

Winchester Nov 3. The 1861

Dear Sir

I find that all the People are much incensed  
 against Judge Cook <sup>Says</sup> that his conduct is such as that he  
 ought not to have any thing I think he has told  
 what is not true and in fact. He has said if we  
 should not let him have an office he would show  
 some letters that would do us harm the people say if
