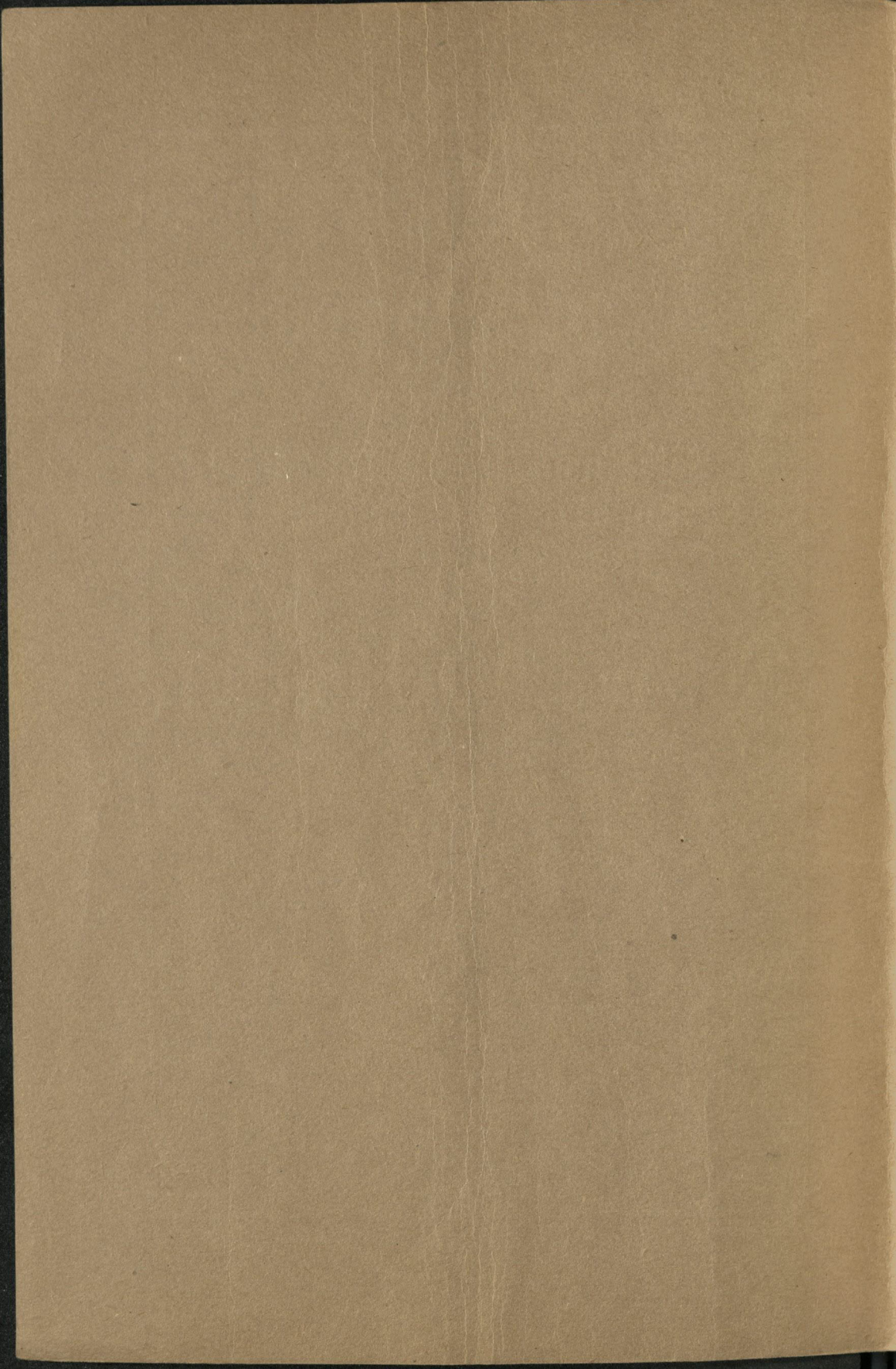

WARRANT

To *E. M. Crowell*, a Constable in the town of Orrington, *Greeting:*

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Orrington, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town, on Monday, the tenth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To act on the report of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Assessors and Overseers of Poor.
- Art. 4. To act on the report of the Board of Health and the Health Officers.
- Art. 5. To act on the report of the Superintendent of Schools.
- Art. 6. To fix the compensation of the following town officers for the ensuing year: Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of Poor, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Road Commissioners, Sealer of Weights and Measures and any others that may be deemed necessary.
- Art. 7. To choose all necessary town officers for ensuing year, including a Collector of Taxes.

Art. 8 To see what sums of money the town will grant and raise for following purposes: For the Support of Schools, Books and Supplies, Repair of School Property, Tuition, Support of the Poor, Mothers' Aid, Repair of Roads and Bridges, and pay of Snow bills, Patrol Maintenance, Pay of Town Officers, Miscellaneous Expenses and any other town charges.

