


Where Children and Veggies Grow



unday, July 25 is Open Farm Day across Maine, a unique and wonderful opportunity to enjoy scenic rural settings and to sample life on a working farm where children romp and smiles prevail and everyone pitches in to help with the hard, hard work...and gets to enjoy the rewards. Dozens of farms will greet visitors of all ages on July 25, including one very special place in Belgrade...

It's a hot day on Belgrade's Winterberry Farm but the breezes play across the 40 acres of livestock pastures and organic gardens and it's cool inside the 150-year-old barn where customers measure and weigh their




weekly generous CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) allotment... and invariably peek around the corner to see who's in the stalls. It might be Nestor, one of the farm's three working ponies, a duck who's waddled up from the pond to visit the laying hen flock, or - if they aren't out doing their job of rooting the fallow field - the pigs.

"This isn't just ours," says owner Mary Perry while encouraging visitors to look around. "We're like a community farm. I love to have people come and get their hands in the dirt." She also loves to have them wander down to the gardens, admire the calves and sheep, and let their children run and play.

What's it like to visit Winterberry Farm? Well, let's start at the attractive roadside stand which advertises "Pies! Pies! Pies!" and is full of much more in terms of baked, preserved and fresh garden goodies. Out back, toward the imposing, historic barn, past the rope swing that kids can't resist, and the frisky Australian Shepherds - Skip and Rosemary, and the trademark 1952 Ford truck, guests are halted by a garden devoted to banks of flowers which delightfully block the view.

But don't stop there...the view of fields, woods and, way in the distance, Great Pond

is amazing: a greenhouse bursting with heavily-laden tomato plants, a turkey pen, beehives, a pasture where sheep and cows and ponies graze, and beyond the vegetable gardens - long, straight rows of carefullytended plants, enough to feed 65 CSA shares, two apprentices, Mary and her three



In the meantime, a sign has been posted at the bridge identifying the stream as milfoil infested and requesting "Please Do Not Boat or Fish in this Stream Through September, 2010." A buoy with the same signage has been placed at the inlet of the stream into Great Pond. The posting is intended to discourage boat traffic and fishing, which could cause the milfoil to spread.

Belgrade Lakes Association (BLA), the Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance (BRCA), and the Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP)started working together to implement a plan of action to remove the milfoil and control its spread. The removal will be done by hand pulling by trained volunteers under a permit issued by the DEP. Additionally the BRCA has recently surveyed the remaining Salmon Lake shoreline and coves with no invasive plants noted. The volunteers conducting this survey are greatly appreciated. According to Pete Kallin, Executive Director of the BRCA, there have been some very impressive invasive plant "saves" in 2009 and 2010. Doug McCafferty of Whisperwood Camps on Salmon Immediately upon the identification, the Lake had two confirmed saves last year and one this year. Eurasian Milfoil, at the public boat landing on Great Pond. All of the boats in the above saves came from infested waterways in Connecticut and Massachusetts.

On Messalonskee Lake, which has officially struggled with the milfoil dilemma for a decade, invasives were intercepted going into the lake four times last year and ten times coming out.

Although the situation is far past the eradication stage, according to Mike Wiley, President of the Snow Pond/Messalonskee Lake Association, the lake association is "up to speed on managing it." In conjunction with the University of Maine at Farmington they will start laying benthic barriers this August and diver-assisted suction boats will be on the lake right after Labor Day.

"You've got to get your expectations right or it can overwhelm you," says Wiley.

Although he has been on Lake Messalonskee since 1958 Wiley, who is originally from Minnesota, says that every lake in southern Minnesota is like a garden.

Such comparisons provide a positive perspective on Maine's Milfoil initiative, on the preparedness in individual watersheds like the Belgrades where a rapid response for eradication is in place and where management practices are being implemented as a secondary plan of action.



his time of year we get a lot of visitors and long L time residents who come into the office and confess, "I love to get up in the morning and bathe in the lake. Is that OK?" I don't want to be a spoilsport but there are a lot of things that we used to do in our lakes that we have since learned were not all that good for water quality. And things that weren't that bad when one person did it are hundreds of times worse when hundreds of people do them. The following article, written by BRCA's longest serving board member (20 years!), Roy Bouchard, whose day job is Head of the Lakes Division for Maine DEP, originally appeared in BRCA's summer newsletter last year.

Bathing in the lake was a fun summer tradition that seemed totally harmless before we started to study water pollution. We now know using soap and shampoo is not an advisable activity, particularly when and where lots of other people are doing it.

While many soaps are biodegradable, that does not mean they are harmless. Even assuming there would be rapid dilution; the localized concentrations may be high at least briefly when there are multiple bathers in the same area, together or in succession. Many soaps contain surfactants which are important for cutting oils and similar substances and making them soluble so they wash off. These are often either toxic or challenging to life in the lake, especially microorganisms and invertebrates. Soaps may also alter the pH (acidity) of the water significantly in the vicinity of their use. Deodorant soaps and dandruff shampoos often contain heavy metals or other ingredients that are harmful when multiple people are using them in an area.

Many soap labels claim "no phosphorus" or "low phosphorus". Most soap, even "no phosphate" ones, contains some phosphorus. While several "green" products are indeed a lot better than the standard bathing soaps and shampoos in

this regard, the body oil and other grime washed off bathers' bodies, greatly aided by soaps with their surfactants, can contribute a lot of phosphorus to fresh waters.

