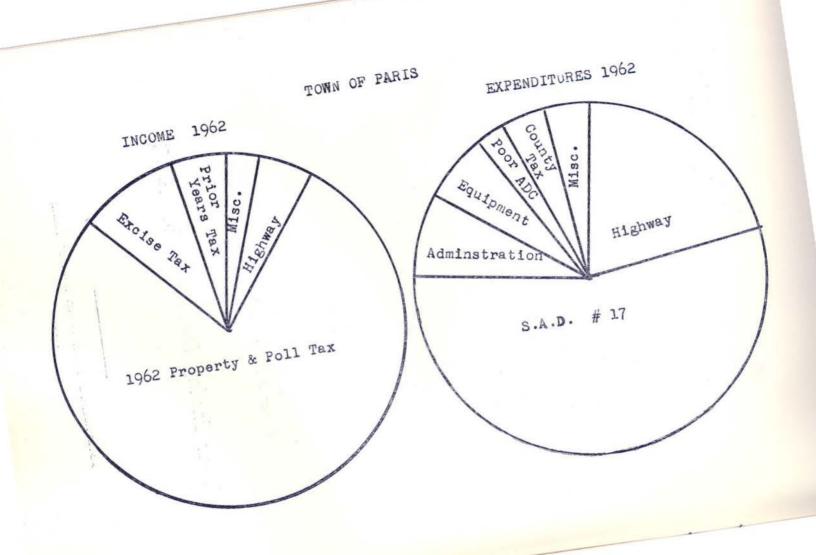

Town Manager's Report

To the honorable Board of Selectmen and the Citizens of the Town of Paris:

It is my pleasure to report on the past year's activities of the Town of Paris and to make recommendations for the coming year.

The Town of Paris completed the operations for the year 1962 with a cash balance of \$44,272.31. Approximately 97% of the 1962 tax commitment was collected by December 31, 1962. The net unexpended department balances and overdrafts amounted to \$39,883.50 for the year and were transferred to the surplus account leaving a balance of \$65,987.14 in surplus as of December 31, 1962.

During the year a new front end loader was purchased for the highway department and this has proven a worthwhile addition. Two new trucks were purchased from the equipment account to replace older trucks during the year. An increase in the highway department accounts is asked for this year to cover the costs of wage increases and the increased cost of replacement vehicles. One new snow plow and wing was purchased for one of the trucks. Today the public demands more and better service from the Highway Department and much credit should be given to highway personnel for a job well done.

During the year the town engaged the services of Whitman & Howard, Inc. to update the sewer survey and plan for joint pollution abatement program for the Towns of Norway and Paris, the A. C. Lawrence Co. and Burnham & Morrill Co. It is expected that the town will submit an application to F. H. H. A. for a grant for planning and construction drawings for a complete sewer system for the town and sewage treatment plant for the town, the A. C. Lawrence Co. and Burnham & Morrill Co.

The State Bureau of Taxation increased the Town of Paris' state valuation \$200,000. for the years 1963-64. This, of course, increased the town's share of the support of S. A. D. #17 and its share of the County Tax. In the future the town should consider and plan for a program of tax mapping for the complete town and an equalization program of all assessments.

I wish to thank the citizens of Paris and fellow employees for the fine spirit of cooperation for the past year.

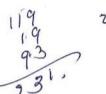

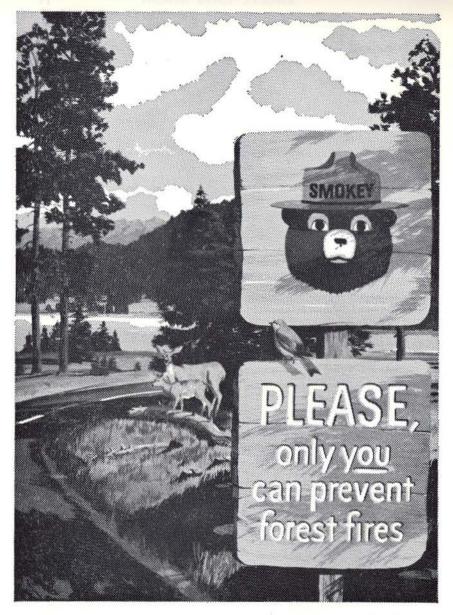

TOWN OF PARIS

JANUARY 1, 1962 TO DECEMBER 31, 1962

An audit of the financial records of the Town of Paris has been completed for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1962. The audit consisted of an examination of the records maintained under the supervision of the Town Manager and municipal officials.