Art. 9. To see if the town will grant and raise money for Memorial Purposes.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raise money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sec. 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 11. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$533.00 for the improvement of the section of the State-aid Road, as outlined in the report of the State Higyway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of the Ways, Highways and Bridges, the above amount being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 12. To see what roads, if any, the town will vote to keep open during winter months, suitable for Automobile Traffic.

Art. 13. By request, to see if the town will vote that the Road Building and repairs on same shall be left with the Selectmen.

Art. 14. To see if town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for Repair of Ditches and Culverts and instruct its Selectmen to report number and location of culverts repaired.

Art. 15. To see if town has any preference as to time when Road and Bridge moneys shall be expended, also, new Construction of Roads.

Art. 16. To see if town will vote to allow a Discount on all Taxes paid on or before August 1st, and what per cent. shall be allowed.

Art. 17. To see if the town will instruct its Selectmen to withhold 50% of all Town Orders presented to them for payment, same to be credited to the owners' taxes if any due.

Art. 18. To see if town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 to be used jointly with the State Highway Commission on the 50-50 plan for new construction on the Dow Road. *yo*

Art. 19. By request, to see if town will raise the sum of \$150.00, same to be expended on Rogers Road, so called, running to Oak Hill Cemetery. *yes*

Art. 20. By request, to see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to be used in repair of road running from A. H. Ryder's residence to residence of P. A. Fowler. *yes*

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to repair the schoolhouse in District No. 8 and raise money for same.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to purchase a Bronze Tablet, to be placed on the Pound, same to bear an inscription of the date of erection of said Pound, also the names of all Orrington boys who served in World's War, and raise money for same.

Art. 23. To see if the town will instruct its Selectmen to appropriate from Road and Bridge moneys what sum they think necessary to repair Bridge and Culvert Railings.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to deed the Marston Cemetery, so called, to the North Orrington Cemetery Improvement Association and to pay annually the income from all trust funds belonging to said yard to the treasurer of said corporation.

Art. 25. To see what action the town will take in regard to the bequest of Elhanan W. Burns for a Library and Gymnasium at East Orrington Village.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00, same to be used for repair of McKinley Avenue, at Elm Heights. *yes*

Art. 27. To see what action the town will take in regard to a re-valuation of town property and revision of 10-year book, and raise money for same.

Art. 28. To see if town will vote to purchase a Road Machine, and raise money for same. *yes*

Art. 29. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to repair Town Hall.

Art. 30. To see if town will appoint a Committee to act in conjunction with Selectmen to build a tomb in Dean Hill Cemetery; the money for same having been furnished by Loud Estate.

Art. 31. To see if town will elect a Budget Committee consisting of five members, one from each section of the town.

Art. 32. To see if town will vote to raise \$100.00 to repair the road by the old Pottery to the new Brooks Road. *yes*

Art. 33. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$100.00 as a trust fund from Mrs. Jennie M. Whitney, the income from same to be used for the perpetual care of the Albert and Joseph Bowden lots.

Art. 34. To see if town will accept sum of \$100.00 as a trust fund from Mrs. Estelle Mutty, the income to be used for perpetual care of John Elms lot, in Marston Yard.

Art. 35. To see if town will accept the sum of \$100.00 from Edison George, as a trust fund, the income from same to be used for perpetual care of Warren George lot in Marston Cemetery.

Art. 36. To see if town will instruct its Selectmen and School Board to look into matter of re-location of Snow's Corner and Pierce's Crossing schoolhouses and report on same at a special or next annual town meeting.

Art. 37. To see what action the town will take in regard to Red Bridge, and if the town decides to repair or rebuild, raise money for same.

Art. 38. To see if town will accept sum of \$509.22 (five hundred nine, 22-100 dollars) as a trust fund, the income to be used annually in placing flowers and for perpetual care of Loud lots in Dean Hill Cemetery.

Art. 39. By petition of A. N. Hurd and five others, to see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 to gravel the road from Hoxie Hill to Pond schoolhouse; \$200.00 for the road from Pond schoolhouse to Byard's Corner; \$300.00 from Byard's Corner to Hoxie Hill. *yes*

Art. 40. To see if town will appropriate \$25.00 from regular road fund to fill ruts with gravel, on road running from State-aid Road to American Ice House property.

Art. 41. To see if town will expend sum of \$500.00 on repair of Long Hill, the town to be reimbursed for above amount from Special Legislative Resolves.

Art. 42. To see if town will vote to instruct its Treasurer to loan credit of town, if necessary, to defray town charges, not to exceed \$5,000.00.

