

Animal Countdown

The Maine POM Project

Pet Oxygen Masks, designed for most companion animals, can be an EMT's best friend and to supply them to all Maine local rescue organizations is the mission of Bobby Silcott, Harvest Hills Animal Shelter Board (Fryeburg area) member and local Animal Control Officer.

To accomplish this, Silcott became qualified to teach Red Cross Certified classes on Animal First Aid and CPR, has volunteered his time, and has donated the proceeds toward the purchase of masks. The cost to take the class is \$40 prepaid and includes a book, CD and certificate.

In taking the project statewide, Silcott hopes to work with other animal shelters and communities to expand the project. He also has received generous contributions from private donors. The kits, each with three different size masks, cost \$75. Since May 2009 he has purchased POMs for over 50 departments.

Why Pet Oxygen Masks? It is estimated that 40,000 pets die each year from smoke inhalation. POMs, designed to fit snugly around an animal's muzzle can prevent such deaths. Being able to save a beloved pet when all else is lost in a fire, can mean the world to an owner.

Legacies

In the late 1800's, as the treadle (foot and belt powered) sewing machine was first introduced people were continuing a long tradition of creating works of art in the quilts and bed coverings they crafted for their homes. Elegant in their simplicity, designed for both warmth and beauty, quilts were often constructed of remnants from dress or shirt making projects or from the "too good to throw away" sections of a garment, such as the back of a velvet coat or wool jacket that could no longer be worn. In this spirit of the frugality which permeated the everyday life of Maine people in the late 1800's, the Washburn-Norlands Living History Center (Norlands) in Livermore is hosting a special exhibit and hands-on living history workshop on August 6, 7 and 8, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. \$5 admission will help the Norlands to continue to provide educational programs for Maine school children.

The linen chest has been opened. A number of vintage hand-sewn quilts will be on display in the 1867 Italianate-style mansion, the former home of the Washburn family. The exhibit will include antique "whole cloth" quilts with intricate hand quilting, patchwork quilts and "crazy" quilts, with seemingly disorganized shapes unified by an array of colorful hand embroidery. In the kitchen and on the lawn, visitors can help to "fill a linen chest" by working alongside other volunteers in a quilting bee. There is something for all ages: cutting remnants to shape, washing cloth with the ringer washer, sewing piece-work quilt blocks (by hand or try out the treadle machine), tying the three layers of a quilt together to

finish it off, and sipping iced tea on the picturesque porch. No experience is needed.

At the Norlands, the old adage "make do or do without, use it up, wear it out" is often sung. This was certainly true with the life-cycle of textiles in the 19th century. Before it was sold to the "ragman", a garment was put to as many uses as could be found. A dress became an apron or a dress for a smaller sibling, a coat became a vest, and so on. For this special event "Inside the Linen Chest: The Elegance of Frugality" the public is invited to help the Norlands volunteers to make bed quilts for guest "bed chambers" which will soon reopen above the farmers' kitchen. We lost 15 reproduction quilts in the April 2008 fire and need to replace them. You could have a thumbprint on one of those quilts. Come to the workshop and help us

with the handwork or donate clean cotton or wool blankets that could be used as the middle layer – the filler – inside the quilt. Maybe you have a small remnant of fabric that is simply too good to throw away, but needs a good use. Bring it to the Norlands on August 6, 7 or 8 and add your heritage to one of the quilts.

Watershed Wisdom

This week we will try to give you more insight into why and how things happen in lakes and especially why it takes so long to improve water quality in a lake compared to a river or stream. Rivers and streams flow continuously down hill and are constantly mixed, with the water at any particular location being continually replaced with new water from upstream. If a river or stream becomes contaminated, the basic remediation technique is to stop the source of the contamination and then wait a few days and you have new fresh water from upstream. Once the water quality returns, the plants, aquatic insects and fish will typically return in reasonably short order.

