Sidney Sep. 11th 1835.

In the fall of 1830, the land was broken up, & in the Spring following 5 Cords of Manure were spread upon it, & planted to Corn. In fall of 1831 2 Cords⁺ Manure were ploughed in & in the Spring sowed to Barley. In fall of 1832 was again ploughed, & sowed to Barley in the Spring following, & produced a Crop of 50⁺ Bushels without the use of any Manure except the above mentioned. The land was a mixture of sandy & Clay Loam. The Seed of the above crop was of B. Pawtelle's two rowed barley.