Art. 43. To see what action town will take in regard to care and letting Town House.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to abate the 1919 taxes of the Boston & Penobscot Ship Building Co. to F. A. Dillingham.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of revising the list of voters.

The law requires, under penalty for neglect, parents to report the births of their children; but irrespective of this, a permanent and accurate record of all births is a matter of great importance to parents, to the children, and to society.

Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Orrington:

I herewith submit for your consideration my second report of the schools and school property of this town.

TEACHERS

Schools opened for the Fall term with changes in all the schools excepting Orrington Center and Swett's Pond. Miss Helen Lindsey was transferred from Orrington Corner to Nickerson school and Mrs. Mabel Gowen from Snow's Corner to the King school. To fill the vacancies caused by resignations and transfers new teachers were elected as follows: Miss Emmie Whitaker, South Orrington; Miss Clytie Wilbur, Orrington Corner; Miss Ruth Goss, Pierce's; Miss Dagny Erickson, Snow's Corner; Miss Mary Whitaker, East Orrington. At the close of the Fall term Miss Ruth Goss resigned and Miss Evelyn Ryder was secured to fill the position. All the teachers have had previous experience, excepting two, and we are fortunate in having such a strong corps of teachers. If our school system is to be progressive it is necessary for the teachers to plan to attend Summer school at least once in three years to keep in touch with present day methods of education.

ATTENDANCE

The attendance has been fairly satisfactory although there have been more or less absences for a short time on account of illness. When children have been out of school they are handicapped to a certain extent. This makes the work more difficult for both teacher and pupil as there is just so much work to be accomplished. It has

been very pleasing to note that parents have tried in most cases to cooperate with teachers in encouraging and maintaining a good attendance. It is desirable that the parents keep in close touch with the schools so that they may fully understand the work which is required of the children. In this way a better understanding between teachers and parents will result to the benefit of all concerned. This cooperation will mean a higher grade of work in all the schools.

HEALTH WORK

Some of the schools are working out health crusades as outlined by the Maine Public Health Association. These crusades are certainly very helpful in forming good health habits in children. Instruction is given by the teachers and the work merits the cooperation of all the citizens in town.

MUSIC

One of the needs of our schools at the present time is a course in Public School Music. Almost every town throughout the State of the size of Orrington has realized the importance of this subject and is having music taught regularly in the schools. Not having many schools in town it would not be necessary for us to employ a teacher for full time. This could be done at a nominal cost, and it would not be necessary to make any special appropriation as it would be paid from the common school fund.

HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

On account of the large attendance in various higher institutions it would seem advisable to make some arrangements in the near future to maintain a High School, either of A or B grade. We have at the present time, 51 students in High Schools and there would probably be more if we had a Town High School. Pupils who graduate from our public schools would then have a chance to attend a higher institution without the extra cost of board and traveling expenses. This

change could be made without any increase of our school appropriations as the amount paid for High School tuition would be ample to maintain a High School.

TEXT-BOOKS

The text-books are in fairly good condition. Some new upper grade geographies and English books have been purchased and a few supplementary readers and histories have been secured to take the place of old copies. It will be necessary to have some lower grade geographies and arithmetics the coming year. Reference books are needed in all the schools.

REPAIRS

In the following statement you will find repairs made and condition and needed repairs of each building.

SOUTH ORRINGTON

The schoolroom needs painting and a few minor repairs made before another Fall.

NICKERSON

The schoolroom has been painted. The building should be painted outside and a new toilet system should be installed.

ORRINGTON CORNER

The underpinning should be re-set and the building thoroughly repaired the coming Summer. A new stove has been purchased and a few minor repairs made.

PIERCE'S

The schoolhouse has been painted and a few minor repairs have been made. It is in very good condition. A new stove has been put in.

SNOW'S CORNER

This building has been painted inside but should be painted outside and other minor repairs made before another Fall. Something should be done in regard to enlarging the school grounds and installing a new toilet system.

EAST ORRINGTON

This building has been painted inside and outside and other repairs made. It is in the best condition of any schoolhouse in town.

CENTER

A few minor repairs have been made. The building needs painting.

POND

This building has been thoroughly repaired. It is in good condition. A new shed should be built.

KING

It will be necessary to build a new shed and to re-set the underpinning. The schoolroom has been painted and a new stove purchased.

As the School Law requires that all school buildings shall meet a certain standard in regard to sanitation before September, 1927, it will be advisable for us to plan to install toilet systems in at least two school buildings before another year.

It might be advisable to make a few repairs on the schoolhouses not being used for school purposes at the present time as they deteriorate very rapidly and it costs less to make repairs when needed than after years of neglect.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the Superintending School Committee, other town officials, teachers and parents for their cooperation and courtesy during the past year.
