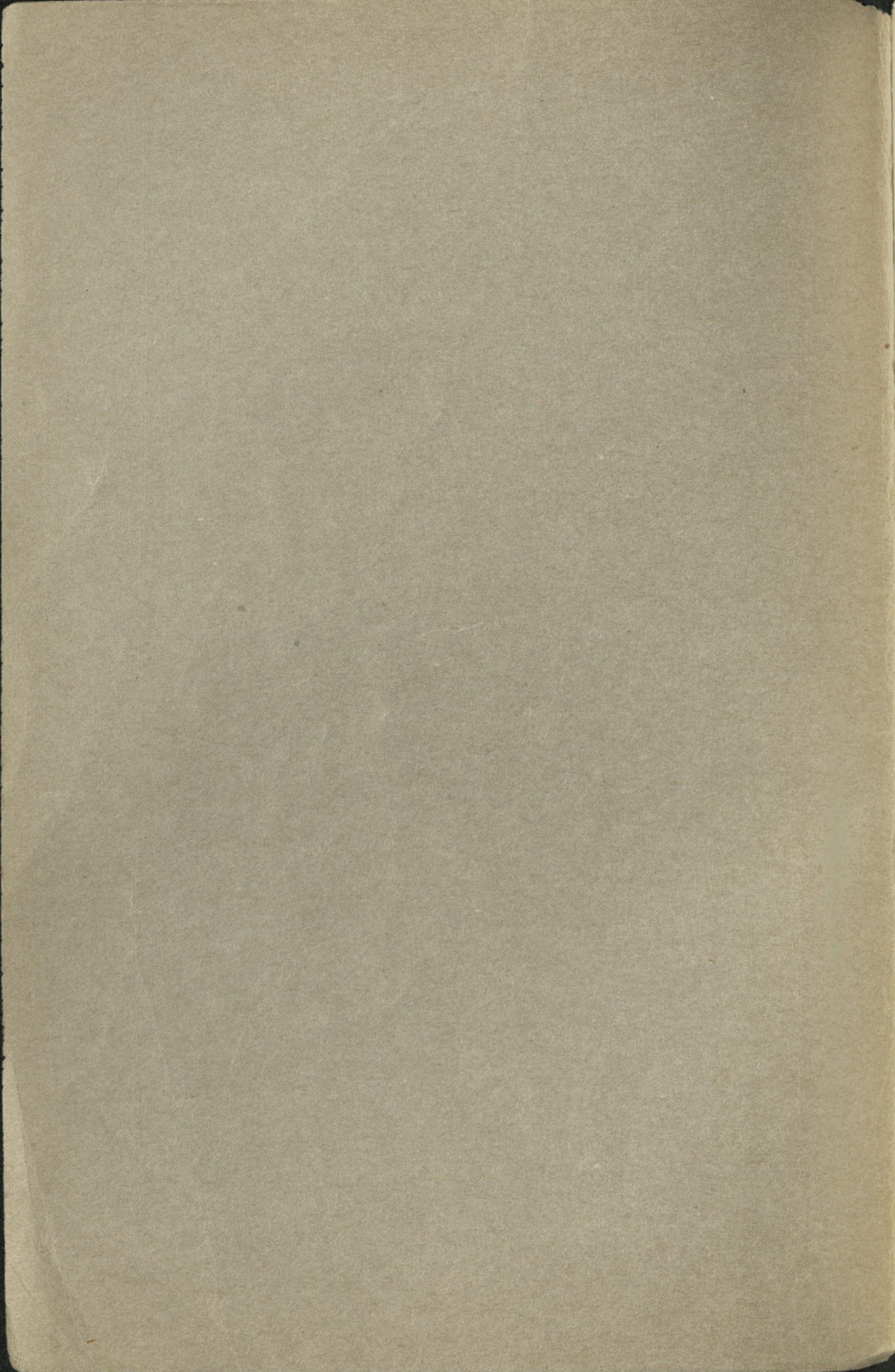

Warrant

To E. M. Crowell, a Constable in the Town of Orrington,
Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Orrington, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, too assemble at the town house in said town on Monday, the fourteenth of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To act on report of the selectmen.

Art. 4. To act on report of superintendent of schools.

Art. 5. To act on report of the board of health.

Art. 6. To see if the town will fix the compensation of town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To choose all necessary town officers for ensuing year.

Art. 8. To grant and raise money for support of schools, the poor and mothers' aid, repair of roads and bridges, for patrol maintenance, the repair of school houses and to defray all other charges.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for memorial purposes.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote yes or no on the question of appropriation and raise money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 19 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes of 1916.

Art. 11. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$553.00 for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of State Highway Commission in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the revised statutes of 1916.

