


Mid Summer Celebration Sampler

First, Aquafest: it's the biannual fundraiser for the Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance, which maintains a variety of programs to protect and improve water quality. Aquafest will take place on Friday and Saturday, July 9 and 10 with activities on and near the water, from a \$100 a plate dinner at The Village Inn featuring guest speaker Ernest Thompson, author of "On Golden Pond," on Friday night to a free outdoor showing of the movie "On Golden Pond" in back of Day's Store near Long Pond on Saturday night. This is the 30th Anniversary of the legendary movie that was written about the Belgrades and special signed commemorative posters will be on sale.

Movies, too, will take over Waterville at the 13th Annual Maine International Film Festival, July 9-18. One hundred films and fifty filmmakers will be part of this 10-day immersion from Elia Kazan's 1960 American masterpiece "Wild River" restored by Martin Scorsese's Film Foundation to the Serbian filmmaker Miodrag Kolaric's "Finding Belgrade," documentary on the five Belgrades of the world, filmed here last winter.

Along with appearances of guest celebrities, award ceremonies and special entertainment at The Maine International Film Festival, Waterville has scheduled its 41st Annual Sidewalk Art Show on Saturday, July 17 to coincide with MIFF.

Commemorating the region's unique Franco-American heritage, Le Festival de la Bastille will be held in Augusta Friday through Sunday, July 9-11. A daily entertainment schedule of new Canadian, Cajun and old French favorites will bring many well known bands to Augusta, including local favorites the Pineland Fiddlers led by Ellen Gawler of Belgrade on Saturday at noon.

In Belgrade Lakes, the Gawler Family will perform Friday, July 9 at the Center for All Seasons to help raise funds for the Belgrade Public Library. A second fundraiser - a Golf Tournament at the Belgrade Lakes Golf Course - will be held Thursday, July 15.






Legacies

"Mahogany!" Little kids on Great Pond learned the big word even before they could handle a paddle. That's about all there was for size and speed on the lake in the fifties where double-ended guideboats, canoes, rowboats and sailboats set the pace. A mahogany speedboat crossing the cove, presumably on the way to the Village, was news. This was after the steamers disappeared and before the public boat ramp opened, the era when Ernest Thompson was a small child and the impressions for creating "On Golden Pond" were being formed.

According to a feature article on "The Boats of Hollywood," written in 1995 by Lois Fecteau for Soundings, the Nation's Boating Newspaper[®],

"On Golden Pond" was one of the best movies of all time to capture the romance of boating. In it she interviews professional boat coordinator of "On Golden Pond" (and many other top-billing films), Pat Curtin who points out that in addition to its Oscar-winning stars (Katharine Hepburn and Henry Fonda) "On Golden Pond" features some "wonderful gunkholing scenes" that did great things for Chris Craft (the manufacturer) and for mahogany speedboats in general.

The article also details several technical inaccuracies regarding the boats, but here on the real Golden Pond, and wherever these beautiful boats are sighted, all is forgiven. Mahogany speedboats are almost sacred, inspiration for those who maintain them and a thrill for those who view them. And, yes, they do capture the romance of boating.



Summertime in the Belgrades

Watershed Wisdom

aine has a strong Shoreland Zoning Act that Lemphasizes protecting the integrity of the vegetation within 100 ft of a Great Pond. The rules are a bit complicated and often violated. There have been some serious violations in the news lately including one in Naples, ME, where the Town is seeking fines in excess of \$700,000. Closer to home, cases have recently occurred on Great Pond (Belgrade and Rome) and Salmon Lake. Belgrade is using penalties received to fund the new "Water Quality Improvement Fund" authorized by the voters at the last Town Meeting. In these cases the violator usually argues, "It's just a tree! I'll plant new ones." Unfortunately it takes decades to replace a mature tree. And a tree is more than just a piece of standing wood with leaves on it. It is actually a remarkable stormwater control system that is better described as the Transpiring, Recyclable, Energy Efficient Stormwater System, or TREES for short. This key component of Mother Nature's basic watershed design is a wonder of efficiency, and coupled with vegetated wetland buffers, does an outstanding job of protecting the water quality of lakes and streams.