The operations for the year showed that the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed amounted to \$39,883.50, per the following summary:

The excise tax revenue and the overlay were the major factors contributing to the amount lapsed to surplus.

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements and to the scope of audit.

ASSETS . . . The general cash balance of \$44,272.31 was on deposit in the Casco Bank and Trust Company, South Paris, Maine at December 31, 1962. A change fund of \$50.00 was on hand.

The investment of \$10.00 constitutes one share of Paris Farmers' Union Stock, Certificate #137, dated July 24, 1920.

Accounts receivable of \$8,786.07 represented reimbursable expenditures made for town road improvement and welfare expenditures due from the State of Maine and other municipalities.

Taxes receivable totaling \$12,861.63 consisted principally of current year accounts of \$9,634.25. The balance of \$3,227.38 was for prior years' accounts dating from 1956.

Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$1,053.02 and \$719.31 respectively.

Equity in real estate derived from aid rendered to individuals, totaled \$4,154.21 at the year end.

LIABILITIES, RESERVE AND SURPLUS... The appropriation accounts showed an unexpended balance of \$3,583.16, representing various operating balances carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or customary practice.

Excise tax collections of \$2,133.75 are reserved for future allocation by the townspeople.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$65,987.14, an increase of \$4,409.38 for the year. This change was occasioned principally by the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed, less authorized transfers to various operating accounts.

RESERVE AND TRUST FUNDS... A capital reserve fund for highway drainage was established at the annual town meeting and \$20,000.00 was appropriated from surplus for the purpose. The fund totaled \$20,467.98 at the year end and was on deposit in local banks.

Trust fund principals totaled \$16,847.13 and unexpended income amounted to \$2,977.75 at December 31, 1962. These funds are invested in time deposits of \$18,824.88 in various local savings institutions and stock of \$1,000.00.

DEPARTMENTAL ACCOUNTS . . . The departmental operating accounts showed a decrease of \$13,574.33 in funds raised by taxation, as compared with the preceding year. Smaller appropriations for education, charity, debt retirement and special assessments, and larger appropriations for general government and equipment were the major factors responsible for the decrease.

The departmental balances carried forward decreased by \$8,496.77. This change occurred principally in equipment and charity accounts.

GENERAL . . . The townspeople authorized the transfer of surplus funds for town officers' salaries, a new loader and a capital reserve fund for highway drainage.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Count of cash was made and records checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions.

Cash accounts were verified by reconciliation of statements furnished by the depository. Time deposits and investments were checked. Verifications were utilized, on a test basis, to determine the correctness of recorded assets.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as expenditures and negotiated checks. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined for a selected period. Excise tax collections were compared with copies of the receipts retained by the collector.

Reserve and trust fund transactions were reviewed. The minutes of the annual meeting were checked for matters of financial concern. Surety bond coverage was examined.

Annual Report of Public Health Nursing

FOR THE TOWN OF SOUTH PARIS

FOR THE YEAR ENDING, DECEMBER 31, 1962

Your public health nurse is a member of the staff of the State Department of Health and Welfare, Division of Public Health Nursing. The nurse renders what is termed a generalized service. This means that she gives service to people in their homes, in the schools, and in the community.

As present, statistics show that seventeen million people over sixty-five years of age have chronic illnesses. Because of this, much emphasis is now placed on the problem of care and rehabilitation of the chronically ill and aged in the home. These individuals require a long period of care under medical supervision and assistance in achieving a higher level of selfcare and independence. Your public health nurse, as a member of the medical team of professional workers, will be glad to assist these people and their families.

