



Watershed Wisdom

Two weeks ago we talked a bit about "alien invaders" from foreign (to our watershed) ecosystems. Two days after that article appeared, one of BRCA's Courtesy Boat Inspectors (CBI), Kerry Schlosser, made our first "Save" of the season. She removed a substantial fragment of Eurasian water milfoil, from a Massachusetts-registered boat that was getting ready to launch into Great Pond after being used the previous day in the Connecticut River in CT, which is heavily infested. Congratulations to Kerry for doing a thorough inspection and preventing a potential disaster. A study done a few years ago by Eiswerth et al. estimated the economic impact of a Eurasian water milfoil infestation on recreation at 30 to 45 million dollars annually per watershed.

Of Maine's 6000+ lakes and ponds, 32 (unfortunately up by two from last year) are known to be infested with invasive plants, including Eurasian and variable leaf milfoil, curly-leaved pondweed, European naiad, and hydrilla. That this is a relatively small number, is a tribute to Maine's strong "Milfoil Law" and the small army of paid and volunteer courtesy boat inspectors that man public boat launches in order to help boaters learn about the dangers of invasive plants and how to inspect their boat before launch and after recovery.

Maine's "Milfoil Law" (LD1812) was enacted in 2001 and makes it illegal to transport any aquatic plant or plant fragment, invasive or not, on the outside of a vehicle, boat, trailer, or other equipment. It requires all motorized boats used in freshwater to display a lake and river protection sticker that costs \$10 for residents and \$20 for nonresidents. This sticker is now part of the regular registration for Maine residents and no longer a separate sticker. There are substantial fines for noncompliance with this law- up to \$250 for failure to display the sticker, \$500 for transporting any plant fragment (\$2500 for repeat offenders), and up to \$5000 for transporting an invasive plant. Funds raised from sticker sales are used for outreach and education programs and to help pay for courtesy boat inspection (CBI) programs.

The Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance (BRCA) administers one of the largest CBI programs in the state on behalf of our local lake associations. Every summer, we work with the Lakes

More Aliens and UFOs

Environmental Association (LEA), the Maine Congress of Lake Associations (COLA) and DEP to train our team of paid and volunteer CBI's that man (and woman) up all se ven of the public boat launches in the Belgrade Lakes and at most of the sporting camps with private ramps. Last year these trained inspectors inspected over 10,000 boats between Memorial Day and Labor Day and prevented invasive plants from entering the Belgrades four times (and leaving Messalonskee at least 10 times). More importantly, they helped to educate over 10,000 boaters about the importance of inspecting their own boat whether there is an inspector there or not.

While plants are the most visible of the aquatic hitchhikers, there are numerous other Unwanted Floating Organisms (UFOs) that our inspectors are looking for and trying to keep out of our lakes. In addition to invasive fish such as northern pike and walleyes, other potential aquatic invaders include Quagga mussels, Zebra mussels, Chinese Mystery Snails, Rusty crayfish, and a particularly pernicious diatom called Didymo, more commonly called, "rock snot." While Quagga and Zebra mussels, have not yet been found in Maine, they are common in the Great Lakes and are spreading out from there. Last year, Laurel Lake in western Massachusetts became infested. If your boat is coming from these waters, it should be thoroughly washed and inspected (including the live well) before launching in Maine waters. Chinese mystery snails are present in Maine, including in the Messalonskee Stream near where it enters the Kennebec River. They are larger (about the size of a golf ball) than any native Maine snails and you should thoroughly inspect all surfaces of your boat if you are in these waters. If you detect mystery snails, please contact the Center for Invasive Aquatic Plants (CIAP) of the Maine Lake Volunteer Monitoring Program

(VLMP) at mciap@mainevlmp.org to report your find. They are trying to document its spread in Maine. If you catch a walleye, please keep it, kill it, and call our local fisheries biologist, Bobby VanRiper at 547-5314.