As anyone who has ever taken shelter under a tree during a rainstorm knows, trees do a great job of protecting the land under them. When the large raindrops hit the vegetation, they are broken up into many little droplets that continue to fall towards the ground, breaking up into ever smaller droplets as they hit more layers of vegetation, a process engineers would call "energy dissipation." The large surface area of the leaves and small branches becomes coated with water that never reaches the ground, a process hydrologists call "interception." The water that continues to fall to the ground ends up as a fine mist, or slowly moving drops that drip off the lower parts of the tree. This moisture falls gently onto a thick spongy "duff layer" of decomposing leaves and pine needles that comprises the forest floor, soaking in slowly. As the runoff filters slowly through the forest floor, it continues to soak into the sediments below where it enters the groundwater table. A substantial portion is taken up through the roots of the plants and transpires directly back to atmosphere via evapotranspiration from the leaves. Except in very large rain events, very little stormwater actually runs off from a

forest.

Contrast this with rain that falls on a plowed field, paved surface, or a dusty camp road. The raindrop hits the ground at high speed, with enough kinetic energy to erode the surface of the soil and splatter up muddy water. This water begins to puddle up and move down the hill, carrying dirt, manure, or other pollutants such as oil or grease along with it. If the surface topography is steep, the stormwater gains momentum and continues to erode, picking up an even higher pollutant load. Typically the stormwater from these developed areas is routed rapidly through ditches and pipes directly to the nearest stream, river, or lake. The turbulent motion generates kinetic energy that allows the flowing water to carry a large load of suspended sediments. When the polluted water eventually reaches a large pond or lake, the velocity will slow and the suspended sediment will settle out. The coarser sediments settle rapidly near the shore forming a delta near the inlet (check out the north end of Long Pond where Rt 27 drains into the lake at Tracy Cove) but the finer sediments (and attached pollutants) move out into the lake, creating turbidity, or cloudiness. These fine sediments settle very slowly, spreading pollutants and nutrients such as phosphorus to the deepest portions of the lake.


Under Mother Nature's system, thanks to the trees and surrounding vegetation, there is much less water flowing across the land surface towards the water. This water continues to be slowed and filtered by vegetation and rarely develops enough momentum cause

erosion or carry a heavy sediment load. As the flowing water approaches a stream or lake, it typically flows into a heavily vegetated wetland buffer that acts as a large sponge to absorb the water and further slow the flows, allowing suspended sediments to settle. Some of the fine sediments adhere to the surface of the plant stems in the water column, a process known as "adsorption." The end result is that the water finally reaching the lake is clean and clear.

Another important and often overlooked advantage to Mother Nature's system is that much of the water entering the lake or feeder streams comes not over the surface of the land, but infiltrated through the ground. This not only filters and cleans the water but also chills it to the groundwater temperature, which around here is about 50° F (10° C). Contrast this to water running off a hot asphalt road or parking lot in the summertime, which can easily exceed 80° F. The cooler water is much healthier for the lake, enabling higher dissolved oxygen levels and much happier fish, especially trout and salmon.

So, how do we protect our watershed and maintain high water quality? One way is to protect as much forested land as possible within the watershed. This is one of the main drivers for BRCA's land conservation programs, especially the Kennebec Highlands Project, to which we are currently trying to add over 1000 acres. Please visit our web site at www.belgradelakes.org to see how you can help. On land that is developed, the answer is to mimic Mother Nature's system as much as possible in handling the stormwater runoff. More on that in future columns.

Summertime in the Belgrades

Part 2 of the 'Buffer Story'

by Dale Finseth

Conservation Too -

few weeks ago we discussed how landowners **A**may use buffers to control runoff into waterways and filter that water to remove sediment and chemicals. One of the issues that came to light is the fact that different people have different definitions or standards for the term "buffer".

Water runoff can cause severe erosion and carry some pretty unhealthy "stuff" into our waterways. A buffer's job, as the name implies is to come between that water runoff and the waterbody we wish to protect. The term for such a buffer when located near the water's edge is a riparian buffer. It is located in the riparian zone. For most of us landowners, that means some sort of buffer planting between our buildings, driveways, patios or lawns and the waterway into which the water runs.

If you talk to a forester or a farmer with large fields they may refer to buffers more than 100 feet wide used to treat large volumes of water runoff from bare soil areas -- Conditions that might occur right after a wood harvest or plowing a field. Someone with commercial property may be required to create a buffer to collect and treat stormwater runoff coming from buildings and parking areas on their property. State or local regulations may apply to their definition of a buffer.

The average homeowner or camp owner has a different set of criteria. While they may be required to design and build a specific buffer because or State or local permits, most simply want to decrease the impact of their land use on the lake or stream's water quality. Bravo to those folks' motivation! Most will focus on a riparian buffer since it will be located fairly close to the water's edge.

