WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To George W. Knight, a constable in the Town of Scarborough:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Scarborough, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town house in said Town of Scarborough on Monday the second (2nd) day of March A. D. 1908, at ten (10) o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles:

Art. 1st. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2nd. To choose a clerk, selectmen, assessors, overseers of the poor, collector, treasurer, one member of school board, superintendent of schools, road commissioner or commissioners, and all other necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 3rd. To see if the town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools, schoolhouse repairs and supplies, text books and appliances, the poor, repairs on roads and bridges and to defray all other town charges.

Art. 4th. To see if the town will accept and adopt the report of the several town officers.

Art. 5th. To see what compensation the town will vote its collector for the ensuing year.

Art. 6th. To see if the town will vote to maintain a free high school and raise a sum of money for same.

Art. 7th. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to meet the expense of breaking roads.

Art. 8th. To see if the town will vote to furnish a police officer for Prouts Neck and raise a sum of money for the payment of the same. By request.

Art. 9th. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and twenty-five (\$125) dollars to rebuild the fence around the town house lot and paint the town house. By request.

Art. 10th. To see what action the town will take in regard to wages paid for labor on highways and bridges per hour. By request.

Art. 11th. To see what action the town will take in regard to insuring schoolhouses. By request.

Art. 12th. To see if the town will vote to accept either of the two roads laid out by the selectmen leading to the clay pits so called and raise a sum of money for same, on petition of B. F. Wentworth and thirteen others in one case and Frank E. Larrabee and seven others in the other.

Art. 13th. To see if the town will vote to accept either of the two roads laid out by the selectmen from the Gorham road so called to land of Martin Anderson and raise money for same, on petition of N. P. Sorrison and ninety-three others in one case and C. Peter Nelson and six others in the other.

Art. 14th. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars to be expended on the marsh road so called at Spurwink leading from the house

of Milton M. Libby to the town line of Cape Elizabeth, on petition of C. C. Mitchell and fourteen others.

Art. 15th. To see if the town will vote yes or no upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907 relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1908.

Art. 16th. To see if the town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the Maine highways within the town such sum of money as is contemplated and directed by section 5 of Chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907 being the sum of \$141.

Art. 17th. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for decorating soldiers' graves.

Art. 18th. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on the southerly side of the Portland road, in Dunstan, so called, between the head of the Landing road and the old Blue Point road, and raise a sum of money for the same, on petition of H. M. Waterhouse and fifteen others.

Art. 19th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to widen the Turn Pike road. By request.

Art. 20th. To see if the town will vote to widen the Black Point road bed from a point near the residence of Frank E. Larrabee to a point near the residence of the late Oakes Perry, also to widen the bridge over Libby river which bridge is within the above described boundary and to raise a sum of money to complete the same. By request.

Art. 21st. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the Black Point road near the John Wiggin place so called which has been washed away by the action of the sea. By request.

Art. 22nd. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the destruction of the browntail moth.

Art. 23rd. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$300, to be expended on the Gorham road so called and drains between Oak Hill and the residence of C. P. Nelson. By request.

Art. 24th. To see if the town will instruct its collector to force payment of the poll and personal property tax on the same date as the real estate tax.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be at the Town house on Saturday, February 29th, 1908 from ten (10) o'clock a. m. until four (4) o'clock p. m. for the purpose of correcting the check list.

Several changes had to be made in the schools throughout the town during the year, in our corps of teachers. This has been a burden on your committee, as it is a difficult thing to procure a good teacher, in ungraded schools at the present; however we succeeded in filling the vacancies as they arose, with success in most cases. We were blessed with the good luck of having three of our former teachers return to the work, Miss Laura J. Roberts, Mrs. Carrie F. Leavitt and Mrs. Mabel Leslie.

My work has been such, it has been impossible for me to visits the various schools throughout the town, as often as I should like during the past year; but it is my best judgment from what I have seen, and what I can gather from the parents, in the various sections of the town that our school year, has been very successful in nearly every school.

It has been my earnest effort and also of the teachers, to lift our schools to the highest standard possible, and I can truly say that during the past three years the pupils have made a big advance, and to keep on in this line we must assist our teachers by furnishing each schoolroom with the proper appliances needed for instructing. Last spring we placed in each common school, maps which have been highly appreciated by all, and now we need globes, reference books etc. For as the little brain develops it must have something to feed upon.

The town's people have been very generous along this line in the past and I feel sure they will continue the cause.

We need to make no change in the common school books except to replace some old ones that are worn out.

The high school for the past year has been taught by Charles B. Lamb and assisted during the Fall and Winter by Reymond W. McKenney, although our school has not been as large as some years, they have done good honest work, and are full of interest in the work. This is shown by the regular attendance in part.

The new laboratory which was placed in our high school has been a great help in its work, and I wish to thank the town's people at this place for their assistance in this *one thing* (laboratory.)