Lakes take a lot longer to cure, especially large lakes. Most lakes have water flowing into them on a continuous basis from streams or groundwater and also have water flowing out via some type of outlet stream or river. There are some lakes, particularly in arid regions, where the water only leaves when it is evaporated. These lakes either become very salty (e.g., Great Salt Lake, Utah) or disappear completely if it hasn't rained for a while. Luckily our Maine lakes aren't like this. The water in our lakes gets replaced eventually and they don't get salty, although some small streams and groundwater do thanks to winter deicing efforts or improper salt storage (for example Belgrade, legally grandfathered, but shouldn't be in my opinion).

The Belgrade Lakes all have flowing water entering them on average and a discharge stream, typically flowing over some type of dam that regulates flow. These lakes act like leaky buckets that have a notch cut in the side. As water is added to the bucket, it will fill to the level of the bottom of the notch. If you continue to add water to the bucket, the water will rise a bit (it will rise more if the notch is narrow, less if it is wide) but then fall to the level of the bottom of the notch if you add water at a rate slower than it can leak out. The actual level of water within the bucket is determined by the rate the water flows in, and the size and shape of the notch in the side of the bucket, which determines how fast the water will flow out.

Suppose someone dumps green food coloring into our bucket. How long will it take to flush the bucket clean by simply adding clean water and letting the green water flow out through the notch? Obviously it's going to take a lot longer if you have a big bucket and don't have much water flowing through it than if your bucket is small and has a lot of water flowing into it. This is the basic concept of what hydrologists call "flushing rate," which is directly related to "residence time."

Residence time is defined as the average amount of time that water entering the lake stays in the lake before it flows out of the lake. It is calculated by dividing the average vol-

ume of the lake by the annual flow going through the lake. If our lake holds 150 million cubic meters (M3) of water like Messalonskee Lake does, and the average annual flow is 240 million M3 per year, the average residence time is .625 years or roughly 7-1/2 months. The flushing rate is simply the inverse of the residence time which represents the average number of lake volumes that flow through the lake in a year. For Messalonskee, the flushing rate is about 1.6 flushes/yr.

Studies done by Colby College have estimated the following flushing rates for the Belgrade Lakes:

Lake	Flushes/yr	Residence Time (yrs)
Messalonskee	1.59	0.63
Great Pond	0.53	1.89
Long Pond South Basin	3.55	0.28
Long Pond North Basin	2.80	0.36
Salmon-McGrath	0.59	1.69
East Pond	0.25	4.00
North Pond	1.36	0.74

Of course natural lakes are much more complex than our simple bucket analogy and these rates assume the lakes are perfectly mixed, which is rarely the case. These flushing rates do give a rough idea of how fast the lakes flush and are more accurate for a long, regularly shaped lake like Messalonskee that only has one deep area than for a large,

irregularly shaped lake like Great Pond that has several deep basins and streams of various sizes coming into different coves. And these rates assume average precipitation rates- years like this with above average precipitation will result in greater flushing rates and dry years like this one will result in less flushing. It also shows how long it takes to flush a chain of lakes- water that washes into East Pond will take almost seven years to pass through East Pond to North Pond to Great Pond to Long Pond to Messalonskee and out to the Messalonskee Stream.

In lakes like Great Pond that stratify, the surface waters flush more rapidly than the calculated flushing rate, while the deeper waters flush much more slowly because they are only really well mixed about twice a year (during spring and fall turnover). This means that if you are trying to remediate the high phosphorous levels in the deep holes, which are the biggest problem as we have previously discussed, it takes a long time to flush these areas. Where the average residence time for water in Great Pond is slightly less than 2 years, the residence time in some of the deep holes is probably more on the order of 20 years or more. This means that fixing lakes takes a lot longer than fixing a stream or river.

Cobbossee Corner

YCC – “Slowing the Flow” of Polluted Stormwater Run-off and Erosion to the Cobbossee Watershed

A team of eight area students are spending their summer working along – and often in – the 28 lakes and streams of the Cobbossee Watershed. As part of the Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed’s “Slow-the-Flow” program, this year’s Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) team hails from Winthrop and Maranacook Community High Schools, and work under the direction of Program Director Jay Lindsey.