The better buffer is one that is designed and constructed to replicate the natural buffer that may still exist near your property. A Natural Buffer demands the least maintenance and can be very effective. Depending upon how you use your own property, a Natural Buffer may have some limitations. Ideally a riparian buffer is made up of five tiers: the canopy, shrub, under-story, ground cover and, last but not least, the duff.

*Canopy – The larger trees that break up the impact of wind and rain. These are long lived trees which will shade your yard for decades. If you don't already have them, they take years to grow.

*Shrubs - These are taller plants or 'short trees'. They also break up wind and rain and can add color and privacy to an area. Their mid-level root zone helps stabilize the soil and soak up runoff.

*Under-Story - These are shorter plants helping to

thicken the vegetative cover over the soil. It might include colorful short shrubs adding interest that will grow in the shade of the canopy.

*Ground Cover - These are low growing plants and vines that help slow down water flow and can add color and surface roots to help limit erosion.

*Duff - The 'duff layer' is the accumulation of leaves, needles and other plant matter on the forest floor. It absorbs water, traps sediment and prevents erosion. It's micro-organisms break down plant material and recycle nutrients.

Now that you know more about the 'duff' our next article will begin to talk about how to create buffers on your property. Start thinking about your site: Is it steep or flat? What are the soil conditions? How much sun is available? Just as important: "How do you use the property?" Is your footprint pretty light on the land or do you regularly host large groups? Do you use the water's edge heavily for boating or swimming? You need to answer these questions to best design an effective buffer. Remember... the objective is to use the buffer to minimize your impact on water quality.



Deep Water Fishing and Hungry Ducks by Mike Guarino

Deep underwater structure is home to a variety of fish species.

ne of the most alluring aspects to the Belgrade Lakes is the wide variety of fish that swim in our waters (some would argue that there's actually a few too many species swimming around here, but that's another topic for another day). With all the different fish calling Belgrade Lakes home, they obviously live in a wide variety of places or key on different structure at different times of year. However, during late June and early July, anglers can catch a great variety of fish on deep water humps and ledges. The obvious fish that angler's pursue this time of year is the smallmouth bass. But fishermen can catch everything from brown trout to white perch to crappie on the same structure. And of course anglers are often surprised to find the bigger northern pike on or around ledges during this time of year too. By using your sonar unit you can easily locate the humps that are holding fish and if you slowly drift or troll live bait over that structure you'd be amazed at what's living down there. One of the best tackle options for investigating sunken structure is a worm & spinner harness. I usually purchase mine from that little tackle company called Cabelas. They make a variety of worm harnesses in a number of colors and sizes. Personally, I prefer fluorescent orange or copper blades. Simply rig them on a 3-way swivel with enough weight to hold bottom and troll or drift until you find fish. On one of the ledges off the west side of Hoyts Island we caught white perch, smallmouth bass, a small brown trout and a

northern pike all on the same structure during one drift! The fishing was really good that day though, and it was fun catching such a wide variety of fish in the same spot

Crazy Belgrade Ducks

We have a problem here in the Belgrades and it's starting to get serious. Some fishermen know what I'm talking about too. We have some crazy ducks around here and they are mooching all our food. It's unacceptable duck behavior! Last week we were fishing over on Great Pond and there are two mallards floating alongside one of the beautiful islands that dot the lake. So my friend Joe who resides in Philly decides to open his bag of chips that Candee at Whisperwood Lodge had packed for him. Well, as soon as he crinkled the bag, the ducks took off and started buzzing the boat – quacking at us the entire time. At one point I thought the female was going to land right in the boat, which is the last thing I need during a fishing trip. How am I supposed to fish with this crazy duck waddling around in my boat? So, I spook the duck back up in the air and she and her boyfriend land in the water and slide on in to harass Joe into parting with a good sized portion of his chips! Keep in mind that this is not the first time an obnoxious (albeit hungry) duck has pestered me this year. On Long Pond while trolling for salmon just after ice out, I had four ducks follow me all around the lake until I ran out of Cheese-It's. As soon as I tipped the box upside down to indicate it was empty, the little buggers picked up and flew away - like they knew the free lunch program was over. With that being said, I still enjoy feeding them whenever I have some bread or crackers around. It reminds me of my youth when we use to feed the ducks every day off our dock.