Rusty crayfish are already established in the Belgrades in Great Pond. These crayfish, native to the Ohio River Valley, can be more aggressive than the native Maine crayfish and can displace them from their habitat. So far, this pest has not been that successful here, perhaps due to our aggressive smallmouth bass population, but it needs to be monitored. Both the University of Maine and the Maine VLMP are continuing to monitor the spread of Rusty crayfish in this area. It is thought that these invaders were brought in by an out of state fisherman who brought live bait with him. Fishermen should be aware that is illegal to bring live bait into Maine from out of state and it is illegal to release unused live bait into Maine waters whatever the source. Live bait should only be purchased from licensed Maine bait dealers who are only allowed to sell native, non-invasive species.

Rock snot is not yet present in Maine but it is present in Vermont in the upper Connecticut River. This organism forms dense mats on the bottom and looks like what you think based on its common name. It can be spread by anglers, especially those who wade in felt soled boots. Any time you move between waterbodies, to prevent inadvertent spread of UFOs, you should thoroughly wash and dry your equipment before fishing in new waters.

Tadpole Patrol with the Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed



Since 2004, over 850 children have participated in one or more levels of a Tadpole Patrol session

The Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed's popular summertime program, Tadpole Patrol, returns this summer aboard the OTTER II, the Friend's 22' pontoon boat and "floating classroom". Now with three integrated levels, children in grades 2- 12 have the opportunity to experience interactive, hands-on, FUN activities that focus on watershed protection and water quality.

Tadpole Patrol (*Level 1*) is for children entering grades 2-3-4 and allows participants to experience the ecology of the lake firsthand through exploration, wildlife observation (eagles, fish and zooplankton), and learning the basics of water testing by using professional equipment. Attendees will earn a Tadpole Patrol badge, t-shirt and prize grab bag. Each session can accommodate up to (12) children.

TP Patrol II-LSI! (Level 2) is for children entering grades 4-5-6 and is geared for older children or those who have already attended Tadpole Patrol. Activities are more science-based, with participants performing water quality tests and recording data in their own keepsake LSI Journal. Wildlife species are observed and recorded – using binoculars above the water and an underwater camera to 'spy' on aquatic life living beneath the surface. Participants will also learn about and begin to identify native and invasive aquatic plants. Attendees receive a Friend's waterproof knapsack in which to keep their LSI Journal and other items dry. Each "class" can accommodate up to (8) children.

TP3 - Jr. Lake Monitors (*Level 3*) is new for 2010 and offered for youth entering grades 6 & up. Participants will be trained in proper water quality data measurement techniques; conduct precise measurements themselves; and then

compare and analyze their results to data recorded by the Cobbossee Watershed District over the past 30+ years. Results will be posted on the Friends website for others to observe. Pre-requisite of TPII-LSI! is required. Participants will receive a certificate of achievement and a Friends calculator/ruler. Each session can accommodate up to (8) young adults.

Conservation Too **-**

Thy not lead?

- Lead has been known for centuries to be toxic to humans and wildlife alike.
- Angling and other outdoor sports deposit thousands of tons of lead into the environment each year.
- Lead ingestion is a death sentence for Maine's loons, other water birds, and even birds of prey, such as bald eagles, that may feed on these water birds. Loons and other waterfowl forage the bottom of lakes for gravel, which enables their gizzards to break down fish bones. Lead sinkers and jigs are ingested incidentally when they are foraging for gravel. Birds may also ingest lead when feeding on fish that are attached to lead fishing gear. Lead poisoning is the number one cause of death of adult loons.
- Children are particularly susceptible to lead absorption. Children handling lead sinkers and jigs are at risk of lead poisoning.

But didn't the state already solve this problem?

The issue of lead is still a problem for wildlife and water quality. Though the state banned the sale of lead sinkers less than one half ounce in 2002, lead poisoning continues to be a widespread issue on Maine's lakes. All lead-based tackle is still legal for fishermen to use and leadheaded jigs are currently still legal to sell and use. This means that we continue to dump an unacceptable amount of lead into our lakes each year. When sinkers and jigs are lost by anglers, these items settle on the bottom of the lake. They do not dissolve.

