A Ribbon Is Cut, the Magic Continues

omewhere over the rainbow, there's a place where dreams come true, where the wind ripples across a beautiful lake, where trails are paved, a treehouse is handicapped accessible, almost everything recreational is possible no matter how challenging, and where the Governor of Maine shares a ribbon-cutting ceremony with four proud young people in wheelchairs. This is Pine Tree Camp on North Pond in Rome.

Now in its 66th season, Pine Tree Camp offers a typical Maine summer camp opportunity for Maine children and adults with physical and developmental disabilities, an opportunity where freedom is felt and friends are made. At Pine Tree Camp the 285 lakeside acres are magical in their natural beauty of cool pine woods and water-oriented vistas. The barrier-free trails and buildings and sports facilities provide campers an independence that defies the confines of disabilities. The staff excels in enthusiasm and encouragement. And peer friendships develop for a first time and last for a lifetime.

Here in this magical setting on Thursday, July 28, a double celebration took place: a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the new Harold and Bibby Alfond Dining Hall and the 75th Anniversary Celebration of Pine Tree Society, headquartered in Bath.

Society, called the dining hall the heart of the campus.

The Harold and Bibby Alfond Dining Hall with its air conditioning, access for heavy motorized wheelchairs, wraparound deck, and superb light (and very superb view of North Pond) will be the center for the camp's meals, social functions, entertainment and respite, thanks in part to a \$500,000 grant from the Harold Alfond Foundation.

Greg Powell, Chairman of the Foundation added some insight to the generous grant. The Alfonds, he stated, spent 60 years in Belgrade






NEMC Celebrates 75 Seasons






arlier this year we talked about nutrient Lenrichment of the lakes ("eutrophication") and the importance of limiting phosphorous inputs. As we discussed, phosphorous (P) loading to lakes is complex and includes many sources. Some P is continually entering via atmospheric deposition (typically ~15%, can be more in dusty areas). Anyone who has left their car sitting in the driveway for a few weeks without moving it knows how much dust can accumulate. Some of that dust contains phosphorous (P), with the percentage increasing if there is a lot of pollen or dust blowing off freshly fertilized agricultural fields. Some P enters the lake dissolved in the water of tributary streams and rivers. Some comes in via groundwater, especially in areas with faulty septic systems or in agricultural areas. Some comes in as plant debris or



blowing leaves or grass clippings illegally dumped in the lake in a form that is referred to as "organic phosphorous." Organic phosphorous (OP) is phosphorous that is bound up into organic matter already and not bioavailable to algae unless the organic matter decomposes or is eaten and digested by another organism first. This can be done by the Canada geese in the Belgrade stream who spend the day eating grass and other plants containing OP and then deposit roughly a kilogram a day of highly enriched goose manure either directly into the lake or on the shore where it washes in when it rains. This process converts most of the OP to soluble reactive phosphorous (SRP). SRP is dissolved within the water column, primarily in the form of orthophosphate ions, which are "bioavailable" in the sense they can be readily picked up living organisms and turned

into organic matter. Most of the rest of the phosphorous in aquatic systems is typically in particulate form, bound to suspended solids, primarily iron and clay minerals.

Phosphorus-laden sediment generally comprises the significant majority of phosphorus loading to lakes, with the amount of phosphorous washing into the lake being highly dependent on the land use of the surrounding watershed. Phosphorous loading is very low from forests but very high from agricultural areas or highly developed watersheds with a lot of impervious surfaces such as buildings or roads. Studies of phosphorous loading to Maine lakes have generally concluded that a substantial (~30%) amount of the phosphorous washing into the lake is coming from roads and driveways, especially dirt roads in the near shore area. Many of the roads in the vicinity of our lakes are in poor condition. In many cases they were built more than 50 years ago and were basically paths cut through the trees to get a vehicle down to the seasonal camp on the lake a couple of times a summer. Often these roads were cut straight down the hill, sloping directly to the lake. Today, many of these same roads, with minimal upgrades, are now serving multiple camps and year-round houses with tens of trips per day of people coming and going to work, school, shopping, etc. These roads may have unstable culverts, inadequate or eroding ditches, poor road surface material, inadequate sub-base drainage, and lack adequate maintenance, all of which contribute to erosion and increased phosphorous washing into the lake.

The BRCA has conducted nonpoint source pollution (NPS) surveys of all the Belgrade Lakes and all the surveys identified roads as a major source of phosphorous loading. These reports are posted on our web site at www.belgradelakes.org/water.html if you want to check your home lake. To help remediate some of the pollution sites identified, we have obtained a number of DEP funded grants to provide some help for road owners to upgrade their roads. In partnership with Kennebec County Soil and Water Conservation District (KCSWCD) we are currently providing some cost share support to residents *Continued on page 19...*

couple of weeks ago I failed to get our col-Aumn done for that week's issue of the newspaper. That week was a hot one and I'd been taking advantage of Maine's fine environment by using afternoons for kayaking. That Friday, when I'd failed to submit the week's article, Mark called to check on my writing. I received the call while sitting in my kayak in the Sheepscot River just upstream from the Wiscasset Bridge on Rt. 1. With the sun, open water and ospreys overhead an excellent setting, I was also looking down the bay at the bumper to bumper traffic on the Wiscasset bridge.