Lindsey, a Winthrop High School science teacher during the academic year, is in his 4th year of overseeing the program. “This year’s team has truly been a pleasure to work with. They all exhibit a true dedication to the cause, they’re doing great work, and everyone is having a great time too!”

Launched in 2003 with volunteers provided from AmeriCorps*NCCC, in 2005 the Friends began employing local high school and college students to staff their YCC. By the end of this summer (the 8th year of the program), Friends YCC members will have completed 170 projects on 14 different water bodies, protecting over five miles of fragile Cobbossee Watershed shoreline.

A typical day with the Corps is – to say the least – a varied operation. All projects are done by hand, mitigating the potential for further damage to lake-front erosion concerns. With worksites typically on the edge of a lake, many crew members – if not all – end up in the water at some point of each job. Typical work involves transporting and placing rock, mulch, crushed stone and planting of buffers designed to “slow-the-flow” of sediments to the waters.

“You can tell that our work will have a positive impact on the land when you look at the end results,” said Erin Belanger, YCC crew leader. The work we do has a direct impact on helping the lakes.

With labor and engineering provided at no charge (landowners pay for materials only), the “Slow-the-Flow” program has flourished due to the support of this year’s business sponsors China Dine-ah, G&E Roofing, On Target Utility Services, Sylvester Excavating, EcoCycle, and O’Connor Motors; member donations; and grant monies obtained through the Federal EPA Section 319 in partnership with the Cobbossee Watershed District and the KV Soil & Water Conservation District.

Bob Moore, Friend’s Executive Director, takes pride in seeing how the program has transitioned over the years to where today it also provides a wonderful opportunity in engaging area youth. “Adding this component of sustainability and local stewardship is making a huge difference right now in helping to protect the Cobbossee Watershed,” says Moore. “But even more importantly, it is a vital component of our entire educational program that is helping to educate tomorrow’s stewards on the importance of watershed preservation.”

As Maine's landscape continues to change, wildlife habitat is quite often lost. Besides preserving large tracts of land, which is always worth doing, there are other ways we can preserve or restore habitat at a small scale. By paying attention to what's around us, it can be simple to create habitat that we and wildlife both enjoy. Even in rural Maine, it's easy to lose our connection with the natural world. By keeping it close to us, around our homes and within our sight it becomes part of our everyday experience and allows us to lead richer lives.

Attracting wildlife to your yard, whether in town or in the country, can be accomplished by providing what they need. A diversity of food, cover type and space is required to attract a wide range of species. Native trees, shrubs and perennials planted in combination can provide the necessary conditions. A variety of plants in the yard also adds interest and year round beauty. For lists of native plants see: "University of

Maine Cooperative Extension Bulletin #2500: Gardening to Conserve Maine's Landscape: Plants to Use and Plants to Avoid". See www.umext.maine.edu/onlinepubs/PDFpubs/2500.pdf There is other information at the Univ. of Maine Extension website or visit their office in Augusta.

Enhancing backyard habitat is beneficial for more than just native wildlife. It can increase real estate value by adding natural beauty. It can also reduce the impact of your yard on water quality and enhance area air quality, particularly in heavily developed areas. Perennial or "wild" gardens produce less stormwater runoff than lawns. If the majority of homeowners in a neighborhood work to enhance backyard habitats, the neighborhood begins to resemble the forest that it once was.

Backyard habitat management can also conserve energy, by providing cooling shade in summer and providing windbreaks for heat loss preven-

tion in winter. By reducing the size of lawn, and enhancing the soil's ability to retain moisture, water conservation is also achieved. Pest control can also be a side benefit of backyard habitat enhancement. Many of the species we hope to attract by providing habitat feed on insects. Species such as swallows, frogs, dragonflies and bats depend heavily on insects as part of their diet. Natural pest management can replace the use of chemical pest controllers.