Over the past five years, a number of sick loons from the Belgrade lakes have been taken to a bird rehabilitation center where they died of lead poisoning. More dead loons have been collected from the Belgrade lakes and sent to Tufts

University where necropsies have revealed ingested lead tackle. Just one small sinker or jig head is enough to kill an adult loon. The symptoms of lead poisoning are severe and fast, and generally by the time a loon appears sick, it is too late to reverse the process. Reported cases of lead poisoning do not begin to tell the whole story, however, since often sick loons will isolate themselves or be taken by predators, meaning that a high percentage of lead poisoned loons will never be found.

The good news is that there are many nontoxic alternatives to lead fishing tackle, including those made of natural rocks, tin, tungsten, steel, bismuth and more.

There's a new online market in Franklin County, and although it doesn't offer that one-on-one and hands-on shopping of Farmers' Markets with all their tempting sights, smells and conversation, the



benefits of putting local producers and consumers together are many: 24-hour availability, reduced travel time, shopping consolidation, member bios and photos, a specific ordering format, an email confirmation system, room for notes, and other useful information (for example, one farmer in the northern part of the county will deliver to customers).

Even without ordering from the Western Maine Market their website is a great visit. The photos are inspiring, the farm bios interesting, the product coverage extensive, and the ordering set-up very efficient. Member farms cover a wide geographic area - Jay, Stratton, Leeds, Freeman Ridge, Farmington, Fairfield, New Sharon, Industry are a few examples of locations.

The site in Franklin County is modeled after a venture in Plymouth, New Hampshire, it has over a dozen farmers to date, is open and updated continuously, and productwise is very com-

Belgrade Smallmouth Bass is Insane!

or the last couple of weeks, the local lakes have been teeming with happy fishermen and it's all due to a little red eyed, bronze backed beauty! Every year the bass fishing is a little different, each lake produces in different ways and some local ponds fish better than others. Well, this year it seems every lake in the Belgrade chain is fishing really well and anglers are rejoicing in the spirit of the catch. ((There are a lot of reasons why the lakes here offer such great fishing for smallies. For starters, the local waters are full of crayfish which is a favorite forage for bass. Then there is the wide variety of baitfish including alewives, shiners, smelts, sunfish, etc. Finally, there's all that excellent structure where bass can hide! Add it all up and you have a bass haven that's perfect for growing big fish.

One really neat observation during the last few days of fishing on Great Pond, Long Pond and East Pond is that we are still catching bigger bass and post spawn females in wicked shallow water. It's not really unusual to catch big bass early in the morning or late in the evening in the shallows, but we were even catching them during the heat of the day (and we've had some really HOT days lately).


Generally speaking, I think of bigger smallies moving off shore and stacking up around sunken humps and rock piles to eat crayfish or moving way out and suspending over deep water to feed on alewives and other bait fish. Of course it goes without saying that when fish are shallow, they are much easier to catch because you don't have to cover as much water. This is also a huge bonus if you are a fly fisherman and enjoy catching smallies on a fly rod. Personally, I think this is a hoot and am surprised that more fly fishermen don't take advantage of this awesome sport. On a normal year, the best time to fly fish for bass is when they are on their beds, but this year fly casters can enjoy really terrific fishing all day long without having to cast heavy sinking lines.

Lure selection is always challenging when it comes to consistently catching smallmouth bass. Because the fish is generally quite aggressive by nature, they will hit a variety of baits and lures. However, their aggressiveness can cause confusion amongst anglers because you can catch one or two fish on one lure and a few more on a different style bait, making it difficult to pattern the fish. For example traditional tube jigs and the popular Gitzit

are always great choices for smallies. However, during the last three days of fishing, we did not catch a single bass on a tube! That's amazing. Basically, we narrowed the lure choices down to small plastic baits in black/blue and watermelon and stick baits like a silver/black Rapala. Gary Alter (shown in the picture) has been fishing smallmouth bass longer than I have been alive and he offered up a great tip when fishing Rapala's. Everyone who fishes these lures will attest to the fact they twist your line something fierce. You can use a swivel, but you don't get the same action, and even if you use a Rapala knot, you will still experience line twist. Gary had a very simple observation/solution...simply keep your bait in the water until you are ready to make your next cast. The line twist caused by Rapala's generally takes place when you remove the lure from the water and look for your next casting location. Simply by leaving the bait in the water until it's time to cast will dramatically reduce line twist. Good luck this week!




