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1819 Maine Constitutional Election Returns: Starks

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At a Legal Meeting of the inhabitants of the town
of Starks in the County of Somerset qualified to vote for
Senators, holden on the first Monday of December being the sixth
day of said Month A.D 1819 For the purpose of giving in
their votes in writing expressing their approbation or
Disapprobation of the Constitution prepared by the
Convention of Delegates assembled at Portland on the second
monday of October last, pursuant to an act entitled, an
act, relating to the Separation of the District of Maine from
Massachusetts Proper, and forming the same into a separate
and independant State. — —

the whole number of votes given in, in
said town were sorted and counted in the open meeting of
the town, by the selectmen who presided at said meeting
and were thirty nine of which thirty eight
were in favor of the Constitution prepared by the
Convention as aforesaid and one
were opposed to said Constitution. — —