Many home visits were made on behalf of school children as followups of referrals made by school personnel or because of clinic recommendations. There are twenty-nine children registered with the state services such as Cardiac, Hard of Hearing, Mental Health, and Orthopedic Clinics, and The Division of Eye Care and Special Services. A series of Child Health Conferences was held at South Paris, sponsored by the Mother's Club and another series was sponsored by the Improvement League of Paris Hill for the children in that area. Following is a statistical report on these services.

Warrant For Town Meeting

To Thomas L. Clifford, a Constable of the Town of Paris:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Paris. qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Office, in the Masonic Building, South Paris, on Saturday, the second day of March A. The polls for electing these officers will be opened at twelve o'clock noon and closed at seven o'clock in the evening. Polls will be open at the Town Office. Masonic Building, South Paris.

The remaining business to be transacted under this warrant will be taken up at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening at Association Hall, South Paris.

Art. 3. To see if the citizens of the town will accept the reports of the manager and selectmen.

Art. 4. To hear the report of the Crocker and Bray funds.

Art. 5. To see what compensation the Town Officers shall receive for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the town officers' salaries for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$8,100.00.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay for office expenses for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$9,000.00.

Art. 14. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 44, 49 or 50, Chap. 23 R. S. 1954, as amended.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting bushes within the limits of the town.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Aid to Dependent Children for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$3,000.00.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$800.00.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$400.00.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$750.00.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the dump for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$1,000.00.

Art. 24. To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Section 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954. BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$300.00.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Social Security for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$1,250.00.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will raise and appropriate to pay the town's share of the cost of the Group Life Insurance program.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$700.00.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay interest on temporary loans.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$1,000.00.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to combat Elm Disease for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$1,200.00.

Art. 29. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for traffic patrol for the ensuing year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$500.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the capital reserve fund for highway drainage in the town; and decide what part thereof shall be raised by taxation this year and what part appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the town.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS \$20,000.00 FROM SURPLUS.

Art. 31. To see if the town will fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable; and to see if the town will fix a rate of interest to be charged on taxes unpaid after said date.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS 6% INTEREST BE-

GINNING JANUARY 1, 1964.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to pay the premium on the bonds of the collector and treasurer for the current year, the same to be paid from the miscellaneous account.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS TO DO SO.

Art. 33. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen, in behalf of the town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they may deem advisable and execute quit-claim deeds

for such property, but before such sale, they shall first give the previous owner or mortgagee first refusal; and then give public notice of sale and solicit sealed bids.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to permit to keep open to the public on the Lord's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th., November 11th., and Thanksgiving Day as proclaimed by the Governor, all places of business not already exempted from closing under the provisions of Chapter 134, Section 38 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1954, as amended; provided now-ever, that such vote shall not be construed to extend to any business or activity specially prohibited on any such day by provisions of the Statutes of Maine other than Sections 38 and 38A of said chapter.

Art. 35. To see if the town will accept from the Daniels family the sum of two hundred dollars to be safely invested and forever held in trust, the income therefrom to be used for care of the Mountain View Cemetery.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to accept a street to be known as Emery Avenue beginning at a point on the southerly side of Brook Street, commonly called the Buckfield Road, and ending at the southwesterly corner of land of Wayne Jackson, as laid out by the Selectmen. Said avenue to be approximately 40 feet wide.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the old highway known as the Moody Brook road, beginning at the residence of Walter Smith, north to the cellar hole of the Algernon Andrews place, so-called.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the old highway running from the Buckfield road to the Whittemore District, so-called, beginning at the residence of August Niskanen south to the old Briggs place, so-called.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the old highway starting at the Elm Hill Road and running west to the old Knightly and Foster places, so-called.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the Swallow road, so-called, beginning at the cemetery easterly to the residence of Berton Leonard.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to revise the Budget Committee and authorize the three ranking budget committee members whose terms expire in the current year, to appoint three members to serve for a term of three years.

Registration of voters for this meeting will end at 12 noon, on February 26, 1963 at the Town Office.