It seemed to me that the afternoon's experience was a good example of a key issue we constantly try to address here in Maine. How do we balance our needs for development, job growth and income producing activities with our desire to enjoy and experience the great outdoors and unspoiled places where land and water meet?

My own experience was exactly what I'd been looking for - little boat traffic, lobster trap buoys spread around me, the occasional jumping fish or seagull. It was relatively undisturbed. The past hour had been spent paddling along the shoreline and beneath the old railroad bridge into the upper area of the bay where the

goals we share.

Some examples of those decisions include than the osprey or eagle that I disturbed, there had been little noise or activity. The juxtaposition items like building codes, shoreland zone setof my own experience, one of the best parts about living in Maine, and the distant view of vehicles creeping along infamous Rt. 1 in Wiscasset, made me appreciate my experience all the more. Traffic was so bad that my slow leisurely paddle outpaced the SUV on the bridge with the two kayaks strapped to their roof. I doubt they enjoyed the comparison nearly as much as I did. This seemed to encapsulate choices we are

constantly trying to make. We regularly have discussions on how to address the various development pressures that seem to target Maine, Kennebec County and local areas. Often those discussions are heated. Perhaps they should be. Maine has been affected by the growing number of people who have not only found the "good life" here in Maine, but have decided to make a little part of it their own. Many pieces of this new development offer some great benefits to all of us. Development can provide many more choices for all of us. But those added choices often come at a cost. It is up to those of us who live here to consider the options, determine our priorities and make decisions that lead to the long term

backs, road construction standards, and various other land use regulations. Many of these codes are intended to help protect the land and water environments and particularly those transitional areas between dry land and the streams, rivers, lakes and wetlands we have decided to protect. We hear; "all things need to change, and it's not so bad". This may be true now, but, if we agree that change is coming, the question becomes what parts of our community, our lands and our waters do we want to protect in a manner that allows us to continue our enjoyment of them. Many Maine communities are continuing to


engage in this public discussion. There is no "one right answer". Most important is that people work through decisions based on accurate information and understand the consequences of those decisions. We need to realize that those decisions will determine the future for themselves, their neighbors and the coming generations who wish to enjoy Maine, "the way life should be".



of the Great Pond and Long Pond Watersheds. If you live in one of these watersheds and are interested in improving your road to reduce phosphorous loading to the lake, please contact me at 495-6039. Even if your watershed is not eligible for grant money we can still provide advice and outreach materials on how to improve your road. We have copies of DEP's Camp Road Maintenance Manual available at BRCA or you can download the manual on line at: http://www.maine.gov/dep/blwq/docwatershed/camproad.pdf). This manual contains a lot of good information about how to maintain your road to improve water quality.







n Sunday, August 14th, the Riverside Farm Market in Oakland will be hosting a Gypsy Jazz Festival. The event features three New England based Gypsy Jazz bands along with a few guest artists. The music will begin at noon with local favorites Mes Amis, followed by Hot Club du Monde, and then the festival headliners Ameranouche. The location is a picturesque meadow overlooking the Messalonskee Stream on the property behind the Market.

Toby Tyler, co owner of Riverside Farm Market with his wife Pam, has been a fan of Gypsy Jazz music since high school and in fact is one of the members of the opening act. It is his love of this music that inspired him to organize this festival, and he is hoping it will become an annual event, providing an opportunity for Gypsy Jazz fans in the central Maine area to hear the music in a festive environment.

Gypsy Jazz is growing in popularity both in Europe and here in the U.S., but for readers who are not familiar with the music, the style is attributed to virtuoso Gypsy guitarist Django Reinhardt, who along with violinist Stephane Grapelli founded the all string jazz ensemble The Quintet du Hot Club de France in the 1930s in Paris. The blending of gypsy music with American jazz created a new sound. Django died in 1953, and until recently it has largely been fellow gypsies who have carried on his musical legacy.

Along with the use of acoustic instruments, one of the unique elements of Gypsy Jazz is the absence of the drummer. Utilizing a technique referred to as "la pompe," the rhythm guitarist plays in a percussive way, driving the beat and giving the music its characteristic bounce.

The first band to perform at this year's festival will be Mes Amis, featuring original compositions by lead guitarist Steve Lynnworth. Steve is a former member of Portland based R&B band Big Chief, and is the author of the guitar instruction book "Understanding the Chords." Toby Tyler provides the rhythm guitar, and veteran performer Greg Lindholm plays acoustic bass. Joining them will be the group's newest member, Sky Ludwig on accordion.