If you enjoy bird or butterfly watching or simply think it reasonable to share your little piece of the world with other natural inhabitants, then think about backyard habitat enhancement. It's a small way to give a little back and get a lot in return.

Fishing

Largemouth Bass and Mysterious Moose

The largemouth bass fishing has really been pretty good lately and that is keeping anglers smiling as we approach the Dog Days of Summer. One of the interesting aspects to the largemouth bite lately is that despite the warm water temperatures and oppressive heat, the big fish are still being caught in relatively shallow water. It's also obvious that they are keyed on crayfish, simply judging by the sheer number of bass that have crayfish sticking out of their mouths when they come visit us in the boat. Another common thread with the largemouth bite is the fish are concentrating on wood – i.e. fallen trees, sunken stumps, etc. North Pond for example has a lot of sunken wood structure and the largemouth have been holding very tight to it. With the combination of crayfish as food and wood as cover, the natural lure choice is a jig. We've been hitting some nice bass on black/brown and watermelon colored jigs in 1/4 ounce tipped with a variety of trailers designed to imitate crayfish. There are so many different jig trailers on the market now that it's hard for an angler to decide which one to choose. Regardless of the trailer you choose, lighter jigs fished slowly around wood has been effective. The lighter jig offers a slower sink rate which gives the bass a chance to find the bait and it helps to keep the jig from snagging up on the timber too. Smallmouth bass have been picking up the jigs as well and some big smallies have been popping up in the shallows this week. Speaking of smallmouth bass, don't forget, this coming week is the full moon – a perfect opportunity to do some night fishing!

Wildlife watching hits full gear in the Belgrade's right now. This is my favorite time of year to look for deer on the back edges of fields or on the sides of the many camp roads that line our region. The deer are so cool looking right now because they are pretty much bright orange in color (or at least they look orange when they are standing in dark green fields). Today I saw five deer total, but two deer were standing in odd places. One was a young buck and he was standing right in my neighbor's driveway about five feet from his car. My neighbor even has a dog, and the old lab was sound asleep on the porch with the deer standing no more than 10 yards away! I wish I had my camera because it would have made a great photo. The second deer (which was also a buck) crossed Route 23 in Sidney early this morning.

He crossed from a field into the storage facility parking lot and stood right next to the entrance sign. That picture would have been perfect for their marketing materials! In addition to deer, turkeys are out promenading around with their brood. It always amazes me how cute a baby turkey is and how drop-dead ugly the bird is when they grow up. Let's face it; there aren't too many critters uglier than a mature Tom turkey – certainly a face only a mother could love . . . maybe. This spring and summer has been very warm and dry which is perfect weather for turkey broods, much better conditions than last year's constant rain and cool temperatures. I think we can expect to see a lot of turkeys running around for the rest of the season due to the perfect nesting conditions. Unfortunately, I don't think the same can be said for the loons. Last weekend was the loon count, and



although final numbers are not in yet, there have not been too many chicks seen this year. Let's hope the chicks that are out there make it to adulthood! One last quick animal story: last Wednesday I'm fishing with Chris (who is shown in the pictures) and we were fishing lower Long Pond for smallmouth and largemouth bass. It was a spectacular day with a bright blue sky and calm water. Truly picture perfect and we even managed to hook into a few beautiful fish – BONUS! As we were slowly working south down a secluded shoreline, we could hear something tromping through the woods. There are not many houses anywhere near this area and the critter was really making a racket - snapping good sized branches while walking closer and closer to us. To make a long story short, we spent about 10 minutes waiting and scanning the woods while our minds played tricks on us until finally . . . you guessed it . . . a good old, local boy pops up through the bushes and asks how the fishing is. We couldn't believe it, mostly because we'd convinced ourselves that he was going to be a moose. We laughed out loud for quite a while about that one! I'll remember the perplexed and shocked look on Chris' face for a long time after seeing that guy emerge out of woods. Good times!
