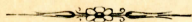

Miss Ruth L. Rowe, a Farmington Normal School graduate, and having had eight years teaching experience, did excellent work in the school. Her wages were \$15.00 a week. Miss Priscilla Mills has all the energy and enthusiasm of an experienced teacher. Miss Mills has done good work in this school, she is a real teacher. Wages \$15.00 a week.

Walter E. Greenleaf was engaged to convey the pupils from the extreme ends of the town, north and south. His wages were \$18.00 a week. While the Harisons were in town he was to have \$1.50 per week extra. He was a careful driver, whereby the parents were well satisfied. He resigned at the end of the fall term, in favor of his father, Fred I. Greenleaf. \$18.00 a week.

The State Bureau of Health and Child Welfare has asked the town to appropriate an amount for inspection started last November. All of the towns in Union 48 should have a school doctor and a school nurse.

There is only one girl in the eighth, Mary Jane Greenleaf. The advancement in the grades has been more pronounced this year, especially in reading. The town pays the tuition of Elizabeth Richardson, Horace Jones, Jr. and Robert Brackley, who attend Wiscasset Academy.

There is an overdrawn account of \$44.93. The expenditures exceeded the resources to that amount.

The School Committee meetings have been harmonious. They have been held at the homes of the lady members.