In addition to phosphorus, body oils, and other pollutants, bathing in lakes can contribute bacteria and viruses at higher amounts than just swimming. While it may or may not be a heath issue in a given situation, do we really want to increase the bacteria numbers in lakes where others are swimming? And many people find the thought of swimming where others have been bathing unpleasant - it makes the lake seem more of a bathtub than a lake. So what to some may seem an innocuous activity in reality is one of the many things people do that all

add up to water pollution. Everyone should know that it is not allowed under state law to intentionally introduce foreign substances (including soap and shampoo) into our waters without a permit. However, let's not just rely on the law as a justification for saying not to do it. The reasons stated above are behind the law and why I can't encourage people, pets, or any other kind of bathing or washing in lakes.

Summer camps and public facilities have a special opportunity and responsibility to be good stewards of our waters and to educate not only their campers but the public by way of example. We as lake users have our own role to play by not polluting the waterways we all share.

Conservation Too -

Before starting this week's article I downloaded a couple of pictures for inspiration. Both are from a watershed survey the Kennebec District did last spring. One shows an old metal crushed culvert but still in use. The other is a classic metal culvert which has been 'fixed' by being slip lined with a smaller plastic culvert and then with expandable foam added between the two culverts in order to hold the entire contraption together. I try and look at these water conveyances as a brook trout or other form of aquatic life. It isn't a good view! They look like barriers to me

The Kennebec District is currently involved in a rather large culvert/stream barrier survey in the lower portion of the Kennebec River watershed. We have partnered with the Kennebec Estuary Land Trust [KELT], the Andy Valley Soil & Water District [AVSW-CD] and the Sheepscot River Watershed Council [SRWC] in an effort to survey all road crossings and document how the water gets from one side of the road to the other. Take a look next time you are driving along or taking a walk and you will realize that the methods vary.

Ideally the water travels slowly enough and through a wide enough channel to maintain an environment conducive to fish passage and all the other aquatic critters that may move up and down

streams. While we usually focus on fish, there are all kinds of other critters important to stream and pond health. And that means water quality.

What do we

find? Sometimes the road crossing is a bridge. Often that is better than a culvert because the water flow is more gradual and the stream bed beneath the bridge is closer to a "natural" channel. Usually it is a culvert. Frequently they are so small and/or steep that wildlife is unable to travel up them. Or they may be so damaged that most critters, and certainly fish, can't travel through them. Or the classic - a culvert where the water runs out the lower end, drops a couple feet and scours out a large hole beneath the outlet.

Unfortunately the 'fix' for such barriers is usually replacement. The replacement is nearly always much larger and installed deeper. Replacement is expensive. The improved life span of the properly sized culvert makes the cost more realistic. The vast improvement for aquatic plants and animals up stream can be

priceless!

Most of this culvert survey field work will be done this summer. We hope to work with others and replicate the survey further north in both the Androscoggin and Kennebec River watersheds. The results can help guide construction and planning decisions at local, State and the Federal levels.

Remember... the objective is improved water quality and native plants and animals are a big part of that.





et's face it, getting up really early can be a drag; it cramps our style especially in the summertime when Mainers are suppose to take it easy after a long winter. When the alarm clock starts buzzing at 4:30 I get grouchy, mumbling comments like, "I'm not a farmer" or "have I lost my mind". But once I manage to shake out the cobwebs and smell the coffee perking down in the kitchen, my mood brightens. As a matter of fact, that's the single greatest tip I can offer this week; if you are going fishing early in the morning, set the coffee pot the night before. Oh how that wonderful smell can become a mood altering aroma that early in the morning!

So now that we are actually standing up and sipping our coffee, all we have to do is take care of business and head to the lake. There are many fishing advantages to getting up early and a lot right behind them. When I arrived at the boat launch no one was there - NO ONE! How nice it was to have the place to myself, except that just as I was unhooking the boat another red fox scampered by me and walked out toward the Marina. He wasn't scared and really didn't move quickly at all. I wish I was awake enough and moving fast enough to get my camera because he gave me a perfect opportunity to take his picture at about 15 feet away. I've been pleasantly surprised with all the wildlife spotted in the Belgrade's this year. It seems that our critters are in great shape, a sign of the mild winter I guess. Either way, it's a blessing to see such beautiful animals on a daily basis. It's such a joy to watch the world wake up, especially on the lake. Smoke on the water, loons calling, eagles soaring and hopefully fish moving the calm surface water – these things make anglers happy! With the summer heat kicking into full gear, the bite definitely seems to be bet-

ter early in the morning. The pictures attached to this article are photos are of David Weil from upstate New York. I asked David and his two young sons to get up early in order to have the best chance at catching fish. The kids actually handled it very well - you never know with kids, but Matt and Chris were real troopers and topnotch fishermen! The boys fished for white perch out of the back of the boat, while dad fished Senkos and jigs for bass. It turned out to be quite a day as you can see and the kids had a blast catching and releasing white perch all morning long. We found a lot of perch in about 25 feet of water although it was tricky catching bigger perch. The small ones were very aggressive and you had to fight your way through the little guys to catch the bigger ones. In retrospect, if we had used small live bait on light jig heads we probably would have caught more of the big

guys. As for the bass, they were sluggish as you can imagine, but when we slowed down our presentation and made multiple casts in the same location, eventually they would bite. Sometimes when the heat kicks in, I have a tendency to fish too fast and try to cover too much water. This time of year, sticking with a good location and slowing down to cover the entire area can lead to some really big fish! David proved that when he caught some seriously huge bass! Good luck.

Reaching the taste includes smoking his own meats, making his own sauce, and having a few secret - but not too spicy - ingredients.


