscasset under Chapter 149 of the 1937 Resolves.

ART. 24—To see if the town will vote to raise \$70.00 to be used to pay the audits of municipal years 1937-1938 and 1938-1939.

ART. 25—To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$8.00 for public health work in Westport, said sum to be expended by Bureau of Health, State Department of Health and Welfare, in cooperation with local authorities.

ART. 26—To authorize and empower -----
----- Town Treasurer and -----
successors in office, to sign, seal and execute in corporate name of the Inhabitants of Town of Westport by -----
----- or ----- successors as Treasurer of said Town, all deeds, assignments, leases and other conveyances of town lands or buildings, and to do all acts connected and incidental thereto, under the direction of the Board of Selectmen.

ART. 27—To ratify any and all acts in the signing, sealing, execution and delivery of deeds, assignments and other conveyances of town lands or buildings by -----
----- Town Treasurer, heretofore signed, sealed, executed and delivered in the corporate name of the Inhabitants of the Town of Westport ----- by -----
as Treasurer.

ART. 28—To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of five dollars and thirty-two cents to be spent for Dental Hygienist Service in the Town of Westport under the direction of the State Bureau of Health. Such an appropriation is in accordance with Chapter 66, Section 79, of the Public Laws of 1931.

ART. 29—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 annually for five years, the same to be applied to the amount already assured by individual real estate owners, for the purpose of having electric lights installed in the Town of Westport.

ART. 30—To see what action the town will take in regards to flags and halyards for the school and raise money for same.

ART. 31—To elect a Fire Inspector.

ART. 32—To see what action the town will take in regards to Fire Wardens for the year ensuing.

ART. 33—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire, in anticipation of taxes, such sums of money as may be necessary for the year ensuing.

ART. 34—To see what action the town will take in regards to rent and janitor service of Town Hall.

ART. 35—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 to be used on the so-called North End Road, beginning at the corner at the store of Archie Higgins and extending in a northerly direction.

ART. 36—To vote and act upon all other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall on Monday, the thirteenth day of March, at 11.00 a. m. for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.