Art. 12. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$500.00 for the road from the top of the long hill so called, to East Orrington Square.

Art. 13. "By petition." To see if the town will raise the sum of \$300 to gravel the road to Brewer Lake.

Art. 14. "By petition" To see if the town will grant and raise money for new pumps and cement curbing and trough at Orrington not to exceed \$100.00.

Art. 15. "By petition" To see if the town will vote to reopen the school at Orrington Corner.

Art. 16. To see if the town will instruct its treasurer to loan the credit of the town if necessary to defray town charges not to exceed \$4,000.00.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to buy or build one or more snow rollers and raise money for same.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to buy a safe or safe cabinet for use at the town hall and raise money for same.

Art. 19. To see what action the town will take in relation to the continuance of the Pond school.

Art. 20. To see what action the town will take relative to paying the full tuition of high school pupils.

Art. 21. To see what action the town will take regarding the gift of land from Capt. J. H. Smith under the conditions that the Nickerson school lot be fenced by the town.

Art. 22. To see if the town will elect a school physician and raise money for same.

Art. 23. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$75.00, the income from the same to be used for the perpetual care of the Geo. A. Richardson lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Art. 24. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$100.00, the income from same to be used for the perpetual care of the Sam'l N. Perkins lots in Pine Hill Cemetery.

Art. 25. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$50.00, the income from the same to be used for the perpetual care of the Lorenzo A. Chapin lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Art. 26. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$50.00, the income from the same to be used for the perpetual care of the Erastus H. Severance lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to purchase one or more road machines and raise money for the same.

Art. 28. To see what action the town will take in regard to letting and care of town hall.

Art. 29. To see what action the town will take in regard to the Hampden and Orrington ferry.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to instruct its selectmen to pay to the town treasurer all cemetery trust funds now deposited in the banks and those that may be hereafter entrusted to the town, taking his receipt for the same and keeping a separate account of same.

The selectmen will be in session for the purpose of revising the list of voters at 9 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.

Nickerson. The lighting should be changed.

As was pointed out in the last report the toilet conditions are very bad. All the toilets need painting inside. There is a bill before the Legislature relating to sanitary toilet conditions. If this becomes a law all toilets will have to be either flush, chemical, or dirt closets connected with the school room by a covered passageway.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

We now have 42 pupils in High School, 34 at Bangor High School, 4 at Brewer High School, and 4 at East Maine Conference Seminary. Twenty-five pupils completed the elementary work last Spring. Eight pupils will be ready for High School next Fall.

The High School tuition is now \$60 and East Maine Conference Seminary \$90 per year for each pupil. The State law requires all towns, not maintaining a High School, to pay \$45 per year for each pupil in High School. This leaves a balance of \$15 at the High Schools and \$45 at the Seminary to be paid by the parents. It does not seem unreasonable to ask the town to pay \$60 per year.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

A large number of the towns in the State now employ a school physician, and have inspection of all school children, at least, once a year. This inspection is for the purpose of noting physical defects and contagious diseases. It must be understood that the school physician does not treat cases, but examines each child, keeps a record and notifies the parents if there are any physical defects that interfere with the child's work. The cost of this inspection would be small.

Since it is universally conceded that good health is essential, not only to the welfare of the individual, but to the life of the nation, the situation demands attention. Modern Health Crusade work should also be established in the schools.

MUSIC

I want to bring again to the attention of the people the importance of music and drawing in the schools. As stated in the report last year, it might be possible to obtain the services of the music and drawing teacher of the Brewer or Bucksport schools for one day each week.

TEACHERS

I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the quality of our teaching force. The teachers at the present time are most efficient and most interested in their work. The school spirit is excellent. Hardly a complaint has come to me this year. The town of Orrington is prosperous and one sure proof of its prosperity is the excellence of its schools, and the painstaking effort made for their added efficiency.

But for the liberal increase in our common school fund we would, doubtless, have lost several of our good teachers. It is to be hoped that all the citizens will see the urgent necessity of retaining the good teachers another year even at an advance in wages.

I wish to thank the parents for the many courtesies shown the teachers during the year. The attendance at the socials and entertainments is good proof of their interest. We are greatly indebted to the teachers and pupils for the liberal sums sent by the various leagues to the starving children of Europe.

CO-OPERATION

There are a few parents who do not take school attendance and punctuality as seriously as they should. A child who does not attend school regularly not only retards his own progress but the progress of the whole class. The habit of being tardy is even worse than irregularity in attendance. I would appeal to the parents to assume a little more of the responsibility of the attendance and punctuality of their children.

CONCLUSION

In closing I wish to thank the teachers for their conscientious work, and the Members of the school board and town officials for their helpful assistance with special mention of the attendance officer, who when called upon, has acted promptly and in a tactful and efficient manner.