It's so much fun to see the lakes being enjoyed by everyone from jet skiers to water-skiers to sunbathers sitting on the ends of their docks. All this sunshine brings out the best in people too and we've had some wonderful conversations with folks as we fish by their cottages; the traditional "great weather eh?" and "how are they biting" along with stories of moose swimming across Great Pond's Austin Bog and aggressive beavers chewing down newly planted apple trees. This is what summer in the Belgrades is all about.

Last Monday I got up way too early. In my opinion there's no reason to get up at 4:30 a.m. unless you make donuts for a living or are a fishing guide. But getting up early does have its advantages and I enjoy the quiet time and the sunrises. While sitting on the porch sipping a coffee, the laptop was tuned into CNN.com. It's not the most energizing way to start the day, but I knew there were blue skies and crystal waters (along with a rock pile full of chunky smallmouth bass) waiting for us. It looked like one of Craig Poolers

rental boats over at Belgrade Boat Rentals. The kid was probably 14, lean and tan wearing a pair of shorts and a ball cap. My brain raced back in time, back to a day when I lived for a week's vacation on the lake. Back to that first time, when I was finally old enough to take the boat out fishing by myself. All of a sudden national economic crisis, property taxes and worries about tuition payments vanished and all that mattered was that kid and that rock pile about a mile up lake. That's what fishing does to people, that's what fishing is. It's not a quest to see who catches the biggest fish or the most fish, those things take care of themselves. It's a reason to get up way too early and an excuse to push away the quandary of the day and focus on what's right in front of your eyes . . . its good livin'.

However, to really enjoy fishing we need to catch some fish and the last week has been a period of ups and downs. When the fishing has been hot, it's been amazingly hot and when it turned off, you might as well go eat one of those donuts. The key has been getting the fish active and keeping the bite alive for as long as possible, especially as the sun gets higher in the sky. Live bait has certainly been helpful to catching mid day fish but you can keep the bite going with artificial baits too. Early in the morning and late in the day, top water lures have been excellent (the Rapala X-Rap Walk and the Zara Spook have been working great) with tubes and senkos catching smallies in 10 – 15 feet of water along with the occasional northern pike. As a bonus, lots of people have reported catching big white perch off their docks on earthworms. This is definitely an added summer bonus and Maine white perch is the key ingredient to the best chowder anywhere in world! Good luck this week!

Maine Fiberarts: Achieving Awareness Success

How does a diverse industry, comprised of art studios and farms, spinneries and processing mills, shops and suppliers, galleries and learning centers, develop a united awareness strategy?

The answer for Maine's fiber community has been threefold: consolidate under an umbrella organization, put itself on a map, and hold open house.

Step one: Maine Fiberarts, a statewide nonprofit arts organization, was founded in 2000 and installed in an historic building in Topsham where it integrates the fiber community through displays, information such as press releases, networking and brainstorming.

Step 2: The Maine Fiberarts Tour Map: Studios and Farms, a full-color, highly illustrated, 24x36" printed map listing 144 fiber sites throughout Maine, was published in 2006 in an edition of 60,000 copies. Maps were widely distributed through the Northeast and fostered new collaborations with Maine's state agencies for tourism, agriculture, arts and economic development. The map initiative was chosen as one of only two Special Events Grants in 2006, and was made possible with funding from the Maine Office of Tourism, National Endowment for

pant and member support. An online version was also posted to the group's website at www.mainefiberarts.org searchable by county, fiber medium, site name, town, etc.

A second edition was printed in 2009, listing 134 sites available year-round on a "best to call ahead" basis, through 2012. In a state conditioned to seasonality, the year-round factor was a successfully achieved uninterrupted industry visibility.

Step 3: The Fiber Arts Tour Weekend, first

organized in August 2006 attracted thousands of people who spent the three days visiting working farms and studios and taking part in demonstrations, workshops, studio tours, children's crafts, and farm living. Following the 2009 Tour Weekend, Maine Fiberarts surveyed participating sites: more that 3,000 visitors hailed from Maine, New Jersey, South Carolina, Arizona, Connecticut and 19 other states, Canada, Scotland, England and Japan. Tour maps were the primary way that people found out about the weekend, along with road signs, posters, Maine Fiberarts' website and other promotional venues. The weeked tour event was so successful that the nonprofit group decided to make the Fiber Arts Tour Weekend an annual event - always the first full weekend in August.

The 2011 Fiber Arts Tour Weekend, August 5-7, will include over 45 fiber destinations open to the public 10 am-5 pm. Information is posted at www.mainefiberarts.org including site descriptions, photos, directions, web links, and contact info for each site including a GeoSearch by zip.
